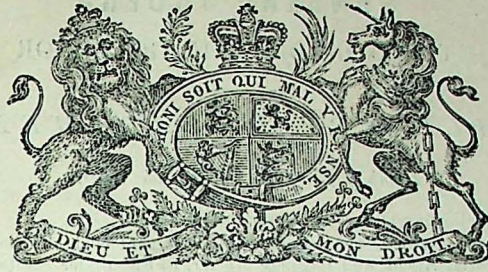

BY THE RIGHT HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

Bombay Castle, 31st March 1859.

No. 278 of 1859.—The following Orders are confirmed:—

Dated 18th April 1858.—By Major Grimes, appointing Lieutenant Gleig, of the 2nd Gr. Regt. N. I., to act as Interpreter, Commissariat Agent, and Baggage Master, to the Mahee Kanta Field Force.

No. 280 of 1859.—The Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to republish the following General Order by the Government of India, dated Allahabad, the 20th December 1858, No. 589:—

“The Right Honorable the Governor General is pleased to direct the following partial modification of the Rules laid down in Government General Order No. 876, of 28th October 1853, in connection with the issue of Rations to the European Troops—

“Clauses 7 and 12, under which the Contractor for Meat is not allowed the option of exchanging any portion of the Meat tendered for a Corps or Hospital which may be deemed objectionable, are modified to the extent of allowing the Contractor or his Agent, the option of exchanging the objectionable Meat forthwith; should he refuse to do so, a Committee is to be convened in the manner prescribed in Clauses 7 and 8 of the General Order of 1853; and in the event of the Meat being condemned, and the Contractor still refusing to exchange it, the course prescribed in Clause 12 of that Order is to be followed.”

No. 281 of 1859.—The following Order is confirmed:—

Dated 24th January 1859.—By Major Wallace, appointing Captain Thompson, of the 8th Regt. N. I., to act as Staff Officer to the Field Force employed in operations against the Naikras in the Rewa Kanta.

Hours of Posting.—BANGHY PARCELS will, from and after the 1st February 1859, be received every day, Sundays excepted, for despatch, from 10 A. M. till 5 P. M., and LETTERS and NEWSPAPERS every day till 6 P. M., after which hours respectively Late Letters, Newspapers, or Parcels will be received till 7 P. M., on payment of an extra postage (or fee) of 8 annas on each cover. The full postage, and likewise the fee, must be prepaid in Stamps. REGISTERED LETTERS can be posted as heretofore, but the Prepayment of Postage is no longer optional. The Postage, as well as the Registration Fee of 4 annas, must be Prepaid in Stamps.

Malta and Gibraltar.—Letters for MALTA and GIBRALTAR may be prepaid or not, at the option of the sender.

Cairo.—Letters for Cairo must be PREPAID, but cannot be Registered.

Constantinople.—Letters for CONSTANTINOPLE cannot be Registered.

Ionian Islands.—Letters for the IONIAN ISLANDS must be prepaid to Alexandria, whence they will be forwarded *via* Trieste. Postage Eight Annas on a letter not exceeding half an ounce.

Banghy Parcels for Scinde and the Punjaub.—Notice is hereby given, that all Banghy Parcels for Scinde and the Punjaub, intended to be sent by Sea *via* Kurrachee, must be so marked, that is "Per Steamer," or else they will be subject to be sent by land, and to be charged with Banghy rates of Postage.

Letters closed with gum, or the ordinary wafer, can be opened without any difficulty, or the slightest chance of detection.

Compulsory Prepayment of Letters to the United Kingdom.—From the 1st of September next the present system of *optional* Prepayment of Letters sent from India to the United Kingdom will be abolished, and from that date the Prepayment of Postage on Letters posted in any part of India for the United Kingdom, whether marked *via* Southampton or *via* Marseilles, will be *compulsory*. The Rates of Postage are as under:—

All Letters posted on or after the 1st of September upon which at least a single rate of Postage—that is to say, 4 Annas on a Southampton Letter, and 6 Annas on a Marseilles Letter—has not been paid, will be returned to the senders. But in order to obviate the inconvenience which would be caused to the public by detaining and returning to the senders Letters which, *through inadvertence*, may be posted without the full amount of Postage being paid upon them, Letters insufficiently prepaid, but on which at least a single rate of Postage has been paid, will be forwarded, charged with the deficiency of Postage and a fine of Sixpence, or four Annas.
