GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

Public order

To regulate the religious procession of the Mohurrum, and for the preservation of the public peace during that festival, sanctioned by the Honorable the Governor in Council, as provided for by Rule, Ordinance, and Regulation II. A. D. 1827.

1st.—Every person desirous of erecting or carrying about a *Taboot*, *Punjia* or *Dholeeka Punjia*, at the ensuing Mohurrum, must obtain a license from the Magistrates of Police; and a license will be granted to no persons except Mussulmans.

2nd.—The licenses shall bear the signatures of the Magistrates of Police, and all persons obtaining them shall be bound to produce them when demanded by any authority having a right so to do, any refusal to do so shall be held to be a breach of these rules.

3rd.—Each *Taboot* is to have but one set of "Tassa," one set of "Dholee," one "Kurnah" and fifteen "Hillals."

4th.—Any person who may be seen carrying a Sword, Dirk, Bludgeon, or other offensive weapon, will be taken into custody.

5th.—*Taboots* meeting on the public road, are to give way to one another in the same manner that carriages do, each *Taboot* keeping to the left.

6th.—*Taboots* are not permitted to go abreast on the public road, but they are to follow each other in a peaceable manner.

7th.—No *Taboots* are allowed to go in procession on the last night of the Mohurrum before 12 o'clock, or to continue so after 3 o'clock on the following morning. These processions are limited (on the last night and day of the Mohurrum) to the Bhandi Bazar road, Duncan road, Chinch Bunder and Market Streets; and *Taboots* are not to be taken out on the last day before 12 o'clock, and on meeting carriages, and horsemen, are strictly enjoined to cease playing country music, until they shall have passed the *Taboots*, keeping the left side of the road; and it is directed, that they be thrown into the sea, and the ceremony concluding by 5 o'clock P. M.

8th.—No procession of the Zool Junnah or Horse, through the public streets or roads, will be permitted.

9th.—All persons licensed to sell Spirituous liquors, and all venders of Opium and Blang, are enjoined to keep their shops closed; and persons found selling any thing of an intoxicating nature, during the aforesaid period, will be taken into custody and punished.

10th.—Any persons violating any of the above rules, or behaving in any manner likely to create a breach of the peace, or making a disturbance of any kind, will be immediately taken into custody and dealt with according to law.

Is hereby given, that persons desirous of entering into a contract for supplying Spirits rectified, or Spirits of Wine of country manufacture, to this department for one year, from the 15th day of January next, may, on application at this office from 10 A. Verbal offers for the contract will be received at this office at 2 o'clock on Monday the 3rd proximo, when persons will be required to bid a per centage above or below the price specified in the list above adverted to, on the understanding that the article to be supplied under this contract is to be of the very best description and quality, and must correspond with the musters lodged in this office, or be of the exact kind or sort demanded, free of all expences, in such quantities as may from time to time be demanded, and that the same will be liable to examination, and rejection if disapproved by a committee of officers appointed on the part of Government.

The contractor will be required to sign and seal a contract to the above effect, and to comply immediately with all demands extraordinary or emergent for the article included in the list above adverted to, and others of less urgency within the periods stated in the requisitions made upon him, in failure whereof, the article in such quantity as may be required in lieu, will be purchased at his risk and loss, and that in all such cases an advance of (30) thirty per cent upon the amount of expences incurred, or a fine of Rupees (50) at the option of the executive officer may be levied as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of contract as often as the same may occur, also the contract may in all such cases be put an end to on the part of the East India Company.

No person will be allowed to bid for the contract unless he previously deposits the sum of Rupees (52) fifty-two in cash, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion, or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract; Should his offer be accepted, he must be prepared to give an unexceptionable bonded security to the extent of Rupees (205) two hundred and five, to be held by Government as security for the due performance of his contract.

The amount of retrenchments made by the Military Board on the contractor's bills will be recovered from the first bills preferred for payment by the contractors, but in the event of such retrenchments being subsequently removed, the amount thereof will be refunded to them.

The annual outlay of the above contract is estimated at Rupees 1021 or thereabouts. All further particulars will be communicated at the time of bidding, and no reason will be assigned for the rejection of any offer.

Small Cause Court.

Whereas the Charter of Justice empowers the Judges in any suit to be brought in this Court to award and order such costs to be paid by any or either of the parties to the other or others as the Court shall think just,

And whereas justice requires that the party who has been forced to prosecute or defend a suit should be allowed all the necessary costs sustained by him in support of his rights,

And whereas it is the duty of the Court to decide what costs are necessary and to prevent the party who is condemned in costs from being burdened with any more than are necessary for the attainment of justice,

And whereas the late extension of the Jurisdiction of the Small Cause Court requires some new rules to be laid down by which the above principles may be put in force.

It is hereby ordered, that in all suits brought in the Small Cause Court, when costs are granted at the trial, the master shall tax the costs as between party and party on the following scale.

1. In simple cases, whatever be the amount recovered, the costs mentioned in table 1.

2. In cases involving a complicated state of law or facts, the costs mentioned in Table 2, if the Judge makes order to that effect.

3. In cases which would justify the employment of two Counsel if the cause were tried in the full Court, or where the cause in the opinion of the Court has been properly removed to the full Court, the costs mentioned in Table 3, if the Judge makes an order to that effect.

4. The Clerk of the Court shall include the costs of the Attorney and Counsel, if any, in his bill of the costs of the cause, and the Master shall thereupon proceed to tax the same forthwith according to the present practice.

5. The master shall be entitled, as at present, to a fee of two Rupees for taxing all bills of costs of the Clerk of the Small Causes, and to a fee of four Rupees for taxing each bill of costs of any Attorney practising in the said Court, but no warrant shall be taken out to tax the same nor shall the Master be required to register any such bill, otherwise than by entering in a book to be kept for that purpose, the title of the cause, the amount of the costs, the sum at which they are taxed, the date of taxation with the name of the Attorney or Attorneys conducting the cause.

£ 20 for any vessel upon proof of the vessel having sailed within five days of the said arrival.

And £ 10 for any vessel not conveying the last Overland Mail, but bringing an *Overland newspaper* of the latest date, not already received in the Colony, and which shall be delivered within 80 days after publication and be made public in the exchange room immediately after the arrival of the said vessel.

The Post Master General having been informed by the Court of Directors of the East India Company, that on and after the first June next, persons in this country may forward private correspondence by the Government Express from Bombay to Calcutta, and Madras; all persons desirous of availing themselves of this privilege will be required to mark upon the covers of their letters the words "by Express from Bombay" and in addition to this special address it will not be necessary that all letters intended to be forwarded by the way of Southampton should be so endorsed as hitherto.

The postage to be charged in India on the delivery of letters sent by this Express, will be, in addition to the ordinary inland rates.

One rupee for every letter not exceeding half a tola in weight.

Two rupees for every letter above half a tola, but not exceeding one tola in weight.

Four rupees for every letter above one tola, but not exceeding two tolas in weight, two tolas being the maximum weight of letters to be conveyed by Express.

On Newspapers.—Each newspaper office in Calcutta and Madras will be allowed to receive two newspapers at the ordinary rates of Inland postage, on all other newspapers forwarded by Express, a postage of five rupees each will be charged, and no newspaper will be received for the Express exceeding three tolas in weight.

N. B.—One tola and a quarter is nearly equivalent to half an ounce avoirdupois.
