PRIMARY VISITATION OF THE DIOCESE OF BOMBAY BY THE METROPOLITAN OF INDIA.

In obedience to a Mandate under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Father in God Daniel by the Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Calcutta and Metropolitan of India, bearing date the twenty first day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two, signifying His Lordship's intention to hold his Primary Metropolitan Visitation of the See of Bombay, at the Cathedral in Bombay, on Tuesday the twenty eighth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three, all and singular the Ministers and Chaplains, and all Priests and Deacons in Holy Orders of the United Church of England and Ireland, being within the Diocese of Bombay, are hereby cited, if within Fifty Miles from Bombay aforesaid, to appear before the said Lord Bishop of Calcutta, the Metropolitan, at his Primary Metropolitan Visitation, to be held at the Cathedral Church of St. Thomas at Bombay, on Tuesday the twenty eighth day of February next, at the hour of ten o'clock in the morning, and then and there to produce their Letters of Orders of Priests and Deacons, with all Licences and other Faculties relative to their Official Appointment to be by them exhibited, and to hear and receive all such matters

Public Order.

To regulate the religious procession of the Mohurram, and for the preservation of the public peace during that festival, sanctioned by the Honorable the the Governor in Council, as provided for by Rule, Ordinance, and Regulation II, A. D. 1827.

1st. Every person desirous of erecting or carrying about a *Taboot*, *Punjia*, or *Dholeeka Punjia*, at the ensuing Mohurram, must obtain a license from the Magistrates of Police; and a license will be granted to no persons except Mussulmauns.

2nd. The licenses shall bear the signatures of the Magistrates of Police, and all persons obtaining them shall be bound to produce them when demanded by any authority having a right so to do, and a refusal to do so shall be held to be a breach of these rules.

3rd. Each Taboot is to have but one set of "Tassa," one set of "Dholee," one "Kurnah" and fifteen "Hillals."

4th. Any person who may be seen carrying a Sword, Dirk, Bludgeon, or other offensive weapon, will be taken into custody.

5th. Taboots meeting on the public road, are to give way to one another in the same manner that carriages do, each Taboot keeping to the left.

6th. Taboots are not permitted to go abreast on the public road, but they are to follow each other in a peaceable manner.

7th. No Taboots are allowed to go in procession on the last night of the Mohurram before 12 o'clock, or to continue so after 3 o'clock in the following morning. These processions are limited (on the last night and day of the Mohurram) to the Bhendy Bazarroad, Duncanroad, Chinch Bunder and Market Streets; and Taboots are not to be taken out on the last day before 12 o'clock, and on meeting carriages, and horsemen, are strictly enjoined to cease playing country music, until they shall have passed the Taboots, keeping the left side of the road; and it is directed, that they be thrown into the sea, and the ceremony concluded, by 5 o'clock P. M.

8th. No procession of the Zool Junnah or Horse, through the public streets or roads, will be permitted.

9th. The inhabitants of Bombay are enjoined not to assault or insult the Moguls during the celebration of the Mohurram.

10th. All persons licensed to sell Spirituous Liquors, and all venders of Opium and Bhang, are enjoined to keep their shops closed; and persons found selling any thing of an intoxicating nature, during the aforesaid period, will be taken into custody and punished.

11th. Any persons violating any of the above rules, or behaving in any manner likely to create a breach of the peace, or making a disturbance of any kind, will be immediately taken into custody and dealt with according to law.

No. 12 of 1843.—Mr. Augustus Frederick Bennett, a Volunteer for the Indian Navy, arrived from England by the Honorable Company's Steam Vessel Victoria, on the 15th instant.

No. 13 of 1843.—Mr. H. A. Broughton, returned to his duty on the 14th instant, from the sick leave granted to him in General Order of the 12th November last, No. 111.

No. 14 of 1843.—The following despatch from the Hon'ble the Court of Directors, dated the 16th of November 1842, No. 60, is published for general information.

Para. 1. We have carefully examined the Papers which accompanied your letter, of the 22nd March last No. 31, relative to the conduct of Lieutenant W. E. Campbell, of the Indian Navy.

