The period of one month required by Section XXI. of the Absentee Regulations for a Subordinate to act for his Principal, or for any other person holding a superior appointment in the same Office or Establishment without being entitled to any Deputation Allowance, shall be held to apply to those cases only where the Superior Officer is absent with leave under Section XI. the President in Council of India having been pleased to allow that the one month without deputation specified in Section XXI. shall be held to be designed as an offset against a corresponding leave of one month granted under Section X1. to a Superior Officer, free from deduction of allowances, in which case his subordinate in the same Office if placed in charge for him must hold that charge without remunera-tion.
