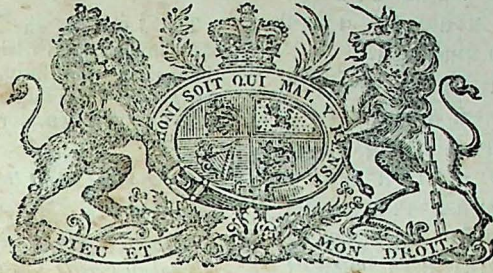

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS TO THE PUBLIC.

REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

With reference to the Government Notification, published in the *Government Gazette*, under date 28th August 1856, Page 1293, it is hereby notified that, under the Provisions of Section VI. of Act III. of 1852, the Right Honorable the Governor in Council has been pleased to declare that, after this date, Duty at the rate of Rs. (1-8-0) One and Annas Eight per Imperial Gallon (which shall be rateably increased as the strength exceeds London Proof) shall be levied on all Spirits manufactured at the Distilleries situated in the Island of Carranja.

2. It is likewise declared that a similar rate of Duty shall, from the same date, be levied on all Spirits manufactured at Bhandoop and Bassein Distilleries, with the exception that Spirits manufactured for the Commissariat will be liable to Duty at the rate of Nine (9) Annas per Gallon, as heretofore.

3. It is further notified that the Strength of the Spirits manufactured will not be allowed to exceed 25 per cent. above London Proof.

4. It is also notified that, under the Provisions of Section XV. of the Act aforesaid, and Section LV. of Regulation XXI. of 1827, the Commissioner of Customs has been appointed to grant

Licenses for the Manufacture of Spirits at the aforesaid Distilleries, for exportation or removal.

MARINE DEPARTMENT.

The Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to direct that the following Document be published :—

Report of JAMES GEORGE HILL, Master of the Barque "Stree Raja Rajaswaree," on a Reef or Bank seen on the 21st November 1858, on her passage from the Mauritius to Kurrachee.

Sunday, 21st November 1858, at 7-30 p. m., light and variable breezes from the South-Eastward, the evening very fine and beautifully clear, and the Vessel going about two knots per hour; passed quite close by a Reef or Bank (but more probably a Reef), a line of tremendous breakers rolling in from the Eastward, and just reaching the Ship in their spent state, causing her to roll and heel over very much. It appeared to extend in a N.N.E. direction, about one mile to sea all round the Vessel, indicating the approach to danger.

I am sorry I could not sound; my anxiety to get the Ship out of danger as speedily as possible, in the first instance, prevented my so doing, and as we were only about a quarter of an hour in the confused sea there was no time to spare.

2. All Medicines and Surgical Instruments for use with the Troops will be provided, on embarkation, at the expense of the Indian Government.

3. Consequent on this change, the following reduced rates of Head Money will be issued for the numbers actually landed, viz. on the voyage to or from England round the Cape, 13s. for each Adult, and 8s. for each Child; half of these rates from the Cape, St. Helena, or New South Wales to India; and 2s. 6d. each Adult, and 1s. 6d. each Child, from Ceylon to India by a Sailing Vessel. No allowance will be made for the Wives and Children of Commissioned Officers.

4. The Head Money shall be restricted to those Medical Officers who provide their own passages.

5. The Medical charge of Troops to or from India confers no title to a free passage; but a Medical Officer appointed to such charge, who, on other grounds, may be provided with Passage Allowance, or a passage at the expense of the Indian Government, shall be considered on duty, and shall attend the Troops without extra pay.

6. These orders apply to all embarkations in England for India, in and after June 1858, and shall take effect in all embarkations from India or the Colonies, subsequent to the notification of the Rules at the respective Presidencies and Colonies.

TO ASSISTANTS IN CHARGE OF OFFICES.

Whenever "*repetition*" price is paid for, the Message is to be invariably repeated back from Station to Station, whether the instruments in use be the Morse or the Needle.

Whenever two lines are open to one place, the distances by both being equal or nearly so, Messages will, under the orders of Government, be sent alternately by each line in the order of their presentation at the Despatching Office. The selection of the line cannot, in any case, be left to the senders, but it is *optional* with them to use *both* lines if they please, on payment of double price. Thus, if a Message from Bombay to Calcutta costs 3 Rupees for one line, it may be sent by both lines for 6 Rupees.

Under the sanction of the Government of India, the following reductions and alterations in the Charges for Messages will take effect from the publication of this Notice:—

Charge for Distance.

