Notification.**GENERAL DEPARTMENT.**

The Honorable the Governor in Council having received from the Acting Senior Magistrate of Police, two reports regarding the destructive fire which occurred in the Native Town on the evening of the 28th ultimo, is anxious to express his deep regret at the loss of property and life by which that disaster was attended, and to offer his warm thanks to the Officers and Men of Her Majesty's and the Hon'ble East India Company's Naval and Military Services, and of the Local Police, and generally to all persons of every class who gave their assistance on this occasion, and to whose zealous and continued exertions the early arrest of the conflagration is, under Divine Providence, mainly to be attributed.

In connection with this subject the Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to direct the publication of the following extracts of reports from the Acting Senior Magistrate of Police at the Presidency.

"The Fire Engines of the Civil Branch under Captain Parr, the Acting Superintendent of Police and those of the Military Branch under Major Willoughby, the Director of Fire Engines, were early on the spot, and the excellent and effective manner in which they were worked, and placed under the personal superintendence of those officers, had the effect of getting under, before 2 A. M. a fire which at one time threatened to destroy a great part of the Native Town.

"Important assistance was rendered to the Police by numerous gentlemen and other persons present whose names I have not been able to ascertain, but, I cannot refrain from bringing to the prominent notice of His Honor in Council, the intrepidity displayed by some seamen of the Hon'ble Company's Indian Navy, who, under my own view, entered a warehouse in the immediate vicinity of the fire, and removed therefrom amidst numerous sparks and flying embers, a quantity of not less than a ton and a half of gun powder and fire works.—Had these exploded, an awful destruction of life and property must have ensued, I shall lose no time in obtaining the names of these seamen in order that I may hand them up to Government with a recommendation that their courage and intrepidity on this occasion may be suitably rewarded.

I also deem it my duty to bring to the notice of Government the great service rendered by two Companies of the 25th Regt. of N. I. under the command of Captains Willoughby and Hall, who were indefatigable in their exertions in placing their men on the engines, and otherwise where they could be useful, and the Sepoys under their orders evinced a state of discipline highly commendatory, which had the effect of causing their efforts to be successful.

In closing this report, I beg to state, that the greatest assistance was rendered by Lieut. Col. Woodburn the Commandant of the Garrison, by Captain Lynch the Acting Superintendent of the Indian Navy, and by the Officers, Soldiers, and Seamen under their orders.—The seamen of Her Majesty's Ships "Fox" and "Pilot" were also present and rendered good service.

"In continuation of my letter dated the 29th of last month, No. 614, I have the honor to report, for the information of the Honorable the Governor in Council, that the following detachments of the Corps in Garrison were present at the destructive fire which took place on the night of Tuesday last the 28th ultimo.

"Lieutenant Colonel Woodburn C. B. the Commandant of the Garrison; of Her Majesty's 17th Foot, two Companies with Major Gordon, Lieu-

tenant and Adjutant Sawyer, and Ensign Gardiner; of the 5th Regiment N. I., there were present 140 men under Lieutenant Taylor, with Lieutenants McCulloch and Robertson, and Ensign McKee-knie;—Of the 7th Regiment N. I. three Companies were present with Captain Andrews, Lieutenant and Acting Adjutant Jameson, and Ensign Hart,—of the 8th N. I. 200 men under Lieutenant Hall, of the 25th Regiment N. I.,—of the 9th Regiment two Havildar's parties were present,—of the 25th Regiment N. I. 300 men under Captain Willoughby, Lieut. Hall, & Lieutenant Lowry, with Lieut. and Adjutant Glennie,—of the Marine Battalion nearly the whole were present under Major St. John.

"In my former report I omitted inadvertently to mention the name of Mr. Dunlop, the deputy Superintendent of Police, water division, who was present with as many of his men as could be spared from their immediate duties and rendered good service.

"With reference to the 4th paragraph of my report of the 29th ultimo, I now do myself the honor to hand up the names, as per margin, of eight seamen of the Indian Navy, who under the command of Captain Boulderson removed at the immediate risk of their lives, a quantity of Gun Powder and Fire works from the immediate neighbourhood of the fire to a place of safety."

In publishing these extracts for general information, the Hon'ble the Governor in Council desires in particular to record his high sense of the intrepidity displayed by the eight men of the Indian Navy as noticed by Mr. Danvers in the above paragraph.
