GOVERNMENT ADVERTISEMENT.

The Right Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for general information the following rules, instituted for the guidance of British Vessels visiting the Persian Gulf, and to announce, that if the Commander of any such Vessel shall fail to conform to these rules, he will forfeit all claims to the interference or good offices of the British Political Officers in the Persian Gulf in his behalf.

Rules for the guidance of Vessels carrying a British Pass and Flag to the Persian Gulf.

1. On the arrival of a British Vessel in Bushire roads, an immediate report is to be made to the Resident in writing of the same, together with the date of sailing from her original port, and any other she may have touched at on her voyage. All Packets and Letters addressed the Residency are to be forwarded along with the above report.

2nd. Three days previous to the date fixed for the departure of any British Vessel from Bushire, a report in writing of the same is to be made to the Resident. In the event of its not being the intention of the Commander to remain three days, this report is to be made on the day of arrival.

3rd. Previously to any British Vessels leaving Bushire, a copy of the manifest of the cargo imported, and one of the cargo exported is to be furnished to the Resident.

4th. In the event of a dispute arising between the Commander of any British Vessel and any of the Native merchants of Bushire, and both parties consenting to refer the matter to the Resident, the decision of that officer as to the most advisable method of arranging the disagreement is to be obligatory upon the Commander making the reference.

5th. In the event of any complaints being made against the Commander or any of the Crew of a British Vessel, by any of the inhabitants of Bushire, the Commander is to be guided by the opinion of the Resident as to the measures to be adopted in consequence.

6th. In the event of any British Vessel purposing to touch at any of the Ports on the Arabian Coast between Burka and the mouth of the River Euphrates, an intimation of the same in writing is to be previously made to the Resident, and the Commander of the Vessel is to be guided entirely by the Resident's opinion.

7th. All British Vessels entering the inner roads of Bushire to pay the established pilotage according to the rates sanctioned by the Government.

8th. The Commander of the British Vessel to be guided by the Customs of the Port in respect to the receipt and delivery of cargo.

9th. The conveyance of the public packets from the Residency and giving a receipt for the same to be obligatory upon the Commanders of all British Vessels visiting Bushire.

GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

The following extract from amended Regulations which have been passed by the Honorable the Governor in Council in respect to the instruction and control of the Junior Members of the Bombay Civil Service, are published for general information.

1. Immediately on the arrival of a Junior Civil Servant, a Committee will be appointed to test the progress made by him at Haileybury in the study of the Oriental languages and the result of such examination will be reported for the information of the Hon'ble the Court of Directors.

2. No Junior Civil Servant shall in future be employed in the Public Service until he shall have passed in two of the Native languages of which Hindoostanee shall be the first and Mahratta, Goozerathee or Canarese the second.

3. The examinations at the Presidency shall be held on the 10th of January, the 10th of May, and the 10th of October, but occasional and intermediate examinations will be allowed on Students applying for them, and to obviate the necessity of young Civilians who may be permitted by Government to reside and prosecute their studies in the interior, being obliged to repair to the Presidency, special Committees shall be appointed for their examination at outstations.

4. The Government will determine in each case whether the young Civilian shall remain at the Presidency or shall proceed at once into the interior; at the Presidency he shall be placed under the control and superintendence of the Chief Secretary and in the Mofusil of the Collector of the District.

5. In order to ensure the employment by Junior Civil Servants of properly qualified Moonshees or Pundits, no student shall employ any Pundit or Moonshee who has not obtained certificates of qualification from the Oriental Translator to Government, and every student shall be required to state in his monthly abstracts that he has been attended by a Pundit or Moonshee (as the case may be) possessing the requisite certificate.

6. The allowance to a student on his arrival in Bombay shall in future be Rs. 200 per mensem, until he attains a competent knowledge of one of the Native languages when he shall receive an additional allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem. He shall also have Rupees 30 for a Moonshee, and if residing at the Presidency Rs. 80, or if in the Provinces Rs. 40 for House rent. The allowance for Moonshee, and House rent, is not however to be continued for a period exceeding fifteen months, and is in every case to cease on the student being declared qualified for the public service, when he shall be entitled to Rupees 400 per mensem, whether he be posted to an office or not; an unposted qualified Student, however, if desirous of obtaining a higher degree of proficiency, or acquiring additional languages, may, at the discretion of Government, have the allowance for a Moonshee continued for a reasonable period, while he is not holding any appointment, and is devoting himself exclusively to study.

7. The period for the acquirement of the requisite qualification for the public service, by proficiency in two of the Native languages,

shall in future be limited to fifteen months, on the expiration of which, the rank of the young Servant shall cease, until he passes the requisite examination; but Government, with reference to the circumstances of each case, will retain the discretionary power to grant such further extension as shall not exceed on the whole six months, in addition to the fixed period allowed; after which, should the Student fail to qualify himself he shall be finally removed from the service, and a passage to England shall be found for him, on application, at the public expense.

8. The above rules are not to apply to Civilians of a term of which any one member had arrived in Bombay on the 28th January last.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that Act XV. of 1844, entitled an Act for amending the Schedules of Import Duties annexed to Act XIV. of 1836, to Act I. of 1838, and to Act VI. of 1844, be repealed.

ACT No. 111. OF 1845.

An Act vesting Courts of Appeal with the discretion to require or dispense with Security for Costs from the Appellant.

Whereas it is not now by Law necessary within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, to take any Security for Costs in Appeals before the Sudder Courts—and whereas

no Security for Costs is now required by Law in Appeals from the decisions of Moonsiffs, and whereas it is expedient that Appeals from all Courts should be put in this respect upon a uniform footing:—

It is therefore hereby enacted, that within the said Territories it shall not be necessary in any Court of Appeal of the East India Company to take any Security for Costs, but it shall be in the discretion of every such Court of Appeal to demand Security for Costs from the Appellant or not, as it shall see fit, before the Respondent is called upon to answer,—any Law or Regulation to the contrary notwithstanding.
