NOTIFICATION.

OPTIONAL PRE-PAYMENT OF POSTAGE ON OVERLAND LETTERS.

1. The Home Authorities having finally determined on the introduction of the scheme for permitting the optional pre-payment of the Postage on Letters passing between the United Kingdom and India via Southampton, IT IS HEREBY NOTIFIED for general information, that the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council has been pleased to fix, as the day on which the new system shall be brought into operation in this Country, the 1st of March next, from which date the several Post Masters throughout India will be prepared to receive, at the option of the sender, Steam Postage on all Letters directed to the United Kingdom via Southampton.

2. The following are the British rates of Steam Postage agreed upon by the Lords of the Treasury, and sanctioned by the Government of India, according to which, all Letters received "Bearing" from, or despatched "Paid" to, the United Kingdom via Southampton will be taxed in addition to the usual Indian Postages, viz:

When not exceeding.....	1	Ounce	1	Shilling	or	8 annas.
Above 1 oz. and not exceeding 1 do.	2	do	2	do	or	1 rupee.
" 1 do. and not exceeding 2 do.	4	do	4	do	or	2 rupees.
" 2 do. and not exceeding 3 do.	6	do	6	do	or	3 do.
" 3 do. and not exceeding 4 do.	8	do	8	do	or	4 do.

And so on, increasing two Shillings, or one Rupee, for every additional ounce weight or any fraction thereof.

3. As British weights may not be generally available to the Public for regulating the weight of their correspondence, the following scheme for using Coins of the Indian Currency for that purpose, will be found to afford a very close approximation to the ounce and the half ounce weights.

Coins will, in like manner, be within the weight allowed to a double Steamer Letter.

4. The Public will bear in mind that this optional pre-payment of the Steam Postage applies only to the route via "Southampton" and that Letters sent by "Marseilles" cannot be prepaid in this Country. It applies also only to Letters posted in India addressed to the United Kingdom and vice versa, and does not apply to Letters posted in, or addressed to, places beyond the United Kingdom; i. e., all Letters for America, unless addressed to Agents in the United Kingdom, as well as those addressed to the Continent of Europe, if marked "via Southampton," must go "bearing" from this Country.

5. The postage of all Letters for the Red Sea, Egypt, the Mediterranean and Foreign Europe, via Marseilles, upon which 9 annas have hitherto been levied as single Postage, (agreeably to the Notification* by the Government of India of 5th June 1839) is to be reduced† from 1st March next to the same scale as the Steam postage on Letters from, and to, the United Kingdom via Southampton.

Is hereby given, that verbal tenders, to endure from 1st June next, for a period of one, two or three years, will be received by the Superintendent of Repairs, at his Office, at 2 o'clock on Tuesday the 20th instant, for restoring to their original form, and Repairing and keeping in Repair, to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Repairs, for the time being, the whole of the Streets and Roads without the Limits of the Town of Bombay, and for Repairing and keeping in Repair in like manner, for the same period, all Drains, Walls, Barriers and other things which may be considered by the said Superintendent of Repairs for the time being, to appertain to the said Streets and Roads; also for cleaning and keeping clean to the satisfaction of the above said Superintendent of Repairs for the same period all the Roads as well as all the Side, Covered and Cross Drains appertaining to the said Streets and Roads; also for watering from the 10th of October, to the 10th June for a similar period, to the satisfaction of the said Superintendent of Repairs, certain of the Streets and Roads without the Limits of the Town of Bombay, either with Salt or Brackish water or water taken from such Tanks and Wells only, as may be from time to time pointed out by the Superintendent of Repairs for the time being; also to water, fence in, and preserve the Trees and re-place with others such as may die or shall not thrive on the Bellassis Road, and also those on the Roads between Bycullah Tank and Mahim Woods &c. &c.

The Contractor whose tender for the above Works may be accepted, will be required to accede to certain conditions, and will subject himself to certain penalties for breaches in the performance of his Contract, specifications of which conditions and penalties may be seen on application at the Superintendent's Office, between the hours of ten and four every day, except Sunday. Separate Lists of the Streets, Roads, and Drains to be repaired &c. and of the Roads and Streets to be watered may also be seen at the same Office, and any further information obtained.

