The Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to republish for general information the following Notification, issued by the Government of Bengal, on the 30th ultimo :-

NOTIFICATION.

The 30th October, 1844.

The Right Honorable the Governor of Bengal, with the concurrence of the Supreme Government of India, has been pleased to determine that, from and after the 11th November 1844, the rate of duty to be charged on Salt imported by Sea into any part of the Presidency of Fort William in Ben al, shall be Three Company's Rupees on every Maund of 3,200 Tolas.

From and after the same date, the whole of the Salt in store at the different Depôts, will be available to the public at the following wholesale prices :-

The Government reserves to itself the power of re-imposing the full amount of duty authorized by law, should circumstances arise to render such a measure necessary, but no alteration whatever will be made either in the duty now fixed on imported Salt, or in the Prices to be paid for Salt sold by wholesale on account of Government, before the 1st August 1845.

Collectors of the Land Revenue and all Officers of the Government in fiscal charge of districts, are hereby directed to make known the substance of this Notification, as widely as possible throughout their several jurisdictions.

The Board of Customs, Salt and Opium, will issue the necessary instructions to their subordinates in the Salt and Customs Departments.

Read a second time the Draft of a proposed Act, dated 18th May last, and published in the Calcutta Gazette on the 22nd of the same month, for regulating the punishment of Adultery in the Courts of the East India Company, in the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

Resolution.—The Right Hon'ble the Governor General in Council resolves, that the following amended Draft on the subject be published for general information:

ACT No. - OF 1844.

An Act for regulating the punishment of Adultery in the Courts of the East India Company, in the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

It is hereby enacted, that whenever any per-1. It is hereby enacted, that whenever any person shall be-convicted of the offence of Adultery by any of the Courts of the East India Company, within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay, such person shall be sentenced to fine or imprisonment, or both, at the discretion of the Court, and shall not be sentenced to any other punishment whatever, any Law or Regulation to the courtary notification. the contrary notwithstanding.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that no person shall be admitted to prosecute any woman for adultery other than the husband of such woman, and that no person shall be admitted to prosecute any man for adultery other than the husband of the woman with whom such man is alleged to have committed adultery.

Ordered, that the Draft Act be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council after the 12th January 1844.

Whereas it is not now by Law necessary within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, to take any Security for Costs in Appeals before the Sudder Courts—and whereas no Security for Costs is now required by Law in Appeals from the decisions of Moonsiffs, and whereas it is expedient that Appeals from all Courts should be put in this respect upon a uniform foot-

ing:—
It is therefore hereby enacted, that, within the said Territories, it shall not be necessary in any Court of Appeal to take any Security for Costs, but it shall be in the discretion of every Court of Appeal to demand Security for Costs from the Appellant or not, as it shall see fit, before the Respondent is called upon to answer,—any Law or Regulation to the contrary notwithstanding. to the contrary notwithstanding.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Braft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 12th day of December next.
