No. 37 of 1859.—The Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that the following Despatch from the Honorable the Court of Directors, dated 11th August 1858, No. 44, conveying instructions for the Regulation of the promotion of Midshipmen of the Indian Navy to the rank of Lieutenant and of Mate, be published for general information :—

“ Paragraph 1.—Under the Regulations of the Indian Navy, a Midshipman cannot be allowed the rank of Commission of Lieutenant, or even of Mate, before he shall have completed five years of service, and until he, moreover, shall have passed the ‘final examination for the Commission of Lieutenant,’ not only in Seamanship, but in Gunnery, and in the more abstruse studies, as prescribed by those Regulations.

“ 2. You consider it necessary, however, for the prevention of unjust supersession, that some rule should be laid down to govern the grant of such rank and Commissions in cases where, in consequence of any Midshipman having been ordered on public service from the Presidency, or from Butcher’s Island, where the Gunnery is taught, or in consequence of his prolonged absence under medical certificate, the course of study requisite for him to pass through has been interrupted, and it has been impossible for the Midshipman (without any fault on his part) to pass such ‘final examination’ at the proper time.

“ 3. We have accordingly considered the subject, and we direct, that in the case of a Midshipman who, at the termination of his five years, when he should go up for examination, shall be absent in consequence of having been ordered away from his studies ‘on public service,’ the date of his quitting study be particularly noted, that he be required to resume study immediately on his return from such public service; and that when he shall have passed the ‘final examination’ prescribed by the Regulations, the number of months or days, which shall have elapsed between the date of his return to study and the date of his passing, be added to the date or time when he was ordered away, so that the Midshipman may be considered as having passed his ‘final examination’ for superior rank and Commission on the date arrived at by such addition to the time when his study was interrupted. For example, a Midshipman, whose five years would expire on the 1st July 1858, may have been ordered from his study of Gunnery at Butcher’s Island on the Public Service on the 1st June 1858; on return he may resume study on the 6th October 1858, he may pass his final examination on the 17th November 1858, thus occupying one month and eleven days, which must be added to the 1st June 1858, when he was ordered away, and will give a date of passing the ‘final examination’ equivalent to the 11th August 1858.

“ 4. The case of a Midshipman, who may be prevented by sickness or bodily infirmity from passing his final examination in due time, must be dealt with on the same principle, provided that the absence or inability of the Midshipman shall have been occasioned solely by ill-health, duly certified for the whole period of his absence or inability.

“ In accordance with the foregoing instructions, the case of each Officer concerned has been separately considered, and it is found that the following is the correct order in which the Mates should stand upon the list :—

Mail Robbery.—The Mail despatched from Bombay on the 16th December 1858, for Hyderabad, Deccan, was **ROBBED** whilst in transit between Sholapoor and Hyderabad.

Hours of Posting.—**BANGHY PARCELS** will, from and after the 1st February 1859, be received every day, Sundays excepted, for despatch, from 10 A. M. till 5 P. M., and **LETTERS** and **NEWSPAPERS** every day till 6 P. M., after which hours respectively Late Letters, Newspapers, or Parcels will be received till 7 P. M., on payment of an extra postage (or fee) of 8 annas on each cover. The full postage, and likewise the fee, must be prepaid in Stamps. **REGISTERED LETTERS** can be posted as heretofore, but the Prepayment of Postage is no longer optional. The Postage, as well as the Registration Fee of 4 annas, must be Prepaid in Stamps.

Malta and Gibraltar.—Letters for **MALTA** and **GIBRALTAR** may be prepaid or not, at the option of the sender.

Cairo.—Letters for Cairo must be **PREPAID**, but cannot be Registered.

Constantinople.—Letters for **CONSTANTINOPLE** cannot be Registered.

Ionian Islands.—Letters for the **IONIAN ISLANDS** must be prepaid to Alexandria, whence they will be forwarded *viâ* Trieste. Postage Eight Annas on a letter not exceeding half an ounce.

Banghy Parcels for Scinde and the Punjaub.—Notice is hereby given, that all Banghy Parcels for Scinde and the Punjaub, intended to be sent by Sea *viâ* Kurrachee, must be so marked, that is "Per Steamer," or else they will be subject to be sent by land, and to be charged with Banghy rates of Postage.

Holders of Window Delivery Tickets.—The Holders of Window Delivery Tickets are reminded that their Overland Letters, if not sent for before the Second Delivery, will be sent out by that Delivery instead of being kept in the Post Office for an indefinite period.

Newspapers.—Newspapers **RE-DIRECTED** are chargeable with **FORWARD POSTAGE**.

Securing Letters with Sealing Wax.—The Public are urgently recommended to close all letters, containing Remittances, Cheques, Bank Notes, or valuable Documents, with *Sealing Wax*. Bank Notes ought always to be divided, one half being sent after the receipt of the other half has been acknowledged.

Letters closed with gum, or the ordinary wafer, can be opened without any difficulty, or the slightest chance of detection.

Compulsory Prepayment of Letters to the United Kingdom.—From the 1st of September next the present system of *optional* Prepayment of Letters sent from India to the United Kingdom will be abolished, and from that date the Prepayment of Postage on Letters posted in any part of India for the United Kingdom, whether marked *viâ* Southampton or *viâ* Marseilles, will be *compulsory*. The Rates of Postage are as under:—

All Letters posted on or after the 1st of September upon which at least a single rate of Postage—that is to say, 4 Annas on a Southampton Letter, and 6 Annas on a Marseilles Letter—has not been paid, will be returned to the senders. But in order to obviate the inconvenience which would be caused to the public by detaining and returning to the senders Letters which, *through inadvertence*, may be posted without the full amount of Postage being paid upon them, Letters insufficiently prepaid, but on which at least a single rate of Postage has been paid, will be forwarded, charged with the deficiency of Postage and a fine of Sixpence, or four Annas.

Prepayment must be made, as now, by Stamps.
