#### NOTIFICATION.

#### OPTIONAL PRE-PAYMENT OF POSTAGE ON

## OVERLAND LETTERS.

The Home Authorities having finally determined on the introduction of the scheme for permitting the optional pre-payment of the Postage on Letters passing between the United Kingdom and India via Southampton, IT IS HEREBY NOTIFIED for general information, that the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council has been pleased to fix, as the day on which the new system shall be brought into operation in this Country, the 1st of March next, from which date the several Post Musters throughout India will be prepared to receive, at the option of the sender, Steam Postage on all Letters directed to the United Kingdom via Southampton.

2. The following are the British rates of Steam Postage agreed upon by the Lords of the Treasury, and sanctioned by the Government of India, according to which, all Letters received "Bearing" from, or despatched "Paid" to, the United Kingdom vià Southampton will be taxed in addition to the usual Indian Postages, viz:

pee, for every additional ounce weight or any fraction thereof.

As British weights may not be generally, available to the Public for regulating the weight of their correspondence, the following scheme for using Coins of the Indian Currency for that purpose, will be found to afford a very close approximation to the ounce and the half ounce weights.

The half ounce avoirdupois—the weight for a single Steamer Letter-being equal to

Grains Troy 2162, and one 1 Rupee.....180 1 Copper Pie 33. 333 Rupee and one Copper Pie of the Company's curren-Graine Troy. 213. cy being equal to Grains Troy 2134, every person

confining his English correspondence to the weight of these two Coins will be certain of being within the weight prescribed for a single Steamer Letter.—The ounce avoirdupois—the weight of a double Steamer Letter—being equal to Grains Troy 437½, and two half

anna pieces, and one Copper Pie being equal to Grains 4331, every Letter not exceeding the aggregate weight of three such 333

Grains Troy. 433. 333 Coins will, in like manner, be within the weight allowed to a double Steamer Letter.

The Public will bear in mind that this optional pre-payment of the Steam Postage applies only to the route via "Southampton" and that Letters sent by "Marseilles" cannot be prepaid in this Country. It applies also only to Letters posted in India addressed to the United Kingdom and vice versa, and does not apply to Letters posted in, or addressed to, places beyond the United Kingdom; i. e. all Letters for America, unless addressed to Agents in the United Kingdom, as well as those addressed to the Continent of Europe, if marked "via Southampton," must go "bearing" from this Country

The postage of all Letters for the Red Sea, Egypt, the Mediterranean and Foreign Europe, via Marseilles, upon which 9 annas have hitherto been levied as single Postage, (agreeably to the Notification \* by the Government of India of 5th June 1839) is to be

The Bullocks to be of superior size and weight, equal to the draught of Guns, heavy Stores &c., and such other work as may be required, and to be of Mysore or Malwa breed.

2. No person will be allowed to tender for the contract, unless he previously deposits in the Commissariat office the sum of Company's Rupees, (1,000) one thousand, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, should his offer be accepted. This deposit will be returned on the deed of agreement

being duly completed:

3. Sealed tenders will also be received at the above mentioned Commissariat Offices, from distant stations, on or before the 20th proximo, such tenders as are received before the sale commences will be opened at its close, and each offer duly recorded, provided it is accompanied by the 1,000 Rupees deposit.

The Bullocks will be subject to the approval of a Committee of Officers, and are not to be entered younger than 5, or older than 8 years of age, and this rule of age, is to govern

all Cattle that may be replaced.

5. The Bullocks to be branded in presence of the Committee passing them, with the letters P. D. A. of one inch in length, on the off hip.

6. The Bullocks and Drivers, to be mus-

tered monthly.

7. The Drivers to be settled with monthly, and not to be discharged without the permission of the Commissariat Officer.

The hire to the Bullocks to be paid on

the 20th of each month.

9. The Bullocks to be fed with good Kurbee or Grass, and to allow each Bullock, daily, at least 30 pounds of good dry Kurbee or Grass, or 40 pounds of green, and each Bullock to receive daily, when marching, 4 pounds of dry gram, and two pounds in camp.

10. The contracting party or his authorized Agent, to attend daily at the Commissariat

office, to receive orders.

The contractor to be answerable for all losses of Government property, conveyed by the said Bullocks.

12. All casualties of Bullocks by death or otherwise, to be replaced forthwith, and to be also subject to the approval of a Committee of Officers, and branded in the same manner as stated in clause No. 5 of this Notification.

