The arrival at, or departure from Aden of 200 men or under, will have no effect on the amount payable for the monopoly, but all additions to that number, will be adjusted according to the preceding proportions.

The arrack sold at Aden is to be imported from Bombay of a good and wholesome quality and retailed at (1-8-0) one Rupee and eight annas per bottle, an ample supply to be always kept up by the contractors.

The stipulated amount for the monopoly for one month is to be paid in advance, and two unexceptionable sureties furnished for the due fulfilment of the agreement, who will be bound to make good any deficiency in the payment.

No liquor whatever is to be sold to European Troops without the written permission of the Military Superintendent of Bazaars, or by such Regulations as may from time to time be issued under the instructions of the Officer Commanding the Aden Force.

The contractor will be bound in the penalty of the forfeiture of his contract as well as the advanced security deposited, neither to sell nor to permit any liquor to be sold at a lower rate than that stated above.

Should it hereafter appear that there are present at Aden on the 1st of February 1846, a greater number of Native Troops and Camp Followers than are mentioned above, a corresponding increase to the monthly sum for which the contract is sold, shall be paid to Government by the contractors for all alterations above 50 and vice versa, if a decrease should occur in the above number on the date before specified viz : 1st February 1846.

No. 603 of 1845.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to declare the provisions of the following General Order by the Government of India No. 232, dated 9th August 1844, applicable to the Army of this Presidency.

In consequence of representations received through the Military Board, from Officers Commanding European Troops on the subject of the rations now issued to the Soldier, the Governor General of India in Council is pleased to authorize the following alterations in the existing scale, to take effect as soon as the necessary arrangements can be made in the Commissariat Department.

The quality of the bread issued in the rations of a Soldier, is to be equal to that now, and heretofore, provided for Hospitals.

Mutton will be issued twice a week in lieu of beef, and in the same quantity, whenever circumstances may admit, or it can be procured in sufficient quantity.



Coffee to be substituted for tea at the option of the Soldier, in the proportion of 2 lbs. of the former to 1 lb. of the latter, at all Stations where tea may not be procurable; but when both articles are at hand, Commanding Officers are authorized to indent for either the one or the other, as may be most in consonance with the wishes of their men.