Every person submitting a tender, will be required to lodge with it a sum of Rupees five hundred, to be forfeited in case of his delaying or evading the execution of his Contract, should his tender be accepted; and the person whose tender may be accepted, will be held liable for all damages (over and above his deposit) which may occur from the non-fulfilment of his engagement.

Security in Rupees or Government Paper, to be lodged in the Office of the said Superintendent of Repairs, will be required from the Contractor, to the extent of ten per cent on the amount of the Contract, to be forfeited in failure of the due performance of his Contract.

He is to be paid by monthly instalment, and appears, upon a Certificate from the Superintendent of Repairs, that he has fulfilled his Contract to that Officer's satisfaction.

No reason will be assigned for the rejection of any tender.

THE 13TH JANUARY, 1844.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 13th January 1844.
 ACT No.—OF 1844.

An Act for the better management and disbursement of certain Public Funds and Monies for Police and Municipal purposes throughout the Islands of Bombay and Colaba.

I. It is hereby enacted, that Sections 16, 23, 27 and 28 of Regulation XIX. of 1827 of the Bombay Code, shall be and they are hereby repealed.

II. And it is hereby enacted and declared, that the terms "Police Fund," "County Fund," and "Assessment Fund," used in any Rule, Ordinance and Regulation, or in any Act of the Government of India in force in the Islands of Bombay and Colaba, shall be taken to mean the "Municipal Fund" hereinafter described.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that the several Sums of Money specified under the following heads shall in future be disbursed in the manner provided by this Act, vizt

All Sums of Money which shall hereafter be collected under the authority of—
 The Statute 33d Geo 3. Cap. 52, Sec. 158.
 Rule, Ordinance, and Regulation II. 1812, Art. 2 and 6

Rule, Ordinance, and Regulation II. of 1813.

Proclamation dated 23d July 1817, by the Governor in Council of Bombay, of an Order of the Court of Directors, dated 29th January 1817, made under the authority of the Charter of the Court of Requests of Bombay, dated 8th January 1753, save and except the Fees thereby made payable to the Clerk of the said Court for his own benefit.

Rule, Ordinance, and Regulation I. of 1818.

Rule, Ordinance, and Regulation II. of 1827.

Regulation XIX. of 1827, C. 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.

Act No. XXVIII. of 1839.

All Sums of Money which shall be levied by the Court of Petty Sessions, or by the Magistrates of Police of Bombay, or by any of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace within the Islands of Bombay and Colaba on account of any fines or penalties imposed by them for the breach of any Rule, Ordinance or Regulation, or of any Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, or of any Act of the Government of India.

All Sums of Money which shall be collected on the granting of any Licences for the Sale of Spirituous or other Liquors within the Town and Islands of Bombay and Colaba, after payment thereof of the expenses of the Office Establishment and other expenses incidental thereto.

And all unapplied balances which at the time of the passing of this Act may be in the General Treasury to the credit of the County or Assessment Funds, or in the possession of said Court of Petty Sessions, or of the Magistrates of Police, or any of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace derived from any of the above enumerated sources.

IV. And it is hereby enacted and provided, that nothing in this Act shall extend or apply to any fines imposed by the Collector of customs of Bombay in his office and character of Collector, nor to such portion of any of the fines which the court of Petty Sessions, or either of the Magistrates of Police may, in their discretion order, and which they are hereby authorized to order, to be paid to any Prosecutor or his witnesses as and for compensation for loss of time or for costs necessarily incurred by him in prosecuting the offences for which such fines or penalties may have been ordered to be paid.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that all Sums of Money which are by the said Act No. XXVIII. of 1839, ordered to be paid out of the Fund, therein called the County Fund, for the purposes in such

