The amount of Batta for deceased European officers and men, is to be drawn in a seperate abstract by officers commanding Regiments or Detachments, accompanied by a nominal Roll, shewing whether the Heirs or Assigns of the men are present as only in the event of their presence, the amount will be issued by Pay Masters, for the purpose of being paid over under the orders and responsibility of the Commanding Officers. In cases where the Heirs and Assigns are not present, the amount will be transferred by Pay Masters to the General Treasury for deposit, until legally claimed.

European soldiers and native officers and men absent from their corps, will be drawn for on rejoining.

Paymasters of Her Majesty's Troops are to draw the amount of Donation Batta due on account of officers and men deceased in this country without Heirs, and also on account of officers who have gone home, and remit the amount to the Regimental agent in the same manner, as the effects of deceased officers and men are usually remmitted.
