Forwards proceedings connected with the completion of the new Steam Factory &c. in the Dock yard.

Notices the satisfactory manner in which Captain Turner, who had been appointed to superintend the works at the Factory has fulfilled the duties entrusted to him, and submits to the Court's favorable consideration, the fact of Captain Turner not having received any remuneration for his great labour and responsibility.

1. The Report of the Committee whom you appointed to inspect the newly erected Steam Factory, Foundry, and Workshops, on the 16th December last when the machinery and apparatus were set in motion, for the first time, and the whole afterwards duly transferred to the charge of the Chief Engineer and Inspector of Machinery, has afforded us much satisfaction, and at the same time reflects the highest credit upon Captain H. B. Turner, the Mint Engineer, who superintended the erection of the Building, and the setting up of its extensive machinery.

2. Cordially concurring with you in expressing the warmest approbation of the manner in which Captain Turner has fulfilled this arduous duty, and taking into consideration the great labour and responsibility which thereby devolved upon him in addition to the important duties of his office of Mint Engineer, we have resolved as a mark of our approval of his conduct and in reward of this special service, to present Captain Turner with the sum of five thousand Rupees (Rs. 5,000,) and we direct that the same be forthwith paid to that officer.

No. 117 of 1844.—The following Extract Para. 2nd of a despatch from the Honorable Court of Directors, No. 66 dated 28th August last, is published for general information.

Para. 2.—It appears that Mr. Turner, joined the Indian Navy as Purser on the 31st December 1828, and that his absence from his duty on account of ill health, has been so frequent, that up to the 30th November 1843, actual service did not exceed 7 years 11 months and 24 days;—Mr. Turner however appears to have been absent on sick leave within the Indian limits for a period of 3 years 7 months and 16 days, which would in the case of a Military Officer be reckoned as service, to entitle him to retired Pay, and upon this principle Mr. Turner's period of servitude will amount to 11 years 7 months and 10 days up to the date of his being put out of employ by your Government, and having referred to the proceedings of the Medical Committee, which was assembled at your Presidency, to examine and report on the fitness of Mr. Turner for further service; wherein it is stated that "from the frequent attacks of illness to which he has long been subject, and is still subject, and from the apparent broken state of his general health, he is never likely again to be permanently fit for the performance of the active duties of his office", and that "he should at once be invalidated;" we have resolved, with the view of promoting the efficiency of the public service, to place Mr. Turner upon the retired List, and have accordingly granted him the pension fixed by the retiring Regulations for a Purser, viz. £125 per annum, commencing from the 30th November 1843, the date when he was put by you out of employ.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 5th of October 1844:

ACT No. — OF 1844.

An Act for empowering Courts to issue Warrants in cases of failure to serve Summons.

It is hereby enacted, that in the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company, except the Local Jurisdiction of the Supreme Courts, whenever in any Criminal case a Summons to the Defendant is by Law the first process, it shall be lawful for any Court which has issued a Summons in such case, to issue a Warrant for the apprehension of the Defendant in such case, upon proof that due diligence has been used to serve such Summons upon the Defendant, and that the Officer or other person whose duty it may be to serve such Summons upon the Defendant has been unable to serve such Summons, any Law or Regulation to the contrary notwithstanding.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 5th day of January next.

The following Extract from the proceedings of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council, in the Legislative branch of the Home Department, under date the 12th October 1844, is published for general information.

Read a second time the Draft of a proposed Act, dated 18th May last, and published in the *Calcutta Gazette* on the 22nd of the same month, for regulating the punishment of Adultery in the Courts of the East India Company, in the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

RESOLUTION.—The Right Hon'ble the Governor General in Council resolves, that the following amended Draft on the subject be published for general information:

Act No. — of 1844.

An Act for regulating the punishment of Adultery in the Courts of the East India Company, in the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

1. It is hereby enacted, that whenever any person shall be convicted of the offence of Adultery by any of the Courts of the East India Company, within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay, such person shall be sentenced to fine or imprisonment, or both, at the discretion of the Court, and shall not be sentenced to any other punishment whatever, any Law or Regulation to the contrary notwithstanding.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that no person shall be admitted to prosecute any woman for adultery other than the husband of such woman, and that no person shall be admitted to prosecute any man for adultery other than the husband of the woman with whom such man is alleged to have committed adultery.

Ordered, that the Draft Act be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council after the 12th January 1844.