I.—Each rate for distance will be reckoned, as before, at one Rupee for 16 words sent to 400 miles, but instead of following the actual length of the line, the distances are computed by the geographical intervals according to Tables already issued from this Office.

Rates for Words.

II.—Above 16 words, the rates have hitherto been charged at 1½=24 words, 2=32, 3=48, 4=64, and so on—a single word above a particular rate entailing the payment of the next whole rate. This is abolished, and in future the charge will be one Anna per word for every word above 16.

III.—The *repetition* Charge is made *optional*, not compulsory, as hitherto the case for Mercantile and Business Messages; but refunds for errors will be made only where repetition is paid for at the present rate.

IV.—The triple rate now charged for *Cypher* Messages is abolished, and these will be sent at the ordinary price. But *Cypher* Messages will only be received in *numbers*, or in common English words of concealed meaning. The numbers must be written in full, as in a cheque, and each will be charged as a word. Refunds for errors will be made when repetition price has been paid.

Additional Words to be Passed Free in the Address.

V.—The words "to," "from," name of Telegraph Stations, "Mr." "Mrs." "Miss," "Messrs." and "Co.," in the *address* will be passed free, as at present, and, besides these, the rank or designation of sender and addressee will be sent free, if not more than two words, as "Lord," "Sir," "General," "Major-General," "Baboo," "Lalla," "Aga," "Hakem," &c.

Peon Hire.

VI.—This charge is reduced one-half, viz. from 4 Annas to 2 Annas per mile, measured from each Telegraph Office.

Local Lines.

VII.—Wherever short local lines exist, under 100 miles in length, the charge will be 8 annas for 16 words, and 2 pice for each word over. By local lines are meant those not forming part of the main trunk system.

Ceylon Lines.

The charges for all Messages between India and Ceylon are not affected by the preceding alterations, pending further orders from the Government of Ceylon.

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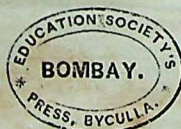

The 14th March 1859.

The following Act, passed by the Legislative Council of India, received the assent of the Right Honorable the Governor-General this day, and is hereby promulgated for general information :—

ACT No. VII. OF 1859.

An Act to Alter the Duties of Customs on Goods Imported or Exported by Sea.

I. From and after the 12th day of March 1859 inclusive, so much of Schedules A and B annexed to Act VI. of 1844, so much of Schedule annexed to Act IX. of 1845, so much of the Schedules A and B annexed to Act I. of 1852, and so much of Sections II., III., and IV. Act XXX. of 1854, as prescribe the rates of duty to be charged on goods imported into, or exported from, any port in India by sea, except the Articles of Salt and Opium, are repealed.

II. From and after the 12th day of March 1859 inclusive, all the above-mentioned Acts, which have reference to the duties of Customs now charged and leviable on goods imported into or exported from any Port in India by sea, shall be taken to have reference to the duties of Customs prescribed in the Schedules annexed to this Act; Provided that nothing in this Act shall authorise the levy of duties of Sea Customs at any free Port, or be deemed to affect the provisions of Acts VI. and VII. of 1848.

III. Nothing in this Act shall apply to Teak Timber exported from the Arracan, Martaban, and Tenasserim Provinces.

IV. And whereas contracts or agreements may have been made for the sale or delivery of goods on which increased or additional duties are imposed by this Act, and which contracts or agreements may have been made without reference to such increased duties, and thereby the several contractors may be materially affected; It is therefore further enacted that, if any person shall, by virtue of any contract entered into before the passing of this Act, be bound to deliver, at any time after the passing of this Act, goods hereby made liable to an increased or additional rate of duty, and shall, upon the importation or exportation of any goods, which he may deliver in performance of such contract, pay a rate of duty higher than that which was imposed by law on such goods at the time when the contract was entered into, every such person is hereby authorised and empowered to add to the price of such goods a sum equal to the difference between the duty paid under this Act, and the duty which would have been payable under the laws in force when the contract was entered into, and shall have the same remedy for the recovery of such sum as if the same had been part of the price

When this Act shall take effect. Indemnity to Collectors. day of March 1859; and every Collector of Customs and other Officer is hereby indemnified for anything done, on or after that day, in collecting or enforcing the Duties imposed by this Act, or in otherwise carrying into effect the provisions hereof; and no action or other proceeding shall be maintained against any such Collector or other Officer in respect of anything so done.
