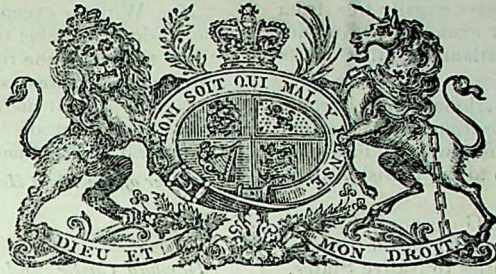

When official notifications from the Government are inserted in the BOMBAY GOVERNMENT GAZETTE, no communication on the same subject will be made in writing to any department concerned; but all public officers are required to take notice of such official notifications in the same manner as if they had been directly communicated to them by letter from the Secretary's office, and as heads of offices alone will be furnished by Government with the BOMBAY GOVERNMENT GAZETTE, they will be expected to communicate to their subordinate officers all orders which may in any manner concern them.

The Bombay Government Gazettes furnished by Government to public offices are to be lodged with the records, and are not to be removed from the office.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS TO THE PUBLIC.

TERRITORIAL DEPARTMENT, REVENUE.

Notice is hereby given, that from and after the 1st July next, Passes for the Free Transit of Malwa Opium to Bombay will be granted on application to the Commissioner of Customs, Salt, and Opium at Bombay, or to the Resident and Opium Agent in Malwa, on payment of Rupees Five Hundred (500) per chest of 140 lbs. weight.

2. Passes will be granted for Maunds instead of Chests should it be desired, but in no case will a Pass be given for less than 15 Maunds, or Five Chests.

3. Passes obtained at Bombay will not be given open to the persons taking them out, but enclosed in a Sealed Letter of Advice to the Opium Agent in Malwa, who will countersign each Pass before the Opium is despatched. Persons taking out Passes for Malwa Opium that may have left that Province will be required to satisfy the local authorities in whose District the drug may first arrive, that it is the actual produce of Malwa, and in the event of its proving otherwise, the same will be confiscated and the Pass-money forfeited.

4. No duties will be exacted on account of His Majesty's Government on Opium protected by Passes; it will, however, be liable, should occasion require, to examination when in transit, and also on its arrival at Bombay, with the view of ascertaining that the quantity corresponds with that specified in the Pass, but there will be no detention or obstruction by the Officers of Government, beyond what may be necessary for the diligent prevention of any Opium being conveyed into the territories subordinate to this Presidency.

5. The owners of the Opium will have to make their own arrangements for its transport. The despatches will be accompanied by one or more Chuprasses or Peons, as the Resident and the Opium Agent in Malwa shall consider advisable, but the providing of escorts for the protection of the drug will rest with the owners, and Government will not be answerable for any casualties that may befall the same.

6. It is left to the option of persons taking out Passes to pay at the rate of Rupees Seventeen (17) per chest, in commutation of all Customs and Duties that may be due to the Native States through whose Territories the Opium is conveyed,

or to pay those duties themselves. Opium, for which this commutation money may have been paid, should be allowed to pass equally free from Customs and Duties whether examined at, and despatched from, Indore or Ratlam, or other marts in Malwa.

7. Persons residing at Ahmedabad, Baroda, Surat, or other places desirous of exporting Malwa Opium under a Pass, will be furnished with the same on application to the British Authorities resident at such places.

8. The Right Honorable the Governor in Council guarantees that the price to be paid for the Passes, and in commutation of the Duties to Native States, shall continue as now fixed, to the 1st July 1860; but the guarantee here given will not debar the Government from continuing to grant Passes after the expiration of this period, should it think fit to do so, without a further proclamation.

9. For the convenience of individuals, deposits of Government Paper will be received on account of sums payable for the Passes and Duties specified in Articles 1st and 6th, interest being payable to Government on the same, until redeemed, at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum; and the deposit should be redeemed on or before the arrival of the drug at Bombay, from which period the charge on account of interest will be doubled.

10. Hoondies may be received by the Opium Agent in Malwa for Passes taken out there, payable to the Commissioner of Customs, Salt, and Opium, at Bombay within six days after sight; if not redeemed within that period, a deposit of Government Paper, or substantial security must be given by the parties concerned, interest being charged at the rate of 5 per cent. until the arrival of the Opium, which will be detained until payment be made. If security be not forthwith produced, the Hoondies will be returned as dishonoured; and the Opium seized on its arrival.

