No. 545 of 1844.—The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to publish the following extract from a despatch from the Honorable the Court of Directors to the Government of Fort Saint George, dated 6th December 1843, No. 65, and to direct that in future the several payments to European Troops therein specified. be made under this Presidency at the exchange of 2s. 1d. the Rupee.

Letter to Court, 4th April 1843, No. 18, para. 65, A. G. O. published, establishing rates of compensation for loss of necessaries to European Troops, and fixing the rate of exchange for the Europe rates of Pay that may be due to Her Majesty's Troops for the period they may be on board ship on arrival from England.

Para. 51 "The compensation to European Soldiers for loss of necessaries should be passed at the exchange of 2s 1d. the Rupee, as well as all other Grants or Gratuities to which they may be entitled by warrants from the Crown, when expressed in sterling money, or not otherwise provided for. And as this rate app oximates very nearly to that which is annually fixed for repayment of advances made in India for the service of the Crown, we desire that it may also be adopted in settling any arrears of Pay that may accrue to Troops on their passage to India."

B. of the 21st Regiment Native Infantry is placed temporarily at the disposal of His Excellency the Commander in Chief and directed to join his Regiment forthwith. #### FORT WILLIAM, HOME DEPARTMENT, LEGISLATIVE,

The 7th September, 1844.

The following Act, passed by the Governor General of India in Council, on the 7th September 1844, is hereby promulgated for general information.

Act. No. XVIII. or 1844.

An Act for the better control and management of

Jails within the Bengal Presidency.

Jaits within the Bengal Presidency.

I. It is hereby enacted, that so much of the provisions of any Regulation of the Bengal Code, or of any Act of the Government of India, as vests the Judges of Circuit, the Commissioners of Circuit, the Superintendents of Police and the Sudder Nizamut Adawlut, with control and superintendence over the several Jails of the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, the Prisoners confined in them, the Establishments thereunto belonging, and the places of banishment or transportation of Prisoners, is repealed.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that the whole of the said control and superintendence shall be vested in the Magistrates and Joint Magistrates, acting under the instructions of the Zillah and City Judges, and that the Magistrates, Joint Magistrates and Zillah and City Judges, shall be guided in regard to all matters relating to the Jails under their charge, the Prisoners confined in them, the Establishments thereunto belonging, and the places of banishment or transportation of Prisoners, by such orders as they may receive from their respective Local Governments.

#### FORT WILLIAM, HOME DEPARTMENT. LEGISLATIVE.

THE 14TH SEPTEMBER 1844.

The following Act is brought up before the Legislative Council this day—The Governor General of India in Council being desirous that no time should

be lost in passing the Act-

Resolved, That the Rule requiring that no Braft of a Law should be ordered to be published till at least one week shall have elapsed from the day on which it was first laid before the Council of India in its Legislative Department, and that the Rules requiring that all Acts of the Governor General of India in Council shall be brought up for second reading in two months, or in three months from the date of the first reading, be suspended in respect to the following proposed Act, and that it be at once passed into Law.

Act No. XIX. or 1844.

An Act for abolishing Town Duties and Mookauts, and all Tuxes upon Trades and Professions within the Presidency of Bombay.

It is hereby enacted, that from the 1st day of October 1844, all Town Duties, Kusub Veeras, Mohtnrfas, Ballootee Taxes, and Cesses of every kind on Trades or Professions under whatsoever name, levied within the Presidency of Bombay, and not forming a part of the Land Revenue, shall be abolished.
