Tenders must specify both in words and figures the rates at which they will supply the articles embraced in each of the lists above adverted to, it being understood that the supplies to be furnished under the contracts are to be of a good and unexceptionable quality, and to be delivered to the Commissariat department, at Aden free of all

expences beyond that agreed upon, subject to the approval of the receiving authorities, and that they are to be delivered in such number or quantity as may from time to time be demanded by the Departments requiring them, during the existence of contracts.

POST OFFICE NOTICES.

Notice is hereby given, that under instructions from the Government of India, letters *posted in Bombay* cannot be received for transmission by the Government Expresses despatched hence to Calcutta and Madras on the arrival of the Overland Mails, those Expresses being specially intended for *Europe* letters and intelligence.

The following extract from the new Post office ordinance recently passed at the Mauritius, is published for general information.

ART. 22.—The following premiums shall be given to the Masters or Commanders of Vessels bringing Mails or Overland Newspapers to Mauritius under the annexed condition.

£ 30 for any vessels touching expressly for the purpose of landing the *Overland Post office Mail*, upon proof of the vessel having sailed from the Port at which such Mail was taken on board within five days after the arrival thereof of the said mail.

£ 50 for any vessel bringing the same, upon proof of the vessel having sailed within 48 hours of the arrival of the Mail as above described.

£ 20 for any vessel upon proof of the vessel having sailed within five days of the said arrival.

And £ 10 for any vessel not conveying the last Overland Mail, but bringing an *Overland newspaper* of the latest date, not already received in the Colony, and which shall be delivered within 80 days after publication and be made public in the exchange room immediately after the arrival of the said vessel.

In consequence of several complaints recently made, the Post Master General requests the attention of the public to the following extract from Clause VI. of the Post Office Rules, 30th August 1837.

"Newspapers, printed papers or parcels will not be received bearing postage, unless the sender shall give his name and address, in order that the regulated postage may be recovered from him in case of such paper or parcel being refused by the party addressed."

Parties coming to the General Post office to enquire for letters awaiting their arrival, are requested to make application to the "Dead and Unclaimed letter department" in the South wing of the building.

The following Notification by H. M. Post Master General of London, is republished for general information :

BY COMMAND OF THE POST MASTER GENERAL,
NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

GENERAL POST OFFICE, MAY 1847.

The Post Master General having been informed by the Court of Directors of the East India Company, that on and after the first June next, persons in this country may forward private correspondence by the Government Express from Bombay to Calcutta, and Madras; all persons desirous of availing themselves of this privilege will be required to mark upon the covers of their letters the words "by Express from Bombay" and in addition to this special address it will not be necessary that all letters intended to be forwarded by the way of Southampton should be so endorsed as hitherto.

The postage to be charged in India on the delivery of letters sent by this Express, will be, in addition to the ordinary inland rates.

One rupee for every letter not exceeding half a tola in weight.

Two rupees for every letter above half a tola, but not exceeding one tola in weight.

Four rupees for every letter above one tola, but not exceeding two tolas in weight, two tolas being the maximum weight of letters to be conveyed by Express.

On Newspapers.—Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage, on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rupees each will be charged, and no newspaper will be received for the Express exceeding three tolas in weight.

N. B.—One tola and a quarter is nearly equivalent to half an ounce avoirdupois.

The Parties to whom such Parcels are addressed, must send to the Post Office for them; and no Parcel will be received for despatch unless well packed, so as to secure it from wet or injury on the road.

Some English and French Newspapers &c. having been received by the last Overland Mail without address, parties missing any papers, are requested to apply at the General Post Office.

It is hereby notified for general information that the Overland Mail will be closed at this office on Friday the 15th instant at 3 o'clock P. M., an after packet will be kept open, except for prepaid letters via "Southampton" until 5 o'clock, and the usual fee of one Rupee will be charged. All letters and papers not especially superscribed by any route will be forwarded via "Marseilles" and thus be liable to the higher rates of postage.

Post office packets per P. and O. Company's Steamer "Pottinger" for Ceylon, Penang, Singapore and China, will be closed on Monday the 18th instant at 6 o'clock P. M.

BY THE HON'BLE THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

BOMBAY CASTLE, 1st OCTOBER 1847.

