PRIZE ESSAYS AGAINST THE PRACTICE . OF INFANTICIDE.

The Hon'ble the Governor in Council has been pleased to authorize the award of two prizes for Essays against the practice of Female Infanticide, vizt. a prize of Rupees (600) Six hundred for the best, and Rupees (400) Four hundred for the second Essay, subject to the following conditions.

1. The prizes to be open to general competition among the Native Students of any of the Public or Private Educational establishments of this presidency.

2. The Essays to be composed in the English language, and accompanied with a Guzerathee translation, to be fairly transcribed and not in the handwriting of the authors, and to be transmitted to the Office of the Secretary to Government before the 1st March 1844.

3. To each Essay a Motto must be affixed, and the Essay must be accompanied with a sealed note bearing on the outside the same Motto as that affixed to the Essay, and, within, the

author's name. 4. The Essays will be submitted by Go-vernment for the report of a Committee selected for the purpose. The sealed notes which accompany the successful Essays will alone be opened, and these Essays will become the property of Government; the others will be re-turned unopened with their respective Essays to the authors.

5. It is to be distinctly understood, that the prizes will not be awarded, unless the best and second Essays be considered worthy of such distinction by the Examining Committee; and in such case all the sealed packets and Essays will be returned. The Pay, Wages, and Allowances of Hospital Serjeants, and of Soldiers employed as Hospital Servants at Home and abtoad having been under consideration, and communication having been held with the General Command-ing in Chief on the subject, with a view to the establishment of an uniformity of practice and remuneration of a¹ stations. I have the honor to acquaint you, that Her Majesty has been pleased to direct, that Hospital Serjeants after completing 10 years approved Service in that capacity, shall receive an addition of six Pence to their daily pay of Serjeant.

shall be discontinued, and that each Serjeant and Soldier Servant, whether at Home or abroad, shall have Wages at four Pence a day at Home. Beer Money for them will also be admissible, and abroad, Liquor Money when the Ration does not include Wine or Spirits in kind. 

GENERAL ORDERS

BY THE RIGHT HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA IN COUNCIL,

Fort William, 22nd September 1843.

No. 205 of 1843.—The Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council has great pleasure in publishing to the Army the following paras. of a Military Letter, No. 13, from the Hon'ble the Court of Directors, to the Governor General of India in Council, dated 2nd August 1843.

"Para. 1. We have great satisfaction in acquainting you, that the Queen has been graciously pleased to command, that a Medal to commemorate the victories gained by the Troops under Major General Sir Charles Napier, shall be conferred on the Officers and Private Soldiers of Her Majesty's Army engaged in the battles of Meeanee and Hyderabad.

2. We have also to announce, that we have resolved, in commemoration of these brilliant actions, and in testimony of our high approbation of the services rendered by the Troops, European and Native, to cause an appropriate Medal to be struck in Silver, to be presented to all the Officers and Soldiers of the East India Company's Army, who were engaged upon these memorable occasions.

3. We have further the gratification to apprize you, that we have received the announcement, that the Queen will graciously permit the Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers of our Army, to whom we may grant the Medal, to wear the same in all parts of Her Majesty's dominions.

4. We shall take immediate measures for the preparation and dispatch of the requisite number of Medals."
