tors, No. 43, dated the 19th of July 1843; is published for general information.

Para 1. We have received your Letter No. 13, dated 25th February last, and the accompanying report of the proceedings of a Committee appointed to enquire into the misconduct of Mr. Noble Fisher Hunt, a Midshipman of the Indian Navy, whom you have suspended from the Service pending the receipt of our decision with respect to him.

2. There is enough in the papers transmitted to us to convince us, that Mr. Hunt is of a very refractory disposition, and that he has at times been guilty of acts of gross insubordination, which would, as declared by Commander Ethersey, have amply warranted his dismissal from the Service.

3. Mr. Hunt was accused of having, while on board the Steam Frigate Auckland, concealed himself, so that he could not be found when his services were required, but though he was at last found asleep in one of the Ship's Boats; there is not sufficient proof that he entered it for the purpose of concealment. It appears that he and his Messmates were in the habit of sleeping on Deck, though the practice was contrary to Order, and it is possible that he might, as he himself asserted, have selected the Boat merely as a more convenient place than any other. he might, as he himself asserted, have selected the Boat merely as a more convenient place than any other.

4. He was further charged with disobedience of orders in two instances.

1st. In not having been at his station when required, and secondly in not having gone there when ordered to do so by Lieutenant Ford. In the first instance, the fact is proved by Mr. Hunt's having been asleep at the time and not available for the duty required of him until that duty had been performed by others. With regard to the second, the disrespectful altercation with his Superior Officer in which Mr. Hunt allowed himself to indulge can scarcely be too strongly denounced; his plea of bodily indisposition to the extent of unfitting him for duty is not well supported

by the evidence adduced on the enquiry, and was no excuse for his disrespect.

5. Another charge against Mr. Hunt was that of contempt of authority, in having, while under arrest, persisted in making a noise when forbidden to do so. On a subsequent occasion Mr. Hunt was found intoxicated while still in arrest on board the Hastings. In respect to this charge we consider the Officer by whose negligent superintendence liquor was allowed to be conveyed to Prisoners under his charge to be nearly as culpable as Mr. Hunt.

6. Mr. Hunt's conduct has been want represented and we cannot but recreet that it was not more suppressible and we cannot but recreet that it was not more suppressible and we cannot but recreet that it was not more suppressible.

6. Mr. Hunt's conduct has been very reprehensible, and we cannot but regret that it was not more summarily dealt with before his misdemannours had been allowed to accumulate. Whilst however we think it right to evince our sense of his behaviour by a severe mark of our displeasure, both that he may be made to feel the consequence of his misconduct, and still more that, by example we may impress upon the Junior Officers of the Service our determination to punish acts such as Mr. Munt has been guilty of, we are willing to afford him an opportunity of redeeming his character, and accordingly instead of sentencing him to dismissal from our Service, we direct that Mr. Hunt be degraded eight Steps upon the List of Midshipmen of the Indian Navy.

7. We also direct, that in permitting him to return to his duty, Mr. Hunt be severely reprimanded and warned against a repetition of the behaviour which has led to his present punishment.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 2d September 1843.

ACT NO. —— OP 1843.

An Act to amend the Law respecting the period of the Execution of Persons convicted of the crime of Murder.

Whereas by an Act passed in the ninth year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled an Act for improving the Administration of Criminal Justice in the East Indies, it was amongst other things enacted that every person convicted of Murder should be executed according to Law on the day next but one after that on which the sentence should be passed unless the same should happen to be Sunday and in that case on the Monday following, and that sentence should be pronounced immediately after the conviction of every Murderer unless the Court should see reasonable cause for postponing the same, and such sentence should express not only the usual judgment of death but also the time thereby appointed for the execution thereof: and it was by the said Act provided that after such sentences should have been pronounced it should be lawful for the Court or Judge to stay the oxecution thereof if such Court or Judge should so think fit: and whereas for the ends of justice, and especially more effectually to preserve from an irrevocable punishment, any persons who may hereafter be convicted upon erroneous or perjured evidence it is expedient to alter and amend the said recited Act in these respects.

11. It is therefore hereby enacted, that from and after the

evidence it is expedient to alter and amend the said recited Act in these respects.

i) It is therefore hereby enacted, that from and after the passing of this Act so much of the said Act as is hereinbefore recited shall cease to have effect whithin the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company.

II. And it is hereby further enacted, that from and after the passing of this Act, sentence of death may be pronounced after convictions for Murder by any Judge of any of Her Majesty's Court of Justice within the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company in the same manner, and the Judge shall have the same power in all respects as after convictions for other capital offences.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 3! September 1843.

Act No. — Or 1843.

An Act for the better prevention of the Crime of Ducoity. Whereas it has been considered necessary to adopt more stringent measures for the conviction of professional Dacoits, who belong to certain Tribes, systematically employed in carrying on their lawless pursuits in different parts of the country, and for this purpose to extend the Provisions of Acts XXX. of 1836, XVIII. of 1837, and XVIII. of 1839, for the prevention of Thuggee, to persons concerned in the perpetration of Dacoity:

Though the persons concerned in the perpetration of Dacoity:

I. It is hereby enacted, that whosoever shall be proved to have belonged either before or after the passing of this Actto anygang of Dacoits, either within or without the Territories of the East India Company, shall be punished with transportation for life, or with imprisonment for any less term with hard labor.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that any person accused of the offence of Dacoity with or without murder, or of having belonged to a gang of Dacoits, or of the offence of unlawfully or knowingly receiving or buying property stolen or plundered by Dacoity, may be committed by any Magistrate within the Territories of the East India Company, and may be tried by any Court which would have been competent to try him if his offence had been committed within the Zillah where that Court sits.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that no Court shall, on trial of the offences specified in this Act, require any Futwa from any Law Officer

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 2d day of November next.

The following act passed by the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council on the 9th September 1843, hereby promulgated for general information.

Act No. XVIII. of 1843.

An Act for the better custody of persons, convicted of Thuggee and Dacoity.

Whereas it often happens that the offences of Thuggee and Dacoity are committed by gangs, as well within the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company, as in those of Native Princes or States in alliance with the said Company, and it may be necessary for the safety of persons and property within the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company, that persons convicted of the like offences within the Territories of such Princes or States, should be kept in secure enstody, which cannot always be done within the last mentioned Territories:

It is herby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the local Go-

in secure enstody, which cannot always be come within the last mentioned Territories:

It is herby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the local Government of any part of the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company to authorize the reception and detention in any part of these Territories, for the periods specified in their respective sentences, of persons sentenced to imprisonment or transportation for the offences of Thugsee, Dacoity, or the offences of belonging to any gang of Thugsee Dacoity, or the offences of the Frince or State in alliance with the said Company. Provided always, that such sentences shall have been pronounced after trial before a Tribunal, in which a Covenanted Servant of the East India Company, duly authorized in that behalf by such Prince or State, shall be one of the presiding Judges. And it is hereby enacted, that every Servant of the East India Company so authorized as aforesaid, shall forward with every Prisoner a certificate of his conviction, and a copy of the proceedings held at the trial that the same may be forthcoming for reference at the place where the sentence of imprisonment may be carried into effect.