11. The holders of Passes are to take the Opium to Indore, Ratlam, or any other place in Malwa, that may suit the wishes and convenience of both parties, to be weighed by persons who will be appointed by the Opium Agent in Malwa to perform that duty.

12. Fifteen days' notice must be given to the Opium Agent in Malwa, or his Assistant, by all persons about to make exportations under Licenses previously to the production of the Opium at the place of weighment, in order that he may be better prepared to receive, weigh, and despatch it.

13. Only one despatch will be allowed under a Pass or License, which despatch may, or may not, at the option of the holder of the Pass, be to the full quantity mentioned in it; but if a smaller quantity be exported, no drawback or refund from the sum paid for the Pass will be allowed on account of such deficiency, excepting in the case of parties taking out Passes at Bombay, who will be allowed a refund on account of such deficiency, on a report thereof being made to this Government by the Opium Agent in Malwa; but in the event of the actual despatch containing a greater quantity of Opium than that for which the Pass was taken out, such excess shall be paid for at the rate specified in the 1st article of this Notification, and shall, by way of security for payment, be liable to detention by the Commissioner of Customs at Bombay until paid for.

14. In weighing the Opium an allowance of

three pounds will be allowed for each Chest of 140 lbs. on account of leafage and dustage.

15. With the exception contained in Article 8th, the Right Honorable the Governor in Council reserves to himself the right to adopt, from time to time, such measures as he may conceive to be necessary to prevent the illicit trade in Opium, and to secure the object of Government in sanctioning the present arrangement.

जाहिरनामा ऐसा जे तारिख १ ली जुलई सन १८५९ पासून माळवी अफीण जकात माफिने मुंबईस आणण्याकरितां मुंबई येथील जकात व मोठ व अफीणीचे कमिशनर साहेब किंवा माळवा येथील रसिडेंट व अफीणीचे एजेंट साहेब यांजपासीं अर्ज करून १४० रत्नाचे दर पेटीस रुपये ५०० पांचसें दिल्ले म्हणजे ते साहेब दस्तकें देतील.

२. पेटीचे बदला मणाचे वजनाने दस्तकें मागीतलीं असतां देतील परंतु १५ मणाहून किंवा ५ पेटीहून कमी अफीणीचीं दस्तकें देणार नाहींत.

३. जे लोक मुंबई येथे दस्तकें घेतील त्यांस मुंबई येथे उघडी देणार नाहींत परंतु माळवा येथील अफीणीचे एजेंट साहेब यांस पत्र लिहून त्या पत्रांत तीं दस्तकें भिडून व त्या पत्रावर मोहर करून त्यांस देतील आणि अफीणीचे एजेंट साहेब अफीण रवाना होण्याचे पूर्वीं हरएक दस्तकावर सही करतील माळवी अफीण जी माळव्याहून निघाली असेल त्या अफीणीचीं जे लोक दस्तकें घेतील त्याणीं ती अफीण पहिल्याने ज्या जिल्ह्यांत दाखल होईल त्या जिल्ह्यांतील अमलदाराची खातरी केली पाहिजे कीं ती अफीण माळव्यांतच उत्पन्न झालेली आहे परंतु ती अफीण माळव्यांत उत्पन्न न झाली असें साबित झाल्यावर त्या अफीणीची जती होईल व दस्तकाचा पैका दिला असेल तो सरकार दाखल होईल.

४. ज्या अफीणीबारावर दस्तकें असतील त्या अफीणीवर मलीका माअझमा सरकारची जकात वेणार नाहींत मार्गीत व मुंबईस आल्यावर दस्तकांत लिहिल्याप्रमाणे अफीण आहे किंवा नाहीं याची चौकसी करण्या करितां कारण पडल्यास अफीण तपासतील परंतु जंजिरे मुंबई सिवाय मुंबई इलाख्यांतील मुलकांत अफीण न जावी याजकरितां जो खोळवा व अटकाव करणे जरूर आहे त्याहून अधिक खोळवा किंवा अटकाव सरकारचे आमलदाराकडून होणार नाहीं.

