The Subjoined extract of a letter from the Acting Post Master in Khandeish, dated 12th instant, is published for the information of the public

"With regret, I have the Honor to report for your information, the Overland Mail for the North Western provinces, dispatched from Bombay, on the 10th at 1 A. M. reached this Station at 11 A. M. this day, in a sad damaged state, the rope of the flying bridge at the Kadiva river (between Chandore and Nassick,) broke in crossing, and the boat in which the Mails were, swamped, and with the greatest difficulty the wallets were saved.

2. Instantly on arrival I opened each packet, dried, and having repacked, dispatched them, a work of considerable labor, and only this moment completed, nine Wallets were received, and as the letters and newspapers were dried, they were forwarded commencing about 1 P. M. and terminating as stated; many letters were much damaged, and considerable discontent will doubtless be expressed at such an untoward event pressing so heavy on the community."

BY THE HON'BLE THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

BOMBAY CASTLE, 11TH JULY 1844.

No. 434 of 1844.—Under the orders of His Excellency the Commander in Chief, and in accordance with the G. G. O. 27th September 1841, Para. 345 Section XLII of Jameson's Code, the triennial inspection of Pensioners will take place at the different stations under this Presidency as soon after the 1st September next, as committees for the purpose can conveniently be assembled. The attention of these committees is particularly directed to the rules laid down for their guidance, and to the necessity of filling up the Inspection return with the utmost

2. It will also be their duty to enquire into and report upon the following points, and generally to elicit such information as it may be in their power to collect in furtherance of the object for which they are assembled.

1st Whether the musters have been regularly taken, and the date of each entered upon the Pensioners descrip-

tive roll.

Whether pay appears to have been issued to any of the Pensioners without the muster having been taken. 2nd. 3rd. Whether the Pensioners have been regularly paid the full amount of their Pensions, and whether these

payments are attested by the signature of the disbursing officers.

4th. Whether all the Pensioners drawing pay at the different Stations were originally pensioned at those Stations, or whether their transfers to them have been sanctioned by competent authority, and entered in their Rolls.

5th. A particular inspection of the Women and Children on the Pension list should be made as from the returns, the rate of mortality amongst these classes of Pensioners appears not to be proportionate to those of other classes, and as in many instances the identity of the Pensioners especially in the case of the children, is after the lapse of a few years so difficult to establish as to present facilities for the perpetration of frauds, the Committees will be careful to make such alterations and additions to the column headed "indelible marks" &c. as to render the description of the holder of the Roll as complete as possible.

3. The Staff Officers of the different stations where Committees are directed to assemble, will give the earliest information to all civil authorities in charge of Pensioners in their neighbourhood of the probable time and place of assembly, in order that they may direct the due attendance of the Pensioners under their charge and may

prepare the necessary documents in time for the Committees.

4. The pensioners at the Presidency will be inspected by the Superintendent of Pensions, and those at

Tannah, Bhewndy, Panwell &c. by a Committee to be appointed for that purpose.

FORT WILLIAM, HOME DEPARTMENT. LEGISLATIVE.

THE 15TH JUNE, 1844.

The following Act is brought up before the Legislative Council this day. The Governor General of India in Council being desirous that no time should be lost in passing the Act-Resolved, that the Rule requiring that no Draft of a Law should be ordered to be published till at least one week shall have elapsed from the day on which it was first laid before the Council of India in its Legislative Department, and that the Rules requiring that all Acts of the Governor General of India in Council shall be brought up for second reading in two months, in three months, from the date of the first reading, be suspended in respect to the following proposed Act, and that it be at once passed into Law:

ACT NO. XIII. OF 1844.

An Act for making Trisoolee Pyce no longer a legal tender within the Province of Benares, and for their withdrawal from circulation.

It is hereby enacted, that from and after the First day of August 1844, the Trisoolee Pyce struck for the Province of Benares, under the Provisions of Regulations X. of 1809 and VII. of 1814, and at the Saugor Mint, shall cease to be a legal tender within the Province of Benares.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that until the said First day of August 1844, such Triscolee Pyce shall be received on account of the Government and shall be exchanged by tale (that is to say every Trisoolee Pyce paid in shall be received as one Company's Pyce paid in shall be received as one Company's Pyce, and one Company's Pyce shall be given for every Triscolee Pyce presented for exchange) at such Treasuries or other places within the Province of Benares as shall be pointed out for that purpose in any Proclamation of the Lieutenant Governor of the North Western Provinces.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that immediately after the passing of this Act, the said Lieutenant Governor shall issue a Proclamation pointing out the Treasuries or other places within the Province

the Treasuries or other places within the Province of Benares at which such Trisoolee Pyce shall be so received and exchanged as aforesaid, and notifying any Regulations respecting such receipt or exchange as the said Lieutenant Governor may deem it exas the said betterant Governor may deem it ex-pedient to establish for the carrying into effect of the same, for the prevention of fraud therein, and especially for the rejection of such Triscolee Pyce as may appear to the Officer appointed to receive or exchange the same under this Act, to be undoubtedly spurious.

And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Lieutenant Governor if he shall see fit, to order that in any case one Company's Rupee shall be given for every 64 Trisoolee Pyce so presented for exchange, and that in every such case one Company's Rupee shall be given for every case one Company Stationary of Trisoolee Pyce accordingly.