13. The Commissariat Officer at Poona, will at any time be authorized to submit for the inspection of a Committee of Officers, any Bullocks which he may consider unfit for service, and if condemned, to replace them; -should the contractor refuse to do so, recovering the amount paid on that account, from the first monthly bills that may become due to him.

14. The Bullocks will be allowed, at the

discretion of the Commissary General, a respite after any particular heavy duty, should satisfactory reasons be shewn for granting this

indulgence.

15. The contract to be renewed at the end of 3 years, for 2 years more should Government

deem it adviseable to do so. The granting of this indulgence will however greatly depend upon the manner in which the contract is performed, whether satisfactorily or otherwise.

16. The amount of deposit to be lodged by

the contractor; to cover any lossess Government may sustain either by damage to property during transit, or to provide for cases where he may fail to produce fit and proper Bullocks, will be Rupees 1,000, to be deducted from the hire of the Cattle, in such proportions as may hereafter be determined on.
17. To supply any additional number of

Cattle for any period that may be required, for the service of Government, provided not less

than twenty (20) days notice is given.

18. Should the contractor disobey any orders of the Commissariat Officers or others set over him, he will be liable to be fined at the pleasure of Government, not exceeding Rupees (100) one hundred for each offence, and in case of any infringement of the conditions of the deed of agreement, it will be optional with Government to order him to be fined, or to put an end to the contract, the amount deposited by the Contractor being in the latter case forfeited.

No reasons will be assigned for the re-

jection of any offer.

It is hereby enacted, that from and after the First day of the Administration of Civil and Criminal Justice, the Superintendence of the Police, and the Collection and Superintendence of the Revenues of every description within the lapsed Territories of Colaba, shall vest in such Agent to the Governor of the Presidency of Bonbay as shall be appointed by the Governor in Council, and shall be exercised by the said Agent with the aid of such Assistants as may be appointed by the said Governor in Council. It is hereby enacted, that from and after the

II. And it is hereby enacted, that is shall be competent to the Governor iu Council of Bombay, by an Order in Council, to prescribe such Rules as he may deem proper for the guidance of the Agent aforesaid, and of all the Officers subordinate to his control and authority, and to determine to what extent the decision of the Agent in Civil Suits shall be final, and in what Suits an Appeal shall lie to the Sudder Udalut, and to define the authority to be exercised by the Agent in Criminal Trials, and what case he shall submit to the decision of the Foujdarce Udalut.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that upon the re-

III. And it is hereby enacted, that upon the receipt of any Criminal Trials referred by the Agent
under the Rules which may be hereafter prescribed
by the Governor in Council, the Foujdaree Udalut
shall proceed to pass a final judgment or such other
order as may, after mature consideration, seem to
the Court requisite and proper, in the same manner,
as if the trial had been sent up in ordinary course
from a Sessions Judge from a Sessions Judge.

And it is hereby enacted, that upon the receipt of any Appeal from a decree of the Agent duly preferred under the Rules to be prescribed as afore-said, the Court of Sudder Udalut shall proceed to try and determine it in the same manner as Appeals from the Zillah Courts.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Governor in Council, by an Order in Council, to make from time to time, with the previous sanction of the Governor General of India in Council, such alterations in the limits of the aforesaid Territories placed under the jurisdiction of the said Agent, as he may deem expedient.

The Governor General in Council not having yet received any instructions relative to the disposal of the Prize Property captured in Scinde, and taking into consideration the distinguished services of the Troops engaged in the Battles of Meanee and Hyderabad, taking also into consideration the distinguished services of the Troops engaged in the Battles of Maharajpoor and Punniar, is pleased to resolve, that all the General, and other Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, and Privates, engaged in the Battles of Meeanee, Hyderabad, Maharajpoor, and Punniar, shall receive a gratuity of six months Batta, as a testimony of the gratitude of the Government and of the admiration with which it regards their conduct in the Field.
- 2. The Governor General in Council taking also into consideration, that it is not only in the Field, that good Soldiers prove their sense of Military duty, but that those who at the Command of the Government encounter readily and endure with fortitude peculiar hardships arising from climate, from privation, or from disease, may equally with those who meet danger in the Field, become entitled under extraordinary circumstances, to receive some special marks of approbation and regard, taking further into consideration the very extensive and unusual sickness which has prevailed in Scinde during the past year, and the consequent sufferings of the Troops quartered in that Province, is pleased to resolve, that all the General and other Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates who have at any time served in Scinde during the year commencing on the 28th February 1843, shall receive a gratuity of six months Batta.
- 3. The Troops engaged in the Battles of Mecanee and Hyderabad are entitled to the gratuity given by both the above resolutions, and will therefore receive twelve months Batta.