No. 536 of 1847.—The services of Captain, Bt. Major B. Crispin of the 16th regiment native infantry, and of Captain J. Ramsay of the 28th regiment native infantry, are placed temporarily at the disposal of His Excellency the Commander in Chief for regimental duty.

Bombay Castle, 2nd October 1847.

No. 537 of 1847.—Ensign Gilbert Pickering, of the 3rd regiment Madras light infantry, is allowed leave of absence to proceed to Hyderabad, from the 15th of October 1847, to the 15th February 1848, on private affairs.

No. 538 of 1847.—The Honorable the Governor in Council has received from His Excellency the Commander in Chief a report of the conduct of Subedar Sewchurrun, Jemedar Gungadeen and Naik Rugoonath Panday of the Scinde camel baggage corps.

It appears that a sepy of the corps, Chadir Tarlee, was driven by ill usage he experienced, and the obstruction of all his endeavors to present his complaints to the notice of his European officers, to commit suicide.

Circumstances have prevented the trial of the parties implicated, by Court Martial, but the Governor in Council feels it to be necessary to direct that for such shameful and unbecoming conduct, and neglect of duty, Subedar Sewchurn, Jemedar Gungadeen and Naik Rugoonath Panday be summarily discharged from the service.

No. 539 of 1847.—The friends of gunner David James, of the 4th troop Bombay horse artillery, having paid into the Company's treasury the sum required by the regulations for his discharge and passage to Europe, the Honorable Court of Directors have authorized his being discharged from the Company's service and provided with the usual charter party passage at the Company's expense.

No. 540 of 1847.—The Hon'ble the Governor in Council is pleased to republish the following general orders by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council.

GENERAL ORDERS

BY THE HON'BLE THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL OF INDIA IN COUNCIL.

Fort William, 3d September 1847.

No. 263 of 1847.

No. 226 of 1835.

General orders by the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India in Council.

Fort William, 19th October 1835.

The following paragraphs of a Military letter, No. 45, from the Honorable the Court of Directors to the Governor of the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal, under date the 20th May 1835, are published for the information and guidance of all parties concerned :

Para. 1. With reference to our orders, dated the 8th December 1824, we direct that you relinquish your present practice of drawing bills upon us on account of the family remittances of non-commissioned officers and soldiers of King's regiments, and also of the effects of deceased officers and soldiers of His Majesty's regiments in India, and that you adopt the preferable plan of sending us quarterly rolls of the sums paid into your Treasury on the above accounts by the King's service, as you already are in the habit of doing in the case of payments on similar accounts by the Company's service.

2. We further direct that in future the family remittances made through our Treasury by officers and soldiers of His Majesty's service, be accounted for separately, and that a distinct roll of the remittances from each King's regiment be drawn out and forwarded to us, with the name of the regimental agent, to whom the amount of the roll is to be paid in this country."

In furtherance of instructions from the Hon'ble the Court of Directors, and with reference to the G.O. G. G. No. 226, of the 19th Oct. 1835, quoted in the margin, the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council, with the concurrence of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General, is pleased to direct that the practice of remitting funds by bills on the Hon'ble Court to Europe, as respects both the Royal and the East India Company's Army, shall be discontinued at all the Presidencies, and that in supercession of such practice in future, all remittances whether on account of soldier's necessaries, of fees on Commissions, of the effects and credits of deceased officers and soldiers, of soldiers' libraries (vide G. O. No. 107 of the 19th March 1847), or of family remittances, be included in the quarterly general remittance roll of each Presidency, prepared in the department of accounts.

BY THE HON'BLE THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL OF INDIA IN COUNCIL.

Fort William, 3d September 1847.

No. 264 OF 1847.

In continuation of Government general orders, No. 166 of the 19th June 1846, directing the purchase money of discharged soldiers from Her Majesty's service to be credited to the Company's government, it is notified that effects and credits of deserters from Queen's regiments are likewise to be credited to the East India Company, on whom falls the expense of supplying the place equally of deserters as of soldiers purchasing their discharge. No remittance, therefore, on this account is to be made to the Secretary at War, in future, but the amount is to be made over by regimental pay masters to the pay master to the Queen's troops at Calcutta : and pay masters of regiments serving under the governments of Madras and Bombay are to forward all sums on this account to the pay master of the division in which the remitter may be located, or to such other authorities as the governments of those Presidencies may direct, to be brought on the public accounts to credit of "charges military."