५. मालधन्यानी अफीण पाठविण्याची तजवीज स्वतः ठेवावी व माळवा येथील रसिडेंट साहेब व अफीणीचे एजेंट साहेब यांचे योग्य नजरेस येईल त्या प्रमाणे एक अथवा अधिक चपरासी किंवा सिपाई अफीण रवाना होईल त्या बारावर देतील; परंतु अफीणीचे रखवाली करितां सिव्दी वगैरे देणे हें मालधन्याकडे आहे व अफीणीस जोखीम झाल्यास त्याचा जाबसाल सरकार करणार नाहीं.

६. जे लोक दस्तकें घेतील त्याणीं राजे रजवाडे यांचे मुलकाहून अफीण आणतील त्याची जकात व गैरे बाबती याचयाच्या त्या बदल दर पेटीस रुपये १७ याचे अथवा

सदहू जकात वगैरे बाबती आपण स्वतः द्याव्या हें त्यांचे खुशीवर आहे सदहू जकात वगैरे बाबतीबद्दल ऐवज ज्या अफिणीचा दिव्हा असेल ती अफीण इंदुराहून अथवा रतलामाहून अथवा माळव्यातील दुसरे कोणतेही ठिकाणी तपासून रवाना झाली असेल ती सदहू प्रमाणे जकात माफिने जाऊ देतील.

७. अमदावाद व बडोदे व सुरत व इतर ठिकाणी जे लोक राहातात त्यांची इच्छा दस्तक घेऊन माळवी अफीण पाठविण्याची असल्यास त्याणी त्या ठिकाणी जे अधिकारी साहेब आहेत त्यांजवळ अर्ज केला असता त्यांस दस्तक मिळतील.

८. दस्तकाबद्दल व राजेरजवाडे यांजकडील जकात वगैरे बाबतीबद्दल ऐवज देण्याचा दर हल्ली ठरविला आहे तो तारीख १ ली जुलई सन १८६० पर्यंत चालविण्याविषयी आनराबल गवरनर इन कौंसिल यांचा जिमा आहे. परंतु ती मुदत पुरी झाल्यावर सरकारास योग्य दिसेल तर पुन्हा जाहिरनामा न करितां दस्तक देण्यास सरकारास सदहू जिमा घेतल्यावरून आटकाव नाही.

९. पहिले व साहेब कलमांत दस्तकाचा व जकातीचा ऐवज लिहिला आहे त्या बद्दल लोकांस सोईवार पडण्यासाठीं सरकारी नोटी अमानत घेण्यांत येतील व नोटी सोडवून नेतील त्या तारिखेपर्यंत सरकारांत दर शेकडा टक्के ५ प्रमाणे दर साल व्याज द्यावे लागेल व नोटी अमानत ठेवितील त्या मुंबईस अफीण आल्यावर अथवा आल्याचे पूर्वी सोडवून न्याव्या नाहीतर मुंबईस अफीण आल्यादिवसापासून पुढे दुप्पट व्याज द्यावे लागेल.

१०. माळवा येथे जी अफिणीची दस्तक घेतील त्या ऐवजीं मुंबई येथील जकात व माठ व अफिणीचे कमिशनर साहेब यांचे नावे साहा दिवसांचे मुदतीच्या हुंड्या दिल्या असतां माळवा येथील अफिणीचे एजेंट साहेब घेतील. परंतु त्या मुदतीच्याआंत त्या हुंड्याचा ऐवज न दिल्यास सरकारी नोटी अथवा दुसरे काही मजबूद तारण ज्या लोकांनी दस्तक घेतली असतील त्याणी ठेवावे व अफीण येऊन पोहचेल तो पर्यंत त्या ऐवजाचे दर शेकडा टक्के ५ प्रमाणे व्याज घेतील व ते अफीण आल्यानंतर ऐवजाचा उलगडा होई तो पर्यंत अफीण अटकावून ठेवितील. तारण तुलें ठेविलें नाहीतर हुंड्या परत करितील व अफीण आली म्हणजे जप्त करितील.

११. माळवा येथील अफिणीचे एजेंट साहेब ज्या लोकांस तोलण्याचे काम सांगतील त्यांजकडे दस्तकाव्यानी इंदूर येथे अथवा रतलाम येथे अथवा माळवा येथील हर कोणते दुसरे ठिकाणी त्या उभयतांचे खुबीस येईल व सोईस पडेल तेथे अफीण तोलावयास न्यावी.

