Extract Military letter to Bengal, dated 11th April 1839, (No. 21.)

Para. 26. "We have no hesitation in expressing our concurrence in your opinion that an officer who has completed the prescribed period of effective Service, and thus earned a full title to the benefit of the enlarged pension regulations as published in G.O. No. 258 of 1837, does not impair or forfeit such title by his subsequent 'transfor to the invalid establishment,' such title however must depend entirely on effective service; and time passed in India after transfer to the Invalids, can give no additional claim under the Regulation above mentioned." ### FORT WILLIAM, HOME DEPARTMENT,

#### LEGISLATIVE.

The following Act, passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 16th of August 1845, is hereby promulgated for general informaACT No. XVII. of 1845,

An Act for the better enforcement of the attendance of Witnesses in the Courts of the Moonsiffs, within the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal.

I. It is hereby enacted, that Clauses 1 and 2, Section XXXI. and Clause 1. Section XXXII. of Regulation XXIII. of 1814, of the Bengal Code,

are repealed.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, if any Moonsiff shall require the evidence of a person not within his local jurisdiction, and such person shall not attend at the requisition of the parties, the Moonsiff shall issue the necessary process for procuring the attendance of such person, and send the same to the Moonsiff within whose local jurisdiction such person is, who shall endorse such process and cause it to be duly

served and executed.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that within the said Territories all powers now exercised by Zillah Judges for enforcing the attendance of any person upon whom a summons to appear as a witness has been duly served, and who has failed to attend in their Courts, shall from and after the passing of this Act, be exercised by Moonsiffs for enforcing the attendance of any person upon whom a sum-mons to appear as a witness has been duly served, and who has failed to attend in their Courts .-Provided that all orders passed by Moonsiffs under this Act shall be subject to an appeal to the Zillah or City Judge, whose decision thereon shall be final.

#### FORT WILLIAM, HOME DEPARTMENT, LEGISLATIVE.

THE 16TH AUGUST, 1845. The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 16th of August 1845.

ACT NO. -- or 1845.

An Act for the establishment and maintenance of field boundary marks in the Presidency of Bombay.

Whereas it is desirable, with a view to the better definition and security of landed property, the prevention of encroachments and disputes, and the identification of lands assessed to, or exempted from, the public revenue, that provision should be made for the establishment and maintenance of permanent marks to distinguish the boundaries of fields:

I. It is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful, within the territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay, for such Revenue Officers as the Governor in Council may entrust with that authority, to require that marks be erected and maintained by the Owners or Occupants on the boundaries of fields, of such materials, and in such number as may appear to such Officers sufficient for permanently distinguishing the limits of those fields.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that the requisition shall be served on the persons owning or oc-

cupying each field according to the Form A annexed to this Act, and in the event of these persons not being found in the Village, that the said re-quisition shall be posted at the Village Chowree or other conspicuous place in the Village, which shall

be held to be a sufficient service.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that in default of the Owners or Occupants of the fields complying

with the requisition, the said Revenue Officers shall give directions for the erection and repair of such field boundary marks, the cost of which shall be equitably apportioned on the fields which they serve to distinguish, and shall be charged to the persons possessing a right of ownership or occupancy in such fields, of if there are no such persons forthcoming (or willing to defray the charge) to the revenues of the Village in which the fields are situated.

IV. And it is hereby enacted, that no person being out of possession and claiming a right of ownership or occupancy in fields, the cost of erecting or maintaining whose boundary marks has been charged to the revenues of the Village, in consequence of his neglecting to defray the same, shall have his claim allowed until he makes good

all sums so charged.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that any person who may be convicted of wilfully erasing, removing, or injuring field boundary marks, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty Rupees for each mark so erased, removed, or injured, one half of which fine may be awarded on conviction to the informer, and the other half shall be chargeable with the cost of

restoring the mark.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that authority for the assessment and realization of all sums due under the provisions of this Act, whether as costs or penalties, shall be vested in Revenue Officers authorized to provide for the erection and maintenance of field boundary marks, and shall be exercised by them in conformity with the rules prescribed for the assessment and realization of Revenue demands in general, and that the proceedings of those Officers in all such matters shall be recorded in writing, and shall be subject to appeal to the Revenue authorities to whom they are subordinate,

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 16th day of November next.

The following Act, passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 23rd of August 1845, is hereby promulgated for general information:—

ACT No. XVIII. OF 1845.

