When a Syrang, Tindal or Lascar, Stoker, Coal Trimmer, or any Native dies in any Vessel of the Indian Navy, the Commanding Officer will immediately secure his effects; if a Will be forthcoming, which appears to be valid, the Commanding Officer will cause it to be acted upon at once, so far as may be practicable, but if there be no Will, or if the party to whom the property is Willed be at a distance, the Commanding Officer will cause the effects to be converted into cash, and after paying all Ship debts, remit the proceeds to the Sub-Treasurer, on behalf of the Assistant Superintendent Indian Navy; the Commanding Officer will take care that all arrears of Pay, &c., due to the deceased are drawn and placed to the account of the Estate, and he is not to consider the estate settled while any arrears remain undrawn.

2nd. In order that the accounts of estates may be closed as soon as possible, the amount, for which effects are sold, is to be realised at once, and not left to be recovered on any future issue or adjustment of pay; to obviate all difficulty in this respect, advances may be made to any purchaser by the Commander of the Vessel, to which he the said purchaser may belong.

3rd. Accounts of Estates are not to be closed until all arrears shall have been received, but pending the close of the accounts, remittances on account may be made to the Sub-Treasurer, on behalf of the Assistant Superintendent Indian Navy. Abstracts for arrears are to be framed and transmitted to the Presidency without delay, when the Purser of the Receiving Ship "Hastings" will draw from the Pay Office, what is due, and deposit it in the hands of the Sub-Treasurer, care must be taken that in all Abstracts, so transmitted, the particulars of deductions to be made are properly stated, and duly signed by the Commanding Officer and Purser, or Clerk in Charge, to enable the Pay Master to recover the same prior to any payment, for eventual deposit in the Treasury, and a copy of these Abstracts of arrears is to be sent to the Assistant Superintendent Indian Navy.

4th. All proceedings and papers connected with Estates, and all references for instructions are to be transmitted to the Assistant Superintendent Indian Navy, by the Officer Commanding.

5th. If a Syrang, Tindal, Lascar, or Stoker, dies on Shore, or on board any other Ship, the same forms are to be observed, with respect to his effects and estate, in the vessel to which he belonged, as if he had died on board.

6th. All Officers in command of vessels of the Indian Navy, are required to transmit monthly to the Superintendent of the Indian Navy, a return according to the following form, shewing the amount standing to the credit, after the payment of Ship debts, of deceased Native Seamen, and the manner in which the same may have been appropriated.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 5th of October 1844:

ACT No. — OF 1844.

An Act for empowering Courts to issue Warrants in cases of failure to serve Summons.

It is hereby enacted, that in the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company,

except the Local Jurisdiction of the Supreme Courts, whenever in any Criminal case a Summons to the Defendant is by Law the first process, it shall be lawful for any Court which has issued a Summons in such case, to issue a Warrant for the apprehension of the Defendant in such case, upon proof that due diligence has been used to serve such Summons upon the Defendant, and that the Officer or other person whose duty it may be to serve such Summons upon the Defendant has been unable to serve such Summons, any Law or Regulation to the contrary notwithstanding.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 5th day of January next.

The following Extract from the proceedings of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council, in the Legislative Branch of the Home Department, under date the 12th October 1844, is published for general information.

Read a second time the Draft of a proposed Act, dated 18th May last, and published in the *Calcutta Gazette* on the 22nd of the same month, for regulating the punishment of Adultery in the Courts of the East India Company, in the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

RESOLUTION.—The Right Hon'ble the Governor General in Council resolves, that the following amended Draft on the subject be published for general information:

ACT No. — OF 1844.

An Act for regulating the punishment of Adultery in the Courts of the East India Company, in the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

I. It is hereby enacted, that whenever any person shall be convicted of the offence of Adultery by any of the Courts of the East India Company, within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay, such person shall be sentenced to fine or imprisonment, or both, at the discretion of the Court, and shall not be sentenced to any other punishment whatever, any Law or Regulation to the contrary notwithstanding.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that no person shall be admitted to prosecute any woman for adultery other than the husband of such woman, and that no person shall be admitted to prosecute any man for adultery other than the husband of the woman with whom such man is alleged to have committed adultery.

Ordered, that the Draft Act be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council after the 12th January 1844.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 12th of October 1844:

ACT No. — OF 1844.

An Act, vesting Courts of Appeal with the discretion to require or dispense with Security for Costs from the Appellant.

Whereas it is not now by Law necessary within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, to take any Security for Costs in Appeals before the Sudder Courts—and whereas

no Security for Costs is now required by Law in Appeals from the decisions of Moonsiffs, and whereas it is expedient that Appeals from all Courts should be put in this respect upon a uniform footing:—

It is therefore hereby enacted, that, within the said Territories, it shall not be necessary in any Court of Appeal to take any Security for Costs, but it shall be in the discretion of every Court of Appeal to demand Security for Costs from the Appel-

lant or not, as it shall see fit, before the Respondent is called upon to answer,—any Law or Regulation to the contrary notwithstanding.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 12th day of December next.