१२. अफीण घेऊन तोलून पाठविण्याकरितां माळवा येथील अफिणीचे एजेंट साहेब याणी चांगली तयारी करून ठेविली पाहिजे म्हणून ज्या लोकांस दस्तक घेऊन अफीण वाहिर न्यावयाची असेल त्या सर्वांनी तोलावयाचे जाग्यावर अफीण नेण्याचे पूर्वी त्या एजेंट साहेबांस किंवा त्यांचे असिस्टंटस पंधरा दिवस आगोघर खबर द्यावी.

१३. एक दस्तक घेतलें तर एकदाच अफीण जाऊ देतील ती अफीण दस्तकांत लिहिली असेल तितकी असो अगर नसो ती दस्तकाव्याची खुबी परंतु दस्तकांत लिहिल्या पेक्षा कमती अफीण पाठविली तत्रापि कमती अफीण म्हणून दस्तकाचा ऐवज कमी पडणार नाही परंतु जे लोक

दस्तक मुंबईहून घेतील त्यांस कमती अफीणीबद्दल दस्तकाचे ऐवजा पेक्षा माळवा येथील अफिणीचे एजेंट साहेब याणी सरकारास रपोट केल्यावर ऐवज परत मिळेल. परंतु जितक्या अफिणीचे दस्तक घेतलें असेल त्यापेक्षा अधिक अफीण पाठविली तर त्या अधिक अफिणीचा ऐवज या जाहिरनाम्याचे पहिले कलमांत दर लिहिला आहे त्या दराने द्यावा लागेल व तो ऐवज देत तोपर्यंत तो अधिक अफीण तारणाबद्दल मुंबई येथील जकातीचे कमिशनर साहेब अटकावून ठेवितील.

१४. अफीण तोलताना १४० रतलाचे दर पेटीस पाने व धुळिवदल ३ रतल मजुरा देतील.

१५. आठवे कलमांत लिहिलें आहे तें खेरीज करून चोरी छुपेने अफिणीचा व्यापार न व्हावा व हल्लीं सरकारांतून बंदोबस्त केला आहे तो मजबूद चालविण्याकरितां जी तजवीज व बंदोबस्त हरवखत ठेवावा लागेल तो आनराबल गवरनर कौंसिल यांचे नजरेस येईल त्याप्रमाणे ठेवितील हा अखत्यार आनराबल गवरनर इन कौंसिल यांजकडे आहे.

बमोजिबे हुकुम बंदिगान अलीनवाब मुस्तताब हजरत रैट आनराबल गवरनर साहेब वाहादुर दर इजलास कौंसिल.

२. पेटीने अदले मलुने वराने परवाना मांगरो तो तेहेने आपरो पलु पंदर मलुथी अथवा पांय पेटीथी कुमती अशीलुना परवाना आपरो नहीं.

३. ने लोको मुंजधमां परवाना खरो तेहेने मुंजधमिधे परवाना खुला आपरो नहीं पलु मालवाना अशीलुना मेनन्त साहेमने कागण लप्पी ते कागणमां ते परवाना पीटीने तेडपर मोहोर कुरीने तेहेने आपरो तथा मेनन्त साहेम अशीलु रवाने थम्पानी अगाड हरेक परवाना डपर शडी कररो. मालवी अशीलु ने मालवामांथी नीकधुं हरो ते अशीलुना ने लोको परवाना खरो तेम्पामे ते अशीलु पेहेकांथी ने लुलामांथी दापल थारो ते लुला माहेला अंमलदरनी पातरनमा कुरी नेमे डे ते अशीलु मालवामांन पेदा थड. पलु ते अशीलु मालवामां पेदा नहीं थड मेहेरुं शायेत थम्पानी ते अशीलु नम थरो अने परवानाना पधरिआ आपा हरो ते सरकार दापल थारो.

४. ने अशीलुनाशाये परवाना हरो ते अशीलुनी मदीका मात्मानमा सरकारनी नकात खरो नहीं. रस्तामां तथा मुंजध आपा पधी परवानामां लप्पी प्रमालु अशीलु

છેકે નહીં તેની ચોકસી કરવાસાર જરૂર પડે તો અશીલુ તપાસારો પણ જાણે મુંબઈ શિવાએ મુંબઈ ઇલાકાના મુલકમાં અશીલુ ન જાએ તે સાર જે વિલંબ તથા અટકાવ કરવો જરૂર છે તેથી વધારે વિલંબ તથા અટકાવ સરકારના અમલદાર કરશે નહીં.

