And whereas the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay is by Her Majesty's Charter authorized and empowered to admit and enrol only such persons having been admitted Attorneys or Solicitors in one of Her Majesty's Courts at Westminster to act in the character of Attorneys of the said Court, and is not by the said Charter authorized and empowered to admit and expense otherwise appelled the state.

And whereas it is expedient that the Supreme Court of Judicature of Bombay should have as large a discretion in regard to the persons to be admitted as Attorneys as the Supreme Court of Judicature at

Madras: It is therefore hereby enacted, that from and after the passing of this Act the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay is authorized and empowered to admit and enrol persons having been admitted as Attorneys in any of Her Majesty's Courts at Westminster, and also persons being otherwise capable, to act as Attorneys of the said Supreme Court of Bombay.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 12th July 1845 :

ACT NO. -- OF 1845.

An Act relating to Cotton exported and imported at the Bombay Presidency.

I. It is hereby enacted, that Cotton Wool shall be allowed to be exported from any subordinate Port of the Bombay Presidency to the Port of Bombay, free of the Duty specified in Schedule B. of Act No. I, of 1838.

II. Provided, and it is hereby enacted, that the exporter of Cotton Wool under Section I. of this Act shall make application to the Collector of Customs at the Port of Exportation for an Export Certificate in Form A. annexed to this Act. and shall specify therein the particulars relative to the shipment required in the said Form, and the Exporter shall at the same time furnish Security for the amount of Duty chargeable on a like shipment of Cotton Wool according to Schedule B. of Act No. I. of 1838, with an advance thereon, as a Deposit, of 50 per cent., and shall engage under penalty of the forfeiture of such Deposit, except prevented by accident of the Seas, that the Cotton Wool so exported shall be landed at the Port of Bombay, and that proof of such landing shall be produced at the Port of Exportation within forty days from the date of the Certificate to be granted as hereafter prescribed.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that the exporter having conformed to the conditions described in the preceding Section of this Act, shall be entitled to receive, and shall receive from the said Collector of Customs an Export Certificate according to Form B, annexed to this Act, which Certificate shall accompany the Cotton so exported, and shall be delivered at the Custom House of Bombay, and the Collector of Customs at Bombay, being satisfied with the same, shall grant an Import Certificate to the Owner or Consignee of the Cotton according to Form C. annexed to this Act, which being delivered at the Port of Export within forty days from the date of the Export Certificate as hereinbefore provided, the Security shall be cancelled, and the Deposit returned to the Ex-But it shall be competent to the Collector of Customs at the Port of Exportation to extend the period for the production of the Import Certificate on a good and sufficient plea beyond forty days as he may deem reasonable.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that for any such excess in the quantity of Cotton landed of what is covered by the Export Certificate as shall in the opinion of the Collector indicate an intention to defraud the Revenue, the Exporter or Owner or Consignee shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the amount of double the Duty chargeable on Cotton Wool according to Schedule A. of Act No. I. of 1838, and for any such deficiency as shall in the opinion of the Collector indicate an intention to defraud the Revenue, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the market value of a like quantity of Cotton, with double Duty, as chargeable on an importation of Cotton according to the said Schedule of the said Act.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that the penalties imposed under Sections II. and IV. of this Act

shall be levied as ordinary Customs and demands against the Exporter or Owner or Consignee, and the Securities given under Section 11, shall be enforced as Revenue demands under Section XII. of Regulation XVII. of 1827 of the Bombay Code,

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that Cotton Woolshall be allowed to be imported into the Port of Bombay, from any part of the Territories of the East India Company free of the Duty specified in Schedule A. of the said Act No. I. of 1838.

VII. And it is hereby enacted, that all Cotton Wool brought to the Port of Bombay from any other Port of the Bombay Presidency without an Export Certificate shall be confiscated.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 12th day of October next.

An Act to provide for the appointment of Nazirs in the Moonsiff's Courts.

I. It is hereby enacted, that so much of Clause

4, Section 5, Regulation VII. of 1832 of the Bengal Code, as enacts that certain duties assigned to the Nazir of the Judge's Court shall in the Moonsiffs' Courts be performed by the Moonsiffs them-selves, and that the Tullubanah levied in the Moonsiff's Court shall only be three fourths of what is levied in the Judge's Court, is repealed.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, the Moonsiffs shall from and after the passing of this Act retain on their Establishments Nazirs to whom the provisions of Clause 8, Section 14, Regulation XXVI. of 1814 of the said Code shall be applicable.

An Act respecting the appointment and powers of Agents for the suppression of Meriah Sacrifices in the Hill Tracts of Orissa.

I. It is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor General in Council, by an Order in Council, to remove from the jurisdiction and superintendence of the Commissioner and Superintendent of Tributary Mehals in Guttack, any of the Tributary Estates specified in Section 2, Regulation II. of 1816 of the Bengal Code, and to place any such Estates under the jurisdiction and superintendence of such Officer (to be called the Agent for the Suppression of Meriah Sacrifices) and his subordinates, as shall from time to time be appointed by the Government of Bengal in that behalf.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor General in Council by an Order in Council to remove from the jurisdiction and superintendence of the Agent to the Governor General, appointed under Regulation XIII. of 1833 of the Bengal Code, any portion of the tracts of Country specified in Section 3 of the said last mentioned Regulation, and to place any such portion under the jurisdiction and superintendence of such Officer (to be called the Agent for the Suppression of Meriah Sacrifices) and his subordinates, as shall from time to time be appointed by the Governor of Bengal in that behalf.

