Notice is hereby given, that by a Treasury Warrant under date 11th September 1845, among other Regulations, certain rates of British Packet Postage have been established upon all Letters, Newspapers and Prices Current, conveyed from Port to Port in the East Indies, China &c. by the new lines of Packet boats recently put in operation under the additional contract made by Her Majesty's Government, with the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company,

*These rates of Packet Postage are as follows.*

One Shilling per half ounce for letters, according to the scale of weight now in operation in the united Kingdom,

One Penny for each Newspaper, whether British, Colonial or Foreign, conveyed between any of Her Majesty's Colonies and a Foreign Port, or between any two Foreign Ports,

One Penny for each British or Colonial printed Price Current, or printed Commercial List conveyed between any of Her Majesty's Colonies.

Two Pence for each printed Price Current or printed Commercial list, whether British, Colonial or Foreign, conveyed between a British Colony and a Foreign Port or between two Foreign Ports.

British or Colonial Newspapers passing by these packets between any of Her Majesty's Colonies will not be liable to any postage for the Sea conveyance,

The prepayment of the British Packet postage on letters, is optional, when conveyed between the Indian Offices of Bombay, Aden, Calcutta, Madras, Penang & Singapore, and the Islands of Ceylon and Hongkong, or between any two of the Indian offices above enumerated; but when dispatched to a Foreign Country or Possession, such as China, Manilla &c. the above postage must be paid in advance at the Despatching Office.

The Postage chargeable on Newspapers and Prices Current and Commercial lists forwarded by these Packet Boats must in all cases be paid in advance.

The public are requested to take notice that by this Warrant, Letters &c. sent from Bombay to Point de Galle for dispatch thence to any Port in India or China, or to any of the settlements to the Eastward by the Peninsular and Oriental Company's Steamers will be liable to the above rate of British packet postage in addition to the postage at present leviable from hence to Galle; and also that when addressed to a Foreign Country or Possession the postage in question, must in all cases be paid in advance at the despatching office

The British Packet postage above referred to, will, till further notice be converted into Indian currency at the rate of two shillings the rupee.

sary General may be levied as liquidated damages for every such breach of contract as often as the same may occur.

Those who submit tenders are hereby informed, that unless favorable terms be offered, government is already prepared to carry on the boat duties with their own fixed establishment.

The tenders will be opened at the time specified in presence of the parties concerned, or of such as may be in attendance, and no reason will be assigned for the rejection of any offer, nor any will be recorded that are not accompanied with the abovementioned deposits.

The annual outlay on account of the above contract is estimated at Rupees (30,000) or thereabouts.

Whereas the Hon<sup>'</sup>ble George Russell Clerk, hath been appointed by the Honorable the Court of Directors of the East India Company to the office of Governor of Bombay and its Dependencies, it is hereby proclaimed that the Hon<sup>'</sup>ble George Russell Clerk has, on the date hereof, assumed charge of the Government of Bombay and its Dependencies, and taken the oaths and his seat under the usual Salute from the Garrison, and all persons are required to obey the said Hon<sup>'</sup>ble George Russell Clerk as Governor and President in Council accordingly.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, SEND GREETING.

Know ye that we, the said Company, reposing especial trust and confidence in the fidelity, prudence, justice and circumspection of George Russell Clerk Esquire, have nominated, made, constituted and appointed; and by these presents do nominate, make, constitute and appoint him, the said George Russell Clerk, to be Governor of the Presidency of Bombay in the East Indies, of and for all our affairs at Bombay, and in Surat, Cambay and Persia, and at all other places and for all such affairs as are now subject to the Government of, or are managed by, the said presidency of Bombay, and of all and singular the Forts, Factories, Settlements, Lands and Territories, Countries, Places and Provinces thereunto belonging, or which now are, or shall from time to time be subject to the said Presidency, and to execute all and every the powers and authorities committed, or given to the Governor of the Presidency of Bombay, by, under, or in virtue of a certain act of Parliament made and passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "an act for effecting an arrangement with the East India Company, and for the better Government of His Majesty's Indian Territories till the thirtieth day of April one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four." To take upon him, hold and enjoy the said office upon and from the time of his arrival at the said Presidency of Bombay, and to continue in the exercise of the said office during our pleasure, and until the contrary thereof shall be signified under our common seal or under the hands of thirteen or more of our Court of Directors for the time being, but subject nevertheless to such removal and dismissal as in the said act of Parliament is mentioned; and to the end that the

said George Russell Clerk, may be better enabled to order and manage all the affairs of us the said Company: we do by these presents constitute and ordain Lieutenant General Sir Thomas McMahon Baronet, Knight Commander of the Bath, and Commander of our Military Forces belonging to our Presidency of Bombay; Lestocq, Robert Reid, and John Pollard Willoughby, now Counsellors of the said Presidency, to be Counsellors of the said Presidency or settlement, for governing and managing all the said Company's affairs at the said Presidency of Bombay, and other the places aforesaid, and governing the Town and Castle of Bombay, and all other the Forts, Factories and settlements within any of the said Territories, and we do hereby give and grant unto our said Governor George Russell Clerk, and to our Council above named, full power and authority, from time to time, to rule and govern all and every our territories and servants under the said Presidency, and all the soldiers and inhabitants of our said Town and Castle of Bombay and elsewhere within the places aforesaid, to administer lawful oaths as occasion shall require, and to use and exercise all such other powers and authorities, jointly, severally and respectively, subject to all such restrictions and conditions as are given to him or them respectively, or are created by, or under or by virtue of the said Act of Parliament of His late Majesty, or by any other Act or Acts of Parliament now in force; subject nevertheless to the superintending and controlling power of the Governor General of India in Council, as by the said act of Parliament of His late Majesty is given, and also subject and according to such instructions and directions as he the said George Russell Clerk, our Governor, and the Council aforesaid shall from time to time receive under the hands of thirteen or more of our Court of Directors for the time being; and we do hereby order and require all our Servants, Officers and Soldiers, within the limits of the said Presidency, and all the people and inhabitants of our said Town and Castle of Bombay, and all other our Forts, Places and Colonies, within the said Presidency, to conform, submit and yield due obedience to the said George Russell Clerk, our Governor and his Council accordingly. And you are, to the utmost of your skill and power to do, and perform all such offices and services as appertain to the Post of Governor and Commander in Chief as aforesaid, and to hold and to take the said office unto and upon you, upon and from and after your arrival at the said Presidency of Bombay, and to continue in the exercise of the same during our pleasure, subject nevertheless to all such rules, orders and instructions, as have heretofore been given to the Governor and Commander in Chief of our said Fort and Garrison, or of our said Fort, Garrison and Town, and as are now in force, and also such other orders as you shall at any time hereafter receive in writing from our Court of Directors, or under the hands of thirteen or more of them, or from the Governor in Council of Bombay, but subject to such removal and dismissal as is mentioned in an Act made and passed in the fourth year of the reign of his late Majesty's King William the Fourth, intituled "an Act for effecting an arrangement with the East India Company and for the better government of His Majesty's Indian Territories till the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four," and we do hereby strictly require, charge, and command all Commissioned Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, Soldiers, and others belonging to our Military Forces, and all the people and inhabitants employed or residing in our said Fort, Garrison and Town to yield you as Governor and Commander in Chief as aforesaid due obedience accordingly.

Given under our common Seal, this nineteenth day of November in the tenth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.
