## NOTIFICATION.

### ELPHINSTONE INSTITUTION.

#### CLASS OF CIVIL ENGINEERING.

An examination of Candidates for admission into the Class of Civil Engineering will be held in the Elphinstone Institution on Monday the 2nd proximo at 11 A. M.

The qualifications for admission as regards natives, are, a grammatical knowledge of their vernacular language as well as of the English; ability to write both languages neatly and correctly from dictation; and a knowledge of the elements of Arithmetic including the Rule of Three, and Decimal and Vulgar Fractions.

European and Indo-British Candidates for admission must possess a grammatical knowledge of the English language, with ability to write neatly and correctly from dictation, and the same qualifications in Mathematics which are required from natives by the preceding paragraph.

Special exceptions for admission as regards the knowledge of the English language, will be made in favor of persons possessing certain qualifications in Civil Engineering, and wishing to perfect themselves in the same.

No candidates will be admitted under sixteen or above twenty-two years of age, excepting in cases such as those adverted to in the last paragraph.

Should the number of candidates possessing the requisite qualifications exceed the number to which the class is limited, preference will be given to those who pass the best examinations, and produce the most satisfactory certificates of good conduct from the Masters of the Educational establishments in which they have been taught.

The privilege of admission is not confined to students educated in the Government Schools, but is open to all persons properly qualified.

BY COMMAND OF THE POST MASTER GENERAL.

### NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

GENERAL POST OFFICE, MAY 1847.

The Post Master General having been informed by the Court of Directors of the East India Company, that on and after the first June next, persons in this country may forward private correspondence by the Government Express from Bombay to Calcutta, and Madras; all persons desirous of availing themselves of this privilege will be required to mark upon the covers of their letters the words "by Express from Bombay" and in addition to this special address it will be necessary that all letters intended to be forwarded by the way of Southampton should be so endorsed as hitherto.

The postage to be charged in India on the delivery of letters sent by this Express, will be, in addition to the ordinary inland rates.

One rupee for every letter not exceeding half a tola in weight.

Two rupees for every letter above half a tola, but not exceeding one tola in weight.

Four rupees for every letter above one tola, but not exceeding two tolas in weight, two tolas being the maximum weight of letters to be conveyed by Express.

On Newspapers.—Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage, on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rupees each will be charged, and no newspaper will

be received for the Express exceeding three tolas in weight.

The contractor will be required to comply immediately with all emergent demands for the articles included in the abovementioned list, and others of less urgency must be met within the period stated in the requisitions made upon him, and that in failure thereof, the articles or such others as may be required in lieu will be purchased at his risk and loss, and in all such cases an advance of Rupees 30 thirty per cent upon the amount of expence incurred, or a fine of Rupees (50) fifty at the option of the executive officer, may be levied as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of contract as often as the same may occur, and that the contract may also in all such cases be put an end to on the part of the East India Company.

No person will be allowed to bid for the contract unless he previously deposits in this office the sum of Rupees 1000 one thousand in cash, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, should his offer be accepted he must be prepared to add thereto a further sum of rupees (690) six hundred and ninety in cash, making in all Rupees one thousand six hundred and ninety, and unexceptionable bonded security to the extent of Rupees six thousand seven hundred and sixty-two to be held by government as security for the due performance of his contract.

The amount of retrenchments made by the Military Board on the contractor's bills will be recovered from the first bills preferred for payment by the contractors, but in the event of such retrenchments being subsequently removed the amount thereof will be returned to them.

The annual outlay on account of the above contract is estimated at rupees (33,814) or thereabouts.

All further particulars will be communicated at the time of bidding and no reason will be assigned for the rejection of any offer.

The stipulated amount for the monopoly for one month is to be paid in advance, and two unexceptionable securities furnished for the due fulfilment of the agreement, who will be bound to make good any deficiency in the payment.

No liquor whatever is to be sold to European troops without the written permission of the Military Superintendent of Bazars, or by such regulations as may from time to time be issued under the instructions of the officer commanding the brigade.

The contractor will be bound in the penalty of the forfeiture of his contract as well as the advance security deposited, neither to sell nor

to permit any liquor to be sold at a lower rate than that stated above.

Should it hereafter appear that there are present at Poona and Kirkee, on 1st August, a greater number of troops and camp followers than are mentioned above, a corresponding increase to the monthly sum for which the contract is sold shall be paid to government by the contractors for all variations above 50, and vice versa if a decrease should occur in the above number on the date before specified viz. 1st August 1847,

The contractor is to take the contract with all its advantages and drawbacks, as he will not be considered entitled to any remission in consequence of failure of seasons, or any other causes save those distinctly specified in the contract, all petitions for remissions of monthly payments will consequently not be attended to.

The condition of the contract shall not be considered binding or in force in any respect until it be confirmed by government.

Art. 22.—The following premiums shall be given to the Masters or Commanders of Vessels bringing Mails or Overland Newspapers to Mauritius under the annexed condition.

£ 30 for any vessels touching expressly for the purpose of landing the *Overland Post office Mail*, upon proof of the vessel having sailed from the Port at which such Mail was taken on board within five days after the arrival there-of of the said mail.

