Notice is hereby given, that on and after the
 1st day of January 1844, a Light will be exhib-
 ited on the New Light House erected at Ma-
 dras immediately to the Northward of the Walls
 of Fort St. George; and that on and after the
 said 1st day of January 1844, the Light hereto-
 fore and now exhibited on the Old Light House
 within the Walls of Fort St. George, will be
 discontinued. The New Light (to be exhibit-
 ed) will be elevated 128 feet above the mean
 level of the Sea,—and may be seen from the
 Deck of a Ship at the distance of 20 miles.
 The Light is of the "Flashing Description"
 and the duration of the Flashes to that of the
 Eclipses or Dark periods is in the ratio of 2 to 3,
 —but as the nature of the Motion is Reciproca-
 ting instead of Rotatory, the above ratio merely
 expresses the average proportion of the Light
 and Dark intervals which are themselves varia-
 ble according to the position of the Spectator.
 The rapidity of movement is so adjusted, that
 the duration of the Flashes will vary from 0" to
 48". and that of the Eclipses from 0" to 72", the
 sums of the duration of Light and Darkness
 bearing however, in every position, the con-
 stant ratio of 2 to 3. From the South Eastern
 extremity of the Pulicate Shoal the New Light
 House bears S. 23° W., and is distant 13 miles;
 but no Ship or Vessel when hauling in from the
 Northward for the Madras Roadstead should
 bring the Light to bear to the Southward of S.
 25° W. or S. S. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.,—unless her posi-
 tion is well ascertained. Commanders of Ves-
 sels are hereby warned of the serious risk they
 incur by incautiously approaching the dangerous
 vicinity of the Pulicate Shoal, as hazy weather
 or other causes may obscure the Light,—true
 Soundings therefore and a vigilant look out are
 imperatively called for. The limits of the Ma-
 dras Roadstead (in 8 or 9 fathoms) are com-
 prised within the following bearings, viz. from
 the Northward the Light House will bear S.
 56° W., and from the Southward N, 81° W. or
 from S. W. b. W. to W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time, on the 26th October, 1843.

ACT No. — OF 1843.

Whereas it has been represented that the demands of the Island of Mauritius for Agricultural labour will by the end of this year be greatly diminished, and it is desirable that effectual measures should be adopted for providing a larger proportion of Female Emigrants to that Island than has been procured under the present system of Emigration, it is therefore enacted, that from and after the 1st day of March next ensuing, Emigration to Mauritius shall only lawfully take place under the provisions of the Act No. 15 of 1842, from the Port of Calcutta, and that no Emigrant shall be permitted to embark for Mauritius without a certificate from an Agent specially appointed by the Government of Mauritius to the effect that such person has been engaged by him as an Emigrant to that Island on the part of the said Government.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

The following Act is brought up before the Legislative Council this day.—The Governor General of India in Council being desirous that no time should be lost in passing the Act—Resolved that the Rule requiring that no Draft of a Law shall be ordered to be published till at least one week shall have elapsed from the day on which it was first laid before the Council of India in its Legislative Department, and that the Rules requiring that all Acts of the Governor General of India in Council shall be brought up for second reading in two months, or in three months, from the date of the first reading,—be suspended in respect to the following proposed Act, and that it be at once passed into Law.

ACT No. XX. of 1843.

An Act for providing for the exercise of certain powers by the Governor General during his absence from the Council of India.

I. Whereas it is expedient that the Governor General should visit the North Western Provinces and other parts of India unaccompanied by any Member of the Council of India, it is enacted that during the absence of the Governor General from the Council of India, it shall be lawful for the Governor General alone to exercise all the powers which may be exercised by the Governor General in Council, except always the power of making Laws and Regulations.

II. And it is further enacted, that this Act shall commence from the day on which it shall be notified by an Order published in the Official Gazette, that the Governor General has quitted Calcutta for the purpose of so proceeding as aforesaid.
