GENERAL ORDERS.

BY THE RIGHT HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA IN COUNCIL.

Fort William, 21st July 1843.

No. 154 of 1843.—The Right Honorable the Governor General of India in Council has much gratification in publishing, for general information, the following paragraphs of a Military Letter, No. 9, from the Honorable the Court of Directors, to the Governor General of India in Council, dated 30th May 1843.

Reply to paras : 1 to 6 of Secret Letter from the Governor General, dated 14th March, No. 18 of 1843, relative to the Victory gained at Meeanee, on the 20th February last, over the Army of the Ameers of Scinde. } Para. 1. We have perused with admiration the account given by Major General Sir C. Napier, of the Victory gained by the Troops under his Command at Meeanee, near Hyderabad, on the 20th February last, over the Army of the Ameers of Scinde.

2. This Victory won by a body of not more than 2,800 men, over a brave enemy stated to be not less than 22,000, deserves to be ranked amongst the brilliant achievements of the British Army.

3. There being, however, reason to believe, that another battle has been fought, and we trust, in that case, another Victory obtained, by the Troops under Sir Charles Napier in Scinde, we have to inform you, that it is not deemed expedient to decide at present on the specific marks of honor which no doubt will be bestowed in commemoration of the bravery displayed by our gallant Army.

4. We cannot close this despatch without expressing our marked approval of the steadiness and gallantry with which the attacks of the enemy on the Residency at Hyderabad were successfully resisted by the small body of men under the command of Captain Conway, H. M.'s 22nd Regiment, acting under the instructions of the Commissioner, Major Outram, whom on this memorable occasion, General Sir Charles Napier in his despatch of the 16th February, has justly characterized as "the fearless and distinguished Major Outram."