£ 30 for any vessel bringing the same, upon proof of the vessel having sailed within 48 hours of the arrival of the Mail as above described.

£ 20 for any vessel upon proof of the vessel having sailed within five days of the said arrival.

And £ 10 for any vessel not conveying the last Overland Mail, but bringing an *Overland newspaper* of the latest date, not already received in the Colony, and which shall be delivered within 80 days after publication and be made public in the exchange room immediately after the arrival of the said vessel.

No. 422 of 1847.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to publish for general information and guidance, the following rules for the receipt and issue of supplies in the Commissariat department.

1. All supplies are to be received from the officers of the Commissariat department, or other servant of Government nominated to this duty, and on no account are supplies to be taken direct from the contractors.

2. All references are in like manner to be made to the officers of the Commissariat department, and no intercourse or communication is to be held by the indenting parties or their subordinates with contractors.

3. The daily supplies required for ordinary issue to the troops in Barracks and in Hospitals should be brought by the several contractors to the Commissariat stores, at an appointed hour, and be then and there inspected by an experienced warrant officer of the department, who should be specially told off to that important duty. These supplies, if approved of, should then be taken by departmental inspectors, to the several corps in garrison or cantonments, and who should remain and see the whole of the supplies weighed and issued to indenting departments.

4. Each corps should be provided with its own scales and weights, obtainable by indent on the Commissariat and the weighing and delivering of the supplies should take place at some convenient spot near the lines, and invariably in presence of the appointed officers of the regiment, and the Commissariat inspector.

5. Sealed musters of the several articles of provisions (excepting such as cannot be retained for any length of time) should be kept in charge of the Commissariat officer, and the Quarter Master, for inspection, when necessary, and with the view of deciding any disputes, which may arise respecting the quality of the supplies tendered by contractors.

6. Executive Commissariat officers should visit the spot where provisions are issued, on uncertain days, in view to ascertain by personal observation if the quality of the provisions tendered by the contracting parties is agreeably to the muster.

7. Of the several articles of medical comforts, such as Spirits, Beer, Tea, Sugar, Sagoo, Arrowroot &c. sealed musters should also be retained in charge of the Commissariat officer and the Medical officer, as a check over the contractors; but in cases where supplies are issued from the Stock in store, and have been once passed by a committee of medical officers, this precaution is unnecessary.

8. Whenever tendered articles may be considered by the warrant officer appointed to the duty of general supervision, to be inferior in quality, they should be retained in store until changed; but if this be not promptly done, the apparent inferiority of the articles should be pointed out by the inspector to the receiving party, in view to their being laid before a Regimental Committee, and should they be condemned, the contractor should be fined strictly in accordance with the terms of his engagement, and the articles obtained elsewhere at his expense, provided he does not immediately change them.

9. The inspectors should make a daily report to the warrant officer, who will furnish a written one to the commissariat officer of the correct delivery of the daily supplies, the nature of any complaints, the measures adopted to remedy them, and of every other circumstance which may have happened in connexion with these duties.

10. Should the warrant officer differ in opinion with the regimental authorities as to the quality of any article tendered, and the contractor be unwilling to supply others, a committee should be applied for, in order to avoid delay or inconvenience being experienced by the troops.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 12th of June 1847.

ACT No.—OF 1847.

An Act for regulatig Coroner's Juries.

It is hereby enacted, that on all inquests hereafter to be held by the Coroner of Calcutta, no greater

number than three Jurors shall be necessary, and that every finding of a Jury consisting of not less than three Jurors shall be to all intents and purposes as good, valid and effectual in Law as if such finding had been the finding of twelve Jurors.

11. And it is hereby enacted, that when any person shall have been duly summoned to attend as a Juror by the said Coroner of Calcutta, and shall fail or neglect to attend at the time and place specified in such summons, it shall be lawful for the said Coroner to cause such person to be openly called in his Court three times to appear and serve as a Juror, and upon the non-appearance of such person and proof that such summons has been served upon him, or left at his usual place of abode, to impose such fine upon the person, so making default, not exceeding Fifty Rupees, as to such Coroner shall seem fit, and such Coroner shall make out and sign a Certificate, containing the name and surname, the residence and trade, or calling of every person so making default, together with the amount of the fine which shall have been imposed, and the cause of such fine, and shall transmit such Certificate to one of the Magistrates of Calcutta, and shall cause a copy of such Certificate to be served upon the person so fined, by having it left at his usual place of residence, or by sending the same through the Post Office, addressed as aforesaid, and thereupon such Magistrate shall cause such fine to be levied according to the provisions of Act No. II of 1839, in the same manner as if such fine had been imposed by himself.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 12th day of August next.

Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. X. of 1847.

*An Act for amending Act XXX. of 1836.*

It is hereby enacted, that within the Territories subject to the Government of the East India Company whenever any Court not included under the provisions of Act XXIV. of 1843, shall sentence any offender to imprisonment for life under the provisions of Act XXX. of 1836, it shall at the same time sentence such offender to transportation beyond sea for life, unless there should be special reasons inducing the Court to think such prisoner not a proper subject for transportation, which special reasons the Court is hereby directed to record.
