The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time, on the 16th March 1844.

ACT No. — of 1844.

An Act for amending the Schedules of Import Duties annexed to Act XIV. of 1833 and to Act I. of 1838.

Whereas by Article 17 of Schedule A. annexed to No. XIV. of 1836, and by Art. 18 of Schedule A. annexed to Act No. I. of 1838, certain rates of Duty are to be charged on the importation into the Ports of Bengal and Orissa, and the Ports subject to the Presidency of Bombay, of Cotton and Silk Piece Goods, the produce of any place other than the United Kingdom, or any British Possession. And whereas it is expedient, that the same rates of Duties should be charged on other Foreign Goods of a like description—

It is hereby enacted, that from and after the 1st May 1844, the rates of Duty prescribed for the said Articles by the said Schedules, shall be charged on the importation into the Ports of Bengal and Orissa, and the Ports subject to the Presidency of Bombay; of all manufactures of Silk or Cotton, and of Silk and Cotton mixed with any other material, which are the produce of any place, other than the United Kingdom or any British Possession; and of all made up Articles of the said manufactures, or of which any part of the materials is of the said manufactures.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 16th day of June next.

It is hereby enacted, that from and after the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful for any one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Judicature at Fort William in Bengal, when occasion shall so require, to sit apart from the other Judges or Judge, as the case may be, of the same Court for the despatch of the Criminal Business of the said Court, at the same time when the other Judges or Judge, as the case may be, of the said Court shall be sitting for the despatch of Business in the said Supreme Court, and that all proceedings whatever, so had by and before such Judge, so sitting apart for the purpose aforesaid, shall be good, valid and effectual in the Law to all intents and purposes, as fully as if the

said proceedings were had before all the Judges of the said Court, sitting as a Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery under the Charter of the said Court.

11. And it is hereby further enacted, that all Business of what nature or kind soever, which the said Supreme Court of Judicature at Fort William in Bengal may or shall have power to transact in Term, it shall in like manner have power to transact out of Term, and that all proceedings whatever before the said Court out of Term, shall be as good, valid and effectual in the Law to all intents and purposes as fully as if the said proceedings were had in Term, and that all Rules and Orders of the said Court as to all Judgments, Executions or other Proceedings in Term, shall be applicable and shall be applied to all Judgments, Executions or other Proceedings given, issued or had out of Term, as near as the same can be made applicable thereto, and the said Court shall issue such new Rules and Orders as may be necessary for the purpose of giving full effect to the provisions in this Act contained.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 16th day of May next.
