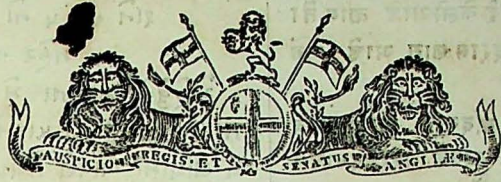

Verbal offers for the contract will be received at this Office on Wednesday the 9th proximo, when persons will be required to bid a per centage below the prices exhibited in the list above adverted to, on the understanding, that the articles are to be of good and approved quality and delivered in good condition free of all charges to the Department requiring them.

The contractor will be required to comply immediately with all emergent demands for the articles included in the abovementioned list, and

others of less urgency must be met within the period stated in the requisition book in failure thereof, the articles or such others as may be required in lieu will be purchased at his risk and loss, and in all such cases an advance of Rupees (30) thirty per cent upon the amount of expenses incurred, or a fine of Rupees (50) fifty, at the option of the executive Officers will be levied as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of contract as often as the same may occur.

No person will be allowed to bid for the contract unless he previously deposits in the Office the sum of Rupees (800) eight hundred, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract; and should his offer be accepted he must be prepared to add thereto a further sum of Rupees (1200) Twelve hundred, which together with the above amount will be held as security for the due performance of the engagement.

It is hereby to be distinctly understood, that Government will at any time be at liberty to employ its own establishment in making up all or any of the articles including in the preliminary schedule for renewing the above contract, either in their Jails or elsewhere, notwithstanding any contract that may be entered into with reference thereto.

No. 199 of 1845.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to declare, in accordance with the Regulations obtaining under the Bengal Presidency, that in future, Pensioners of whatever description, who neglect for a continuous period of one year to apply for their stipends, either personally or to send due notice of their inability to attend within that period, shall be struck off the Pension List, and shall be considered as having forfeited all claim to continue thereon; nor can any pension thus lapsed be in any case restored without the express sanction of Government.

2. In no case will arrears beyond six months of the period, for which Pensions may thus become forfeited, be paid to individuals in the event of their restoration to the Pension List being authorized by Government.

3. This rule does not effect the arrears payable to individuals on their first admission to the Pension List. (Notes Art: 101, Page 639, and Art: 194, page 652, Jameson's Code.)

The following Act, passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 1st of March 1845, is hereby promulgated for general information.

ACT No. IV. OF 1845.

An Act to amend the Law regarding the Registration of Deeds.

I. It is hereby enacted, that from and after the passing of this Act, Deeds may be registered in any Registry Office within the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, whether such office be in the District where the property or any part thereof to which such Deeds relate, is situated, or not.

II. Provided always, and it is hereby enacted, that when the Registry Office in which a Deed is registered, is in a District in which the whole of the property to which such Deed relates is not situated, it shall be the duty of the Register of the said Office to forward to the office of the District or Districts in which the whole or any part of such property is situated, a copy of the Deed as registered and endorsed in his office, the said copies to be furnished and attested as prescribed in Clause First, Section 2, Regulation XX. 1812, and the Register of any office receiving such copy so forwarded, shall duly register the same as if it had been presented to him in the first instance by the party registering.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that for every such copy required for transmission to any office as aforesaid the party registering shall pay the usual fee, and the Register receiving the same shall duly account for the same to the several Registers, to whose offices copies may be transmitted for registry.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that a Memorial of any Deed shall be held to be duly registered according to Law, in respect to any property which may be situated in any one District, as soon as the original Deed or a copy thereof (as the case may be) shall have been registered in manner aforesaid in the Registry Office of such District, whether or not a copy thereof have been registered in all or any of the other Districts in which he property to which the Deed relates may be situated.

*An Act for authorizing the employment of the Uncovenanted Assistant Register of the Sudder Dewanee and Sudder Foujdaree Adawlut of Bombay on the duties of Register.*

It is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Court of Sudder Dewanee and Sudder Foujdaree Adawlut of Bombay to assign to the office of Uncovenanted Assistant Register to the Court any duties at present performed by the Register.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 1st day of June next.

ACT No. — OF 1845.

*An Act for regulating the re-admission of Appeals after dismissal under Act XXXIX. of 1841.*

Whereas the Provisions of Act XXXIX. of 1841 are inconveniently severe as regards Appeals and it is expedient to mitigate the strictness thereof:—

I. It is therefore hereby enacted, that whenever an Appeal in any of the Courts of the East India Company in the Presidencies of Bengal or Madras, shall after the passing of this Act have been dismissed under the Provisions of the said Act XXXIX. of 1841, it shall be competent to the Court which shall have dismissed such Appeal to re-admit the same if the

Appellant shall make application for that purpose on the Stamp prescribed for miscellaneous Petitions, within three months after the Appeal shall have been dismissed if dismissed by the Sudder Court, and within one month after the Appeal shall have been dismissed if dismissed by any other Court, and shall satisfy the Court that the dismissal was occasioned by the default of his Vakeel or by unavoidable accident.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to any of the said Courts to re-admit any Appeal which may have been dismissed before the passing of this Act under the Provisions of Act XXXIX. of 1841, if the Appellant shall make application for that purpose on the Stamp prescribed for miscellaneous Petitions, within three months after the passing of this Act, and shall satisfy the Court that the dismissal was occasioned by the default of his Vakeel or by unavoidable accident.

III. Provided always and it is hereby enacted, that no Appeal which has been re-admitted under this Act, and again dismissed under the Provisions of Act XXXIX. of 1841, shall be again re-admitted.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 15th day of June next.