Act specified, shall henceforth be paid out of the Fund in this Act designated the Municipal Fund.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that the several Sums of Money referred to in Section III. of this Act shall when collected and received, save and except so much as is otherwise provided for, be paid into the General Treasury, and form a Fund to be denominated "The Municipal Fund," and such Fund shall be placed under the supervision and control of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in Sessions assembled or such other persons as to the Government of Bombay may seem most fit, and that for the administering the same and carrying this Act into effect, an executive body shall be formed, which shall be denominated the Board of Conservancy, which shall be composed of Seven Members, of whom the Senior Magistrate of Police shall be Chairman, and the Superintendent of Police Ex-Officio a Member, and the other five Members shall consist of two Europeans and three Native Resident Justices, who shall be elected by Her Majesty's Bench of Justices, or by such other persons as the Government of Bombay may appoint to supervise and control the Fund, and shall remain in office for a period of three years, when a fresh election of five other Justices to form such Board of conservancy shall be made by the said Bench, or other persons appointed for the purpose by the Government of Bombay, and so on at the end of every three years successively a like new election shall take place, but nothing shall prevent the re-election of the same Justices, or any one or more of them to form the said Board if in the discretion of the Bench or other persons appointed to superintend and control the Municipal Fund, it shall be deemed advisable for the interests of the public so to do, and in the event of a vacancy occurring by death or otherwise among any of the said five Members the persons vested with the power by the Government of Bombay shall as soon as convenient elect some other Justice of the Peace to supply the said vacancy for the remainder of the three years, and until the next general election shall take place.

VII. And it is hereby enacted, that from and out of the said Municipal Fund, an Annual Sum of Rs. 45,000 shall in the first instance be deducted and paid by equal monthly instalments, and carried to the credit of the Governor in Council of Bombay in the General Treasury, to be applied by the said Governor in Council for and on account of the Expenses of the General Police throughout the Islands of Bombay and Colaba, and in the event of such expenses being at any time hereafter increased by a necessary augmentation of the Police Force, or through any other good cause, a further sum of Money, bearing the same proportion to such increased expenses of the General Police aforesaid, shall be in like manner deducted and appropriated out of the said Funds.

VIII. And it is hereby enacted, that after the deduction and payment of such sum of Money as aforesaid, the residue of the said Fund shall be appropriated and disbursed by the said Board under and subject to the control of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace, or other persons appointed for that purpose by the Government, for the following purposes:

1. Defraying the expenses of the Establishments necessary for the purposes of this Act.
2. Repairing, Cleansing, Draining and Lighting the Public Roads, Streets, Bridges, Tanks, Market Places and other public places of a like kind.

IX. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Board, with the approval of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace, or other persons vested with that power by the Government to construct any new Roads or Streets, or other Public Works, tending to the improvement of the said Islands, connected with the comforts and health of the inhabitants thereof, which in their discretion they shall deem necessary, and for that purpose to cause Estimates and Plans to be framed and to be submitted to the Governor in Council of Bombay for his sanction, but no such new Road or Street, or other Public Works, shall be constructed without such sanction of the Governor in Council first had and obtained.

X. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Board, with the sanction of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in Sessions assembled, or with the sanction of such other persons as may be vested with the control of the Municipal Fund by

the Government of Bombay to nominate and appoint, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council of Bombay, such persons as they may deem fit to perform the duties of the following offices:

Superintendent of Repairs, Clerk to the Markets, Overseers and Scavengers.

And such persons shall be under the immediate orders and control of the said Board, and shall receive such Salaries to be paid out of the said Fund, as the said Justices or other authorities appointed by the Government of Bombay shall fix, and the Governor in Council of Bombay shall approve.

XI. And it is hereby enacted and directed, that for better enabling the persons empowered by the Government of Bombay to supervise and control the Municipal Fund, to ascertain the amount of fines payable to the said Fund, from any of the sources aforesaid, there shall in every month be laid before them a summary of all convictions and punishments pronounced and determined by the said Court of Petty Sessions, or either of the Magistrates of Police or any Justice of the Peace respectively, during the preceding month.

