## PROCLAMATION.

**BOMBAY TO WIT.** By virtue of a precept to me directed, I hereby proclaim and give notice, that the Sessions of Oyer and Terminer and general Gaol Delivery, will be holden before the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay, at the Court House, on Monday the 5th day of July next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders and other Felonies, Perjuries, Trespasses and other Crimes, and Misdemeanors, had, done, or committed within the Town and Island of Bombay, and the limits thereof, and the Factories subordinate thereto; and also to enquire, hear and determine, in like manner, all Treasons, Murders, Felonies, Forgeries, Perjuries, Crimes, Extortions, Misdemeanors, Trespasses, Wrongs, Oppressions, had, done, or committed, by any of Her Majesty's British Subjects, in any of the Territories which now are subject to, or dependant upon the said Government of Bombay, or within any of the Dominions of the Native Princes of India, in alliance with the said Government.

And also, that at the same time and place, will be holden a Session of Admiralty, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, Piracies, Robberies, Trespasses, Misdemeanors, and other Crimes and Offences, had, done, perpetrated or committed on the High Seas.

And I hereby give notice to all persons bound to prosecute, and give evidence, at the above Sessions, or in any way concerned therein, that they are to attend, at the time and place above mentioned, and not to depart without leave of the Court.

And I hereby give notice, to all Justices of the Peace, Coroners, Escheators, and also all Chief Constables and Bailiffs of the Town and Island of Bombay, and the Limits thereof, that they be then and there, in their own persons, with their Rolls, Records, Indictments and other Remembrances, to do those things, which to

The following extract from the new Post office ordinance recently passed at the Mauritius, is published for general information.

ART. 22.—The following premiums shall be given to the Masters or Commanders of Vessels bringing Mails or Overland Newspapers to Mauritius under the annexed condition.

£ 30 for any vessels touching expressly for the purpose of landing the *Overland Post office Mail*, upon proof of the vessel having sailed from the Port at which such Mail was taken on board within five days after the arrival there- of of the said mail.

£ 30 for any vessel bringing the same, upon proof of the vessel having sailed within 48 hours of the arrival of the Mail as above described.

£ 20 for any vessel upon proof of the ves- sel having sailed within five days of the said ar- rival.

And £ 10 for any vessel not conveying the last Overland Mail, but bringing an *Overland newspaper* of the latest date, not already re- ceived in the Colony, and which shall be de- livered within 80 days after publication and be made public in the exchange room immediately after the arrival of the said vessel.

GENERAL ORDERS BY THE RIGHT HON<sup>BLE</sup> THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA.

*Simla, 21st May 1847.*

With reference to G. G. O. No. 37, dated the 24th January 1845, and general orders by the President in Council No. 23, dated the 16th January 1846, the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Governor General is pleased to publish in G. O. an extract of a military letter from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Court of Directors to the Government of Bengal No. 34, dated the 7th April 1847.

Para. 10. "The grant by G. O. of 24th January 1845 to the widows and families of European officers of our service killed in action with the enemy, of the pensionary and other pecuniary advantages heretofore granted to the widows and families of officers of Her Majesty's service similarly circumstanced, was not intended to be in substitution for the advantage they previously enjoyed of receiving their late husbands share of donation batta, in the event of any such donation being granted to the troops engaged in action. The widows and families of Her Majesty's officers have always hitherto been admitted to both advantages and those of the Company's service are to be placed on the same footing."

## MARINE DEPARTMENT.

No. 63 of 1847.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to publish the following rules relative to the grant of compensation to Commissioned and Warrant, Engineers and Petty officers and seamen of the Indian Navy, to non-commissioned officers and privates of European corps serving therein as Marines, to non-commissioned officers and privates of the Marine Battalion, also serving therein, and to Native engineers, stokers, coaltrimmers and servants paid by the State, for the loss of professional instruments, books, clothing, and other effects (under circumstances provided for in the following articles) in such cases as they shall be acquitted of all blame as to the cause of any such loss.

## I.

That the principle upon which allowances for articles lost on service are granted, shall be that of enabling individuals to re-equip themselves for service, and allowances are therefore not to be considered as given for the purpose of making good the full amount of loss sustained.

## II.

Allowances are to be only made for losses which have been altogether unavoidable, such as

Losses in action with the enemy,  
By accidental fire,  
By shipwreck.  
By capture at sea.