An Act for the punishment of offences committed by Convicts sentenced to imprisonment for life.

Whereas it is expedient that offences committed by Convicts sentenced to imprisonment for life, should be punished, with greater severity than such offences are punished with in other cases:— I. It is hereby enacted, that within the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company, except within the local limits of the jurisdiction of the Supreme Courts, and except within the Settlements in the Straits of Malacca, any convict sentenced to imprisonment for life, or to transportation for life, who does any act with the intention of thereby causing, or with the knowledge, that he or she is likely thereby to cause the death of any person, shall, upon conviction thereof, before the Sessions Court, subject to confirmation by the Sudder Court, be punished with death, or with transportation for life, or with Corporal punishment not exceeding 39 stripes, whether such Convict does or does not by such act cause the death of any person.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that any such Convictas aforesaid who commits any offence whatever other than the offences mentioned in the preceding Section, or who is guilty of violent or disorderly conduct after having been punished by the order of the Superintendent of the Jail, in which he or she is confined, shall, upon conviction thereof, before the Sessions Court, subject, if the Sentence be transportation for life, to confirmation by the Sudder Court, be punished with transportation for life, or with Corporal punishment not exceeding 39 stripes.

The following Act, passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 30th August 1845, is hereby promulgated for general information:

ACT No. XIX. OF 1845.

An Act for incorporating the Assam Company.

Whereas it hath been discovered, that there are in the British Province of Assam and other the North Eastern parts of India, numerous and extensive tracts of country producing the genuine Tea Plant, and it has been ascertained that the soil and climate are in all respects adapted for the cultivation of the Tea Plant on an extensive scale.

And whereas it is considered, that the cultivation and manufacture of Tea in India will be of great national importance and benefit, as well to the United Kingdom as to the British Territories in India, and the same may be advantageously prosecuted on a scale beyond the resources and enterprize of individual Capitalists, and a Society or Company hath been lately formed for the purpose of prosecuting and extending the said culture and manufacture with a Capital of Company's Rupees 50,00,000 in 10,000 Shares of Co's. Rs. 500 each, and certain grants of land have been already made to the said Company in Assam and the North East parts of India aforesaid, and establishments have been formed by the said Company for the purposes of the said culture and manufacture, and are now in operation.

And whereas the whole 10,000 Shares have been subscribed for and appropriated, and the Proprietors have actually paid up Company's Rupees 20,00,000 of the said Capital of Company's Rupees 50,00,000 and the several Subscribers are willing at their own expense to carry on the said culture and manufacture, and it would tend much to the convenience and advantage as well of the said Subscribers as of the public, that they should be incorporated in the manner hereinafter mentioned and provided,

And whereas it is considered, that there are in Asam other articles and products of indigenous growth, or to which the soil and climate are also adapted, the culture and preparation of which may be carried on with great advantage and profit by the said Company as incidental to, or in connection with their Tea cultivation and establishment, and whereas it is desirable that provision should be made for enabling the said Company if they shall think fit to avail themselves thereof, and for enabling them to increase their Capital Stock.

And whereas several of the persons hereinafter named had been appointed and acted as a Provisional Committee for the purpose of forming and establishing the said Company and commencing the business thereof, and the said Company has since been constituted under the provisions of a Deed of Association, bearing date the 31st day of January 1840, and made between the several persons whose names are thereunder subscribed, and whose seals are thereunder subscribed, and whose seals are thereunto affixed, (except the several persons, parties thereto of the second and third parts,) of the first part, Sir William Baynes, Baronet, Richard Twining, Thomas Weeding, John Alliston, Andrew Henderson, Francis Fox, and William Cracroft, therein respectively described of the second part, and Sir George Gerard de Hochipied Larpent, Baronet, John Small, Alexander Rogers, Foster Reynolds, John Travers, William Manning, William R. Robinson and Ross Donnelly Mangles, therein also respectively described, of the third part, and under which Deed the business of the said Company has been commenced and carried on, and whereas in such Deed provision was made for confirming the several Acts, Deeds, Matters and Things executed and performed by the Provisional Committee in that capacity.

And whereas it is expedient that like provision should be made herein, and also provision for vesting, continuing and establishing in, for, and against the Corporate Body hereby created after (and notwithstanding their Incorporation) all such property, rights, contracts and liabilities whatever as the said existing Society or Company are, or but for such Incorporation would be possessed of, entitled or liable to.

I.