૫. માલધણીએ અશીલુ મોકલવાની પોતે તજવીજ રાખવી અને માલવાના રસીડે તથા અશીલુના એજન્ટ સાહેબને મુનારામ નજર આવશે તે પ્રમાણે એક અથવા અધિક અપરાસી અથવા સિપાઈ અશીલુ રવાને થારો તેની સાથે આપશે. પણ અશીલુની રખેવાલીસાર સીરખંદી વગેરે આપવી એ માલધણીની તરફ છે અને અશીલુને જોખમ લાગશે તેનો જવાબ સરકાર આપશે નહીં.

૬. જે લોકો પરવાના લેશે તેઓએ રાજ રજવાડાના મુલકમાંથી અશીલુ લાવશે તેની જગત વગેરે દસ્તુરી આપવાની તેને બદલે દર પેટીએ કે રૂપિયા ૧૭ આપવા અથવા પોતે પોતાની મેળે તેની જગત વગેરે દસ્તુરી આપે એ તેની પુસી ઉપર છે. ઉપર લખેલી જગત વગેરે દસ્તુરી બદલ એવેજ જે અશીલુનો આપો હશે તે અશીલુ ઈનદોર અથવા રતલાંમથી અથવા માલવા મહિલા હરકોઈ ડેકાણેથી તપાસીને રવાને કરે હશે તે ઉપર લખ્યા પ્રમાણે જગત માણીથી જવા દેશે.

૭. એહેમદાબાદ તથા વડોદરા તથા સુરત તથા ખીજ જગોએ જે લોક રહે છે તેઓની પરવાના લઈને માલવી અશીલુ મોકલવાની ઇચ્છા હોએ તો તેઓએ તે ડેકાણે જે અંમલદાર સાહેબ છે તેહની પાસે માંગશે તો તે લોકોને પરવાના મળશે.

૮. પરવાનાખાખત તથા રાજ રજવાડાની જગત વગેરે દસ્તુરીખાખત એવેજ આપવાનો દર હાલ ઠરાવે છે તે તારીખ ૧ માહે જુલઈ રાને ૧૮૬૦ શુધી ચલાવવાખાખત આનરાખલ ગવરનર કૌંસિલનો જુઓ છે પણ તે મુદત પુરી થયા પછી સરકાર મુનારામ જાણશે તો ફરી જાહેરનાંચુ કરાવીના ઉપર લખેલો જુઓ લીધાથી પરવાના આપવાને સરકારને કાંઈ અટકાવ થારો નહીં.

૯. પેહેલી તથા છઠી કલમમાં પરવાનાનો તથા જગતનો એવેજ લખે છે તેખાખત લોકોને મુંબઈ પડવાસાર સરકારી નોટો અનામત લેશે તે નોટો જાણવી લેશે તે તારીખસુધી સરકારમાં રોકે ટકા પાંચ પરમાણે દરરાલને હીસાખે વીઆજ આપવું પડશે ને તે નોટો અનામત મુકશે તે મુંબઈમાં અશીલુ આવાપછી અથવા આવા અગાઉ જાણવી લેવી નહીં તો મુંબઈમાં અશીલુ આવે તે દીવસથી આગળ બમણું વીઆજ આપવું પડશે.

૧૦. માલવામાં જે અશીલુના પરવાના લેશે તેના એવેજમાં મુંબઈના જગત તથા મીઠું તથા અશીલુના કમીરાનર સાહેબના નામની દીન ૬ની મુદતની હુંડીઓ આપશે તો માલવા માહેલા અશીલુના એજન્ટ સાહેબ લેશે. પણ તે મુદતમાં તે હુંડીનો એવેજ નહીં આપે તો સરકારી નોટો અથવા ખીજું કાંઈ મળ્યુત તારણુ જે લોકોએ અશીલુના પરવાના લીધા હશે તેણે મુકવું તથા અશીલુ આવી પોહોચે તાંહસુધી તે એવેજનું દર રોકે ટકા પાંચ પરમાણે વીઆજ લેશે અને તે અશીલુ આવા પછી એ એવેજનો ફૂંચો કરે તાંહસુધી તે અશીલુ અટકાવી રાખશે ને ઉપર લખેલું તારણુ તરત નહીં આપશે તો તે હુંડીઓ પાછી ફેરવશે અને અશીલુ આવશે તેને જપત કરી રાખશે.