III. Aud it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor General in Council by an Order in Council to remove from the jurisdiction and superintendence of the Collectors of Ganjam or Vizagapatam, exercised by them as Agents to the Governor of Fort St. George under Act XXIV. of 1839, any portion of the tracts of Country specified in Section II. of the said last mentioned Act, and to place any such portion under the jurisdiction and superintendence of such Officer (to be called the Agent for the Suppression of Meriah Sacrifices) and his subordinates, as shall from time to time be appointed by the Government of Fort St. George in that behalf.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor General in Council, by an Order in Council, to remove from the operation of the General Regulations and Laws any portion of Zillah Rajamundry, and to place any such portion under the jurisdiction and superintendence of such Officer (to be called the Agent for the Suppression of Meriah Sacrifices) and his subordinates, as shall be appointed by the Government of Fort St. George in that behalf.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that all such Agents and their subordinates as shall be appointed under this Act, shall in the exercise of their jurisdiction and superintendence, be guided by such instructions as they may from time to time receive from the Government of India through their respective Governments.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that it shall be competent to the Governor General in Council, through the Governments of the aforesaid Presi-

dencies respectively, to prescribe such Rules as he may deem proper for the guidance of such Agents and subordinates, and to determine to what extent the decision of the said Agents in Civil Suits shall be final, and in what Suits an appeal shall lie to the Sudder Court, and to define the authority to be exercised by the said Agents in Criminal trials, and what Criminal cases they shall submit for the decision of the Sudder Court.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 31st day of August 1845.

No duties will be exacted on account of the Hon'ble Company's Government on Opium protected by Passes; it will, however, be liable, should occasion require, to examination when in transitu, and also on its arrival at Bombay, with the view of ascertaining that the quantity corresponds with that specified in the Pass, but there will be no detention or obstruction by the Officers of Govern-ment, beyond what may be necessary for the diligent prevention of any Opium being conveyed into the Territories subordinate to this Presidency.

5th. The owners of the Opium will have to make their own arrangements for its transport. The despatches will be accompanied by one or more Chuprasses or Peons, as the Resident and the Opium Agent in Malwa shall consider advisable, but the providing of Escorts for the protection of the Drug will rest with the owners, and Government will not be answerable for any casualties that may befall the

same.

6th. It is left to the option of persons taking out Passes, to pay at the rate of Bombay Rupees 17 per Chest, in commutation of all Customs and Du-ties that may be due to the Native States through whose Territories the Opium is conveyed, or to pay those Duties themselves. Opium for which this commutation money may have been paid, shall be allowed to pass equally free from Customs and Duties whether examined at, and despatched from, Indore, or Ratlam, or other Marts in Malwa.

7th. Persons residing at Ahmedabad, Baroda, Surat, or other places desirous of exporting Malwa Opium under a Pass, will be furnished with the same on application to the British authorities resident at

such places.

The Hon'ble the Governor in Council guarantees, that the price to be paid for the Passes and in commutation of the Duties to Native States, shall continue as now fixed, to the 1st of October 1846, but the guarantee here given will not debar the Government from continuing to grant Passes after the expiration of this period, should it think fit to do so, without a further Proclamation.

9th. For the convenience of individuals, deposits of Company's Paper will be received on account of sums payable for the Passes and Duties specified in Articles 1st and 6th, interest being payable to Goverment on the same, until redeemed, at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, and the deposit should be re-deemed on or before the arrival of the Drug at Bombay, from which period the charge on account of in-

terest will be doubled.

10th. Hoondies may be received by the Opium Agent in Malwa, for Passes taken out there, pay-Agent in Malwa, for Passes taken out there, payable to the Opium Agent in Bombay, within six days after sight; if not redeemed within that period, a deposit of Company's Paper, or substantial security must be given by the parties concerned, interest being charged at the rate of 5 per cent until the arrival of the Opium, which will be detained until payment be made. If security be not forthwith produced, the Hoondies will be returned as disherent out the Opium, seized on its arrival dishonored, and the Opium seized on its arrival.

The Holders of passes are to take the Opium to Indore, Ratlam or any other place in Malwa, that may suit the wishes and convenience of both parties, to be weighed by persons who will be appointed by the Opium Agent in Malwa to perform

that duty.

12th. Fifteen days notice must be given to the Opium Agent in Malwa, or his Assistant, by all persous about to make exportations under Licences previously to the production of the Opium at the place of weighment, in order that he may be bet-

ter prepared to receive, weigh and dispatch it.

13th. Only one dispatch will be allowed under a Pass or Licence, which dispatch may, or may not, at the option of the holder of the Pass, be to the full quantity mentioned in it; but if a smaller quantity be exported, no drawback or refund from the sum paid for the Pass, will be allowed on account of such deficiency, excepting in the case of parties taking out Passes at Bombay, who will be allowed a refund on account of such deficiency on a report thereof being made to this Government by the Opium Agent in Malwa, but in the event of the actual dispatch containing a greater quantity of Opium than that for which the Pass was taken out, such excess shall be paid for at the rate specified in the lst article of this Proclamation, and shall, by way of security for payment, be liable to detention by the Collector of Customs at Bombay until paid for.

14th. In weighing the Opium an allowance of three lbs. will be allowed for each Chest of 140 lbs.

With the exception contained in Article 8th, the Hon'ble the Governor in Council reserves to himself the right to adopt from time to time, such measures as he may conceive to be necessary to prevent the illicit trade in Opium, and to secure the object of Government in sanctioning the present arrangement.