Provided that in all these cases every exertion was used to prevent the loss, and that it was not incurred by the neglect or fault of the applicant for relief, and in no case will an allowance be made exceeding the maximum sums stated in the scale attached hereto.

## III.

If the senior officer on a distant station shall be satisfied on inquiry, that losses have been unavoidably sustained, which, in his opinion, may admit of compensation on the principles laid down in the foregoing articles, though not precisely specified therein, he shall be at liberty to make a special representation thereof, transmitting the necessary proofs to the Superintendent of the Indian Navy for submission to government.

## IV.

No claim will be admitted from the representatives of officers or men slain in action, or dying in consequence of wounds.

## V.

Whenever baggage or articles of equipment are sent by a vessel, in which, the officer to whom they belong is not himself a passenger, it is incumbent on such officer to protect himself against loss by effecting an insurance thereupon, and if he has an opportunity of doing so, and neglects to avail himself of it, no compensation will be given by the public for any loss that may happen.

If any loss shall occur under circumstances which give the officer a claim to indemnification from the party through whose fault it happened, no allowance for such loss will be made by the public, but should the officer desire it, and lose no time in making application to the senior officer on the spot, an inquiry will be ordered to afford every possible assistance in substantiating the claim by making the necessary inquiries, and obtaining proper documents to prove the facts of the case.

## VI.

When losses occur on service away from the Presidency, the senior officer present at the nearest station shall order, with all convenient despatch, an investigation of claims arising from those losses, which inquiry is to be conducted on the principles laid down in these rules, and the several proofs to be produced in the forms hereinafter described, and the whole of the proceedings, or certified copies thereof with the said senior officer's observations and opinion thereon, are to be forwarded to the Superintendent of the Indian Navy for the purpose of being laid before government.

## VII.

In all cases which are not attended with the entire loss of clothes &c. of an officer, seaman, or other person entitled to indemnification, no claim is to be allowed unless the loss extends to the value of one-fourth of the amount allowed as compensation for the whole in each rank, and a list of the articles lost shall be delivered, and the investigating officer shall report whether he deems one-fourth, one-half, or three-fourths of the sum allowed for the whole, a sufficient compensation for the loss so sustained.

## VIII.

If an officer, seaman, or other person shall have neglected to bring forward his claim for a period exceeding one month from the date of his loss, this delay shall be considered a sufficient reason for rejecting the claim, however valid it may be in other respects, unless the claimant can prove that he was unavoidably prevented from making an earlier claim.

## IX.

The whole equipment of officers of the several ranks and of subordinates, including the articles in wear, shall be valued according to scale No. 1.

X.

The claims of all officers to allowances for articles lost on service, shall be made out and certified according to Forms Nos. 1 and 2, and separate lists shall be transmitted of all instruments and books, upon subjects strictly professional, showing their original cost, and the amount of the damage they may have sustained.

XI.

If losses should occur in other situations where a greater extent of equipment is absolutely required by the nature of the service the actual amount of loss suffered, and the circumstances attending it, may be specially stated at any inquiry appointed for the investigation of losses, such inquiry proceeding in the investigation of the claim, upon the same principle as in the preceding articles.

The opinion of the officers assisting at such enquiry, will be forwarded for the consideration of the Superintendent of the Indian Navy and government.

XII.

Losses of necessaries incurred by the Purser and Clerk in Charge shall be made the subject of a special application and decision in each particular case.

XIII.

No allowance shall be granted for losses sustained by officers or others when proceeding on, or returning from leave of absence.

XIV.

No claim shall be admitted on account of the loss of money being the private property of individuals.

*Losses of Warrant officers and Engineers, and Petty officers and Seamen; of Non-commissioned officers and Privates of European corps serving as Marines; of Native Engineers; Stokers, Coaltrimmers, and servants paid by the State; and of Non-commissioned officers and Privates of the Marine battalion serving in the Indian Navy.*

XV.

Claims on account of losses on service by persons of the grades above specified, are individually also to be made out and certified according to Form No. 3.

XVI.

All admissible claims of this description shall be settled by allowing for the whole, or for a certain proportion, or rate, of a complete set of bedding or clothing according to the circumstances of each case.

SCALE No. 1.

Maximum value to be allowed for the articles of equipment of officers and men of the Indian Navy according to their respective ranks, being the rates admissible in the Royal Navy, and to which is to be added twenty-five per cent, to meet the increased charge for Europe articles in India.