XII. And it is hereby enacted, that the sums authorized to be collected under the Tax on Horses and Carriages, and provisions of Cap. 4, S. 28, Clauses 1 and 2, of Regulation XIX. of 1827, shall in future be collected by such person as the Governor in Council shall appoint.

XIII. And it is hereby enacted, that the said Board shall bring to account all items of receipt, and shall as soon as practicable after 30th April of each year, render to the Governor in Council of Bombay and the Controlling Authorities nominated by the Government of Bombay, a Yearly Account of their Receipts and Disbursements under this Act, and the same shall be audited by such persons as the said Governor in Council shall appoint.

XIV. And it is hereby enacted, that in the event of the body vested with the supervision and control of the Fund, rejecting any measure submitted for their sanction by the Conservancy Board, it shall be lawful for the said Board, if they see fit, to refer the subject to the Governor in Council of Bombay, whose decision thereon shall be final.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 13th day of April next.

THE 20TH JANUARY, 1844.

The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council, on the 20th January 1844, with the assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India, which has been read and recorded.

Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. I. OF 1844.

An Act for securing certain immunities and privileges to His Highness the Nabob of the Carnatic, His Family and Retinue.

Whereas questions have lately been raised as to the liability of persons of the Family, Household and Retinue of His Highness the Nabob of the Carnatic to the process and jurisdiction of Courts of Justice, and it is deemed expedient that provision should be made for protecting by legislative enactment, under the qualifications hereinafter mentioned, certain individuals of the Family, Household and Retinue of his said Highness from any such liability, and from claims and litigation to establish any such liability:

I. It is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council of Fort Saint George to publish, from time to time, in the Gazette at Madras, lists containing the names of persons be-

longing to the Family, Household or Retinue of His Highness the Nabob of the Carnatic, or of the Nabob Regent for the time being, who are to be entitled under this Act to privilege from Civil and Criminal process, and also from time to time to revise and alter such lists and publish in the Gazette as aforesaid new lists of the persons entitled for the time being to such privilege, and the list which shall have been last so published shall be the list which for the time being shall be in force and effect for the purpose of this Act.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that no Writ or Process shall at any time be sued forth or prosecuted against the persons, goods or property of His Highness the Nabob of the Carnatic, or of the Nabob Regent for the time being, or of any person whose name shall be included in any list so published in the Gazette as aforesaid, and which for the time being shall be in force and effect for the purpose of this Act, unless such Writ or Process shall be so sued forth or prosecuted with the consent of the Governor in Council of Fort St. George first had and obtained, such consent to be testified by the signature of the Secretary, or one of the Secretaries of Government, and that any Writ or Process which shall at any time be sued forth or prosecuted against the person or goods or property of His said Highness, or of the Nabob Regent, or of any such person as aforesaid, without such consent as aforesaid, so testified as aforesaid, shall be utterly null and void.

III. And it is hereby enacted and directed, that the said Governor in Council of Fort St George shall

from time to time cause to be furnished to the Governor General of India in Council copies of any and every list which shall be so published as aforesaid and shall conform to and follow any directions which he may from time to time receive from the Governor General of India in Council respecting the persons to be included in any such list from time to time, and otherwise with respect to the matters which are the subject of this Act. And also that the said Governor in Council of Fort St. George shall from time to time cause every list, which shall be published in the Gazette as aforesaid, to be also otherwise published in such manner as shall be deemed proper and sufficient for the purpose of making the same generally known.

IV. And it is hereby enacted and provided, that this Act shall not be construed or be held to be in any way declaratory or explanatory of the meaning or effect of any Treaty made or entered into with His Highness the Nabob of the Carnatic, and shall not be construed either to enlarge or restrict the operation of any such Treaty, and that independent of this Act His Highness the Nabob of the Carnatic and the Nabob Regent for the time being, and their respective families, dependants, and retinue shall be entitled to claim, maintain and enjoy any privilege which by virtue of any such Treaty or otherwise they may be rightfully entitled to.