૧૧. માલવાના અશીલુના એજન્ટ સાહેબ જે લોકોને તોલવાનું કાંમ શોખરો તેની પાસે પરવાનાવાલાઓએ ધનદેરમાં અથવા રતલાંમમાં અથવા માલવામધેના હરકોઈ ખીજે ડેકાણે તે ખંતોની પુરીમાં આવશે તથા મુંબઈ પડશે તાંહાં અશીલુ તોલવાસાર લઈ જવું.

૧૨. અશીલુ લઈને તોલને મોકલવાસાર માલવાના એજન્ટ સાહેબે સારી તઈઆરી રાખવી જોઈએ માટે જે લોકોને પરવાના લઈને અશીલુ બાહાર લઈ જવાનું હશે તે સધળાઓએ તોલવાની જગાઉપર અશીલુ લઈગયા પેહેલાં જે એજન્ટ સાહેબને અથવા તેના આસિસ્ટન્ટ સાહેબને પંદર દીવસ અગાઉ ખખર કરવી.

૧૩. એક પરવાનો લીધા તો એકવાર અશીલુ લઈ જવા દેશે તે અશીલુ પરવાનામાં લખ્યું છે તેટલું હોએ અગર ન હોએ તે પરવાનાવાલાની પુરી; પણ પરવાનામાં લખ્યા કરતાં કમી અશીલુ મોકલું તો પણ કમી અશીલુ માટે પરવાનાનો એવેજ કમી પડશે નહીં પણ જે લોકો પરવાના મુંબઈમાંથી લેશે તેઓને અશીલુ ખાખત પરવાનાના એવેજમાંથી માલવાના અશીલુના એજન્ટ સાહેબે સરકારને રપોટ કરાઉપરથી એવેજ પાછો મલશે પણ જેટલાં અશીલુનો પરવાનો લીધોહશે તે કરતાં વધારે અશીલુ મોકલું તો તે વધારે અશીલુનો એવેજ આ જાહેરનાંમાંની પેહેલી કલમમાં દર લખે છે તે દર પરમાણે આપવો પડશે; અને તે એવેજ આપે તાંહસુધી તે વધારે અશીલુ તારણુને બદલે મુંબઈના જગતના કમીરાનર સાહેબ અટકાવી રાખશે.

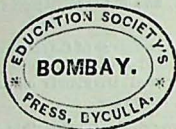

Hours of Posting.—**BANGHY PARCELS** will, from and after the 1st February 1859, be received every day, Sundays excepted, for despatch, from 10 A. M. till 5 P. M., and **LETTERS** and **NEWSPAPERS** every day till 6 P. M., after which hours respectively Late Letters, Newspapers, or Parcels will be received till 7 P. M., on payment of an extra postage (or fee) of 8 annas on each cover. The full postage, and likewise the fee, must be prepaid in Stamps. **REGISTERED LETTERS** can be posted as heretofore, but the Prepayment of Postage is no longer optional. The Postage, as well as the Registration Fee of 4 annas, must be Prepaid in Stamps.

Malta and Gibraltar.—Letters for **MALTA** and **GIBALTAR** may be prepaid or not, at the option of the sender.

Cairo.—Letters for **Cairo** must be **PREPAID**, but cannot be Registered.

Compulsory Prepayment of Letters to the United Kingdom.—From the 1st of September next the present system of *optional* Prepayment of Letters sent from India to the United Kingdom will be abolished, and from that date the Prepayment of Postage on Letters posted in any part of India for the United Kingdom, whether marked *via* Southampton or *via* Marseilles, will be *compulsory*. The Rates of Postage are as under:—

All Letters posted on or after the 1st of September upon which at least a single rate of Postage—that is to say, 4 Annas on a Southampton Letter, and 6 Annas on a Marseilles Letter—has not been paid, will be returned to the senders. But in order to obviate the inconvenience which would be caused to the public by detaining and returning to the senders Letters which, *through inadvertence*, may be posted without the full amount of Postage being paid upon them; Letters insufficiently prepaid, but on which at least a single rate of Postage has been paid, will be forwarded, charged with the deficiency of Postage and a fine of Sixpence, or four Annas.

Prepayment must be made, as now, by Stamps.
