Public Order.

To regulate the religious procession of the Mohurrum, and for the preservation of the public peace during that festival, sanctioned by the Honorable the Governor in Council, as provided for by Rule, Ordinance, and Regulation II, A. D. 1827.

1st. Every person desirous of erecting or carrying about a Taboot, Panjia, or Dholeeka Punjia, at the ensuing Mohurrum, must obtain a license from the Magistrates of Police; and a license will be granted to no persons

except Mussulmauns.

2nd. The licenses shall bear the signatures of the Magistrates of Police, and all persons obtaining them shall be bound to produce them when demanded by any authority having a right so to do, and a refusal to do so shall be held to be a breach of these rules.

3rd. Each Taboot is to have but one set of "Tassa" one set of "Dholee," one Kurnah and fifteen "Hillals."

4th. Any person who may be seen carrying a Sword, Dirk, Bludgeon, or other offensive

weapon, will be taken into custody,
5th. Taboots meeting on the public road,
are to give way to one another in the same manner that carriages do, each Taboot keeping to the left.

6th Taboots are not permitted to go abreast on the public road, but they are to follow each

other in a peaceable manner.

7th No Taboots are allowed to go in procession on the last night of the Mohurrum before 12 o'clock, or to continue so after 3 o'clock in the following morning. These processions are limited (on the last night and day of the Mohurrum) to the Bhendy Bazar road, Duncan road, Chinch Bunder and Market Streets; and Taboots are not to be taken out on the last day before 12 o'clock, and on meeting carriages, and horsemen, are strictly enjoined to cease playing country music, until they shall have passed the Taboots, keeping the left side of the road; and it is directed that they be thrown into the sea, and the ceremony concluded, by 5 o'clock P.M.

8th. No procession of the Zool Junnah or Horse, through the public streets or roads, will

be permitted.

9th. The inhabitants of Bombay are enjoined not to assault or insult the Moguls during

the celebration of the mohurrum.

10th. All persons licensed to sell Spiritu-ous Liquors, and all venders of Opium and Bhang, are enjoined to keep their shops closed; and persons found selling any thing of an in-toxicating nature, during the aforesaid period, will be taken into custody and punished.

11th. Any persons violating any of the above rules, or behaving in any manner likely to create a breach of the peace, or making a disturbance of any kind, will be immediately taken into custo-

dy and dealt with according to law.

THE 6TH JANUARY, 1844.
The following Draft of a proposed Act was was read in Council for the first time on the 6th January 1844.

Act No.——or 1844.

An Act for authorizing the institution of Suits in the Courts of Principal Sudder Ameens and Sudder

I. It is hereby enacted, that within the Territories subject to the Presdencies of Fort William in Bengal, Fort St. George and Bombay, all Suits within the competency of a Principal Sudder Ameen or Sudder Ameen to decide, shall ordinarily be institut-

ed in the Courts of those Officers respectively.

II. Provided nevertheless, and it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to a Zillah or City Judge to withdraw such Suits from the Court in which they may have been instituted, and to try them him-self, or to refer them for trial to any other Court subordinate to his authority, and competent in respect to the value of the Suit whenever he may see sufficient reason for so doing.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that whenever there shall be more than one Principal Sudder Ameen, or more than one Sudder Ameen attached to the Court of any Zillah or City Judge, and not having any special local jurisdiction, it shall be the duty of such Judge to appoint from time to time the several Moonsiffs' division which shall constitute the special local sins division which shall constitute the special local jurisdiction of each of such Principal Sudder Ameens and Sudder Ameens, and that each of such Principal Sudder Ameens and Sudder Ameens shall be em-powered to take cognizance of all such Suits as are powered to take cognizance of all such Suits as are mentioned in Section I. of this Act, provided the landed or other real property to which the Suit may relate shall be situated, or in all other cases the cause of action shall have arisen, or the defendant at the time when the Suit may be commenced shall reside as a fixed inhabitant within the limits of such local invisidiation as aforesaid.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Zillah or City Judge to receive a Sumpetent to the Zillah or City A the Supposer A papel given by the Supposer of the Supposer by the Supposer A papel from the orders of any Principal Sudder Ameen or Sudder Ameen, rejecting any Original Suit cognizable by him, and that all Rules applicable to Summary Appeals from orders dismissing Original Suits on the ground of any default shall be applicable to the Supposer. V. And it is hereby enacted, that in all Suits which in respect to value are cognizable by a Sudder Ameen, the same Stamps shall be sufficient in any other Court as would have been sufficient in the Court

of a Sudder Ameen.
Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 6th day of April 1844.