The following Act is passed by the Hon'ble the President of the Council of India in Council on the 11th day of September 1847, with the assent of the Right Hon'ble the Governor General of India, which has been read and recorded.

Ordered, that the Act be promulgated for general information.

ACT No. XV. OF 1847.

An Act for the Survey of Lands in the Town of Calcutta, within the Local limits of the Jurisdiction of Her Majesty's Supreme Court of Judicature.

Whereas it is expedient that a correct survey should be made of all lands in the Town of Calcutta within the local limits of Her Majesty's Supreme Court of Judicature :

It is therefore hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of Bengal to appoint an Officer to survey the lands situate within the said local limits, and such officer shall proceed to survey the same and to register the names of the owners and occupiers thereof as far as they can be ascertained, and such officer shall, by public notification, invite all persons owning or occupying lands and tenements within the said local limits to appear before him in person or by duly constituted attorney at whatever place within the said limits his office may be held, and to bring with him all Pot-books, Ground Rent Bills, Bills of sale, or other writings requisite for the ascertainment of the past and present boundaries of such lands.

II. And it is hereby enacted, that the said officer shall for the purposes of this act have full power and authority at all reasonable hours in the day time to enter or to direct his subordinate officers to enter into, and upon any land or tenement within the said local limits, and in and upon the land on which any house, building or other erection is built or building, or intended to be built, and into and upon any buildings or any part thereof without being liable to any action at law or suit in Equity, or any other legal proceedings or molestation whatsoever for, or on account of such entry into, or of any thing done or to be done in any part thereof in pursuance of this Act. Provided, that such officer or subordinate officers shall not enter upon any lands or tenements which may be occupied at the time unless with the consent of the occupier thereof, without previously giving the said occupier reasonable notice of his or their intention to do so. Provided also, that if any action shall be commenced in the Supreme Court against any such officer or subordinate officer for any entry made or other thing done under the authority of, or in pursuance of this Act, it shall be lawful for him or them to plead the general issue and to give the special matter in evidence.

III. And it is hereby enacted, that if any person at any time shall obstruct or molest the said officer or any of his subordinate officers in the performance and execution of his or their duty, or any thing which they are required to do by, or by virtue or in consequence of this Act, every such person so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanour and shall on conviction before a Magistrate for the Town of Calcutta forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding 200 Rupees.

IV. And whereas such notification as is directed by Section I of this Act, may not in all cases be effectual, it is therefore hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the surveying officer to cause any person owning or occupying lands or tenements within the said local limits, or his agents or representatives, to be served with a special notice under his official seal and signature, stating the purpose for which the attendance of such person is required, and any document essential for the purposes of this Act which such person is to bring with him and the period within which such person is to attend, and if such person cannot be found he notice shall be affixed to his usual place of residence if that be within the said local limits, or if not, then on the premises to be surveyed. Provided always, that no person shall be required to produce any Title Deed which such person may object to produce.

V. And it is hereby enacted, that for any investigation connected with the purposes of this Act it shall be lawful for the surveying officer by writing under his hand to summon any person whatsoever to attend as a

witness at a time and place to be specified in such Summons, and that every witness so duly summoned to attend as aforesaid, who shall not attend, or who attending shall refuse to give evidence on oath or solemn affirmation or declaration, or to answer all such questions as the surveying officer may legally demand shall be liable to be attached in the Supreme Court upon complaint made, in like manner as if such witness had neglected to attend on any trial in such Supreme Court.

VI. And it is hereby enacted, that any witness examined before such surveying officer shall be examined upon oath, which such Surveying Officer is hereby authorized to administer. Provided always, that in all cases wherein a solemn declaration or affirmation would be allowed in Her Majesty's Courts of Judicature to be substituted for an oath, the said surveying officer shall substitute such solemn declaration or affirmation for an oath.

VII. And it is hereby enacted, that any witness wilfully and knowingly giving false testimony on oath or solemn declaration or affirmation before such surveying officer shall be deemed guilty of wilful and corrupt perjury.