2. This Officer being at the time First Lieutenant of the Steamer Sesostris, then employed in the China seas, was on the 14th September 1841, placed under arrest by Commander Ormsby, on charges, to the following effect. Lying down in his watch upon Deck between the hours of four and five A. M. when the Vessel was rolling in the trough of the Sea, and required his attention to his duty, and disobedience of orders in not turning the hands out and getting the Rigging slitted in and the damages repaired, in consequence of which disobedience, the Vessel was left with her Rigging so Hack that the Masts were in immediate danger of going over the side, the Boom and Main-sail dragging in the water, the Sails being split; and the Vessel otherwise in a disabled state.

3. There being no means on the spot of assembling a Court Martial duly qualified according to the Regulations of the Indian Navy, for the trial of Lieutenant Campbell, His Excellency the Naval Commander in Chief, under whose orders the Sesostris had been placed, constituted Commanders Watson and Morshead of the Royal Navy a Committee of Enquiry, to investigate the charges against him. The conclusion to which these Officers came was, that the first charge was proved and the second partly proved, and they further expressed the opinion, that both charges could be fully substantiated before a Court Martial.

4. This decision is completely borne out by the evidence taken before the Committee. It appears that on the 14th September Lieutenant Rennie, was Officer of the Middle Watch, when owing to the heavy rolling of the Vessel, the Rigging of the Lower Masts required securing; at four o'clock A. M. Lieutenant Rennie was relieved by Lieutenant Campbell to whom he pointed out that the work on the Rigging was not finished, but the latter did nothing in consequence of this intimation, and at half past four the Boom broke adrift, Commander Ormsby, who was at the time below, unwell, being roused by the noise, came on Deck and ordered Lieutenant Campbell, to turn the hands up, to get the Boom in, and to finish securing the Masts. The men were accordingly ordered up, but the order was recalled before the duty was performed, Lieutenant Campbell having apparently intended to put off the execution of the work till daylight, and allowing the Main-mast in the mean time, to roll to and fro violently, that when the men were at last called up, they could scarcely stand in the Rigging; about 5 o'clock A. M. Commander Ormsby, coming on Deck a second time found things in this state and Lieutenant Campbell, reclining on the Gun Slide, when he immediately ordered the men up to secure the Masts and Rigging and placed Lieutenant Campbell under arrest.

5. Lieutenant Campbell's attempt at justification has not in our opinion improved his case, and we concur with the Committee of Enquiry and with the Naval Commander in Chief, that Commander Ormsby has made good his charges against Lieutenant Campbell, whom you very properly suspended from employment until our pleasure should be made known, and it now remains for us to name the penalty which must mark our sense of his unofficerlike conduct and culpable neglect of duty. We feel, we should be justified in dismissing him from our Service, but we are willing that he should be afforded an opportunity of amendment, and shall on this occasion adopt a more lenient course. We have therefore resolved, and accordingly direct, that the name of Lieutenant W. E. Campbell be placed at the bottom of the list of Lieutenants of 1840, and that he take rank henceforth in the Indian Navy immediately below Mr. Berthon.

LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

THE 25TH NOVEMBER 1842.

The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council, on the 25th of November 1842, with the assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India, which has been read and recorded.

Ordered, that this Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. XIV OF 1842.

An Act for giving greater facility in the abatement and prosecution of Nuisances in and through the Towns and Islands of Bombay and Colaba.

I. It is hereby enacted, that no person shall throw, or deposit, or cause to be thrown or deposited any offensive matter or thing whatever on any open space of ground contiguous to any public thoroughfare on the Islands of Bombay or Colaba.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that the owner or occupier of every such open space shall on a written order from the Court of Petty Sessions for such purpose forthwith enclose the same with a fence or wall, and in default thereof for the space of ten days, the said Court shall cause such enclosure to be made, and the expence thereof shall be defrayed by the Municipal Fund, and the said owner or occupier shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twice the amount so expended.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Court of Petty Sessions to order and direct, that proper and suitable drains or gutters for the conveyance of wastage, water, filth and other offensive matter proceeding from the houses or premises of any of the inhabitants or occupiers thereof, shall be made and built by the owners of such houses in such manner as the said Court of Petty Sessions shall direct, and upon such owners failing so to do, and also to keep the same in repair, for the space of ten days after notice to that effect shall have been given by the said Court, the said Court may cause such drains or gutters to be built or repaired, and the expence thereof shall be defrayed out of the Municipal Fund, and the said owners shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twice the amount of such expence; provided always, that a default in the making or repairing such drains or gutters has created or is likely to create a public nuisance.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that the owner or occupier of any house or tenement having a privy erected upon his premises shall have such privy shut out by a sufficient wall or fence from the view of persons passing by.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that every privy, sink, drain, water courses, compound, yard, lane or passage adjoining or belonging to any house or premises shall be kept clean by the owners or occupiers thereof, so that the same shall not become a public nuisance.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that no person shall throw or deposit any filth or rubbish on the roof or weather-boards of any buildings, or suspend therefrom any article whatever so as to project over any street or public thoroughfare. Nor shall any person bathe himself or wash any animal or clothes, or throw any offensive matter, or thing whatever in or into any of the public tanks or wells, and the Governor in Council is hereby empowered from time to time by Proclamation to declare, what tanks or wells shall be deemed Public, and also which of such Public tanks or wells may be used for the purpose of bathing and washing linen therein.

VII. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Court of Petty Sessions to require any person, owner or tenant, keeping a public brothel or lodging houses for Prostitutes, or disorderly character of any description in any of the more public roads or streets of Bombay and Colaba, to shut up the same or to remove such tenants from the premises, and on his failing to do so within the time specified in a notice to be given to him to that effect, he shall be deemed to have offended against the provision of this Act.

VIII. And it is hereby enacted, that no person shall keep a Coffee Shop, Eating House, or any place of public resort, other than a legally licensed Tavern or Spirit Shop, without the permission or license of the Court of Petty Sessions, which Court is hereby empowered to grant such permission or license in writing, and which may be revoked by the said Court on good and sufficient cause.

IX. And it is hereby enacted, that all offences against this Act shall be summarily enquired into and decided by the Court of Petty Sessions, and every offence for which there is not a special penalty shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred Rupees.

X. And it is hereby enacted, that all fines imposed under this Act shall be paid into the General Treasury for the benefit of the Municipal Fund.

NOTIFICATION.

BY THE RIGHT HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA.

Camp Ferozepore, the 31st December 1842.

This day the troops which have returned from Cabool, and the Army of reserve, were reviewed by His Excellency the Commander in Chief.

The whole force afterwards passed in column before the Governor General.

The Governor General was accompanied by Koonwur Pertaub Singh, son of His Highness the Maharajah of Lahore, by Rajah Dhian Sing, the Minister of Lahore, and the other chiefs of the Punjab, now on a mission from the Maharajah, as well as by the Rajah of Jheend, and other chiefs of the protected Sikh states.

The forces reviewed, consisted of nine battalions of European, and nineteen battalions of native infantry, (including Broadfoot's sappers); of two regiments of European and nine of native cavalry, besides detachments, and of seventeen batteries of artillery, comprising 102 guns.

Four battalions of infantry remained in camp.

The regiment of Kelat-i-Ghilzie carried for the first time, the colours presented to it by the Governor General, already inscribed with the words,

“ Kelat-i-Ghilzie,”	“ Ghuznee,” and
“ Candahar,”	“ Cabool,”

in commemoration of the services, which have justly obtained for it the honor of being permanently attached to the Bengal army.

The troops were all in the finest order, and the horses in good condition for any service.

After the review, the Europeans received double rations, and thirty thousand seers of their favorite *meh toy* were distributed to the native regiments.

Major General Sir Charles Napier, lately reviewed the troops under his command, at Sukkur.

The Major General has concentrated at that place, and in its immediate vicinity, twelve regiments of infantry, two regiments of Cavalry, and an ample force of artillery.

One European and two native regiments occupied Kurrachee.

Two steam vessels, transferred from the Euphrates, have been already directed to the Indus, where the flotilla will now comprise six steam vessels.

Tranquillity is restored in Bundelkund.

A force of 14,000 men, well composed and amply provided with artillery, to which the Maharaja Scindiah has added from his own army three regiments of infantry and one of cavalry, with guns, which His Highness has placed under the command of a British Officer, will effectually preserve the tranquillity so established in Bundelkund, and extend it to Saugor and the Nerbudda.

In both districts the principal chiefs zealously co-operate with the British Officers in the pursuit of plunderers, and for the apprehension of all who have disturbed the peace of the country.

Two regiments of European and four of native infantry, which formed part of the force lately employed in the operations against China, have been rendered immediately disposable by the conclusion of a peace, upon our own terms, of which the Chinese Government evinces every disposition fairly to execute the conditions; and the native regiments are already on their return to India.
