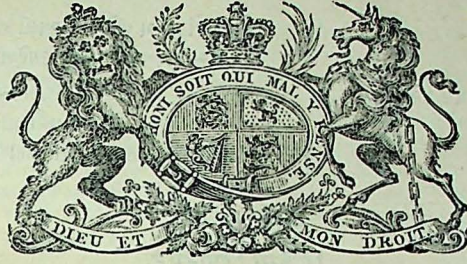

The following Notification, issued by the Government of India, under date the 29th April 1859, No. 33, is re-published for general information :—

The 29th April 1859.

Read again the following papers on the subject of the Deputation Allowance receivable by Covenanted Officers, Civil or Military, acting for Uncovenanted Officers, and *vice versa*.

Order contained in the Financial Resolution No. 5701, dated 8th October 1858.

Paragraph 4 of Financial Resolution No. 1431, dated 11th February 1859.

Read the undermentioned papers on the same subject :—

Letter from Civil Auditor, Fort William, No. 985, dated 4th instant.

Letter from the Punjab Civil Auditor, No. 34, dated 23rd ultimo.

RESOLUTION.—His Excellency the Governor General in Council is pleased to pass, experimentally for one year, the following Rules in respect to the Deputation Allowance receivable by the Officers mentioned below :—

When Covenanted Officers, Civil or Military, officiate for Uncovenanted Officers, and when Uncovenanted Officers act for Covenanted Officers, Civil or Military, the Deputation Allowance in such cases will be regulated according to the principle laid down in Chapter VI. Sections 25, 26, and 27 of the Covenanted Civil Absentee Rules, it being understood, however, that Section 27 shall not apply to Ministerial Officers acting for Covenanted Officers, who are entitled to Acting Allowance from the date they commence to officiate and not after the expiration of One Month, as in the case of other Uncovenanted Officers of superior grade.

When an Officer of the Uncovenanted Service acts for another of the same Service, or when a Military Officer acts for another Military Officer, he shall be governed by the Rules of the respective Services to which he belongs.

In passing the foregoing Rules, the Governor General in Council directs that the Audit Officers in the several Presidencies and Governments should submit, at the expiration of the experimental year for which the Rules are sanctioned, a Return, showing in juxtaposition the amount forfeited by the Absentees of the Military (so far as it is concerned with the Civil Department) and Uncovenanted Services, as well as that defrayed in the remuneration of their Substitutes, in the same manner as is done at present with regard to the forfeited Salary and the Deputation Allowance of Covenanted Civil Servants.

ORDER.—Ordered, that a copy of the foregoing Resolution be sent to the Civil Auditors, Fort William, Fort St. George, Bombay, and North-Western Provinces, for information and guidance, and to the Punjab Civil Auditor, in reply to his reference above adverted to.

Ordered further, that a transcript of the Resolution be published in the *Official Gazette*, for general information.

To the CIVIL AUDITOR,
Fort William.

SIR,—I am directed to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 844, dated the 21st ultimo, suggesting that One Month's Preparatory Leave be granted on Half-pay to Uncovenanted Servants desirous of retiring from the Service on Pension.

In reply, I am desired to state that Uncovenanted Servants about to resign the Service, who are residents in India, and have no voyage to prepare for, have not, in the opinion of the Governor General in Council, any reasonable claim to a month's "Preparatory" Leave; but he thinks that this indulgence which is granted, on Half-pay, to Covenanted Servants, may be extended to European Uncovenanted Servants intending to proceed to Europe immediately on retirement, on the understanding, however, that it shall be subject to the same condition as the Leave to Covenanted Officers, viz. that it shall be granted only in case it can be given without detriment to the Public Service.

No. 471 of 1859.—In notifying the resignation of the Command of the Northern Division of the Army by Major General Roberts, on his intended return to England, His Lordship in Council desires to express his great regret at losing this distinguished Officer's services.

His Lordship in Council has had the pleasure to receive from His Excellency the Commander in Chief the following testimony to the value of Major General Roberts' services.

"Specially appointed to the Command of the Northern Division at the commencement of the Disturbances in this Presidency, and invested by his Lordship in Council with high political duties, the Major General held his command in Guzerat with a temper and firmness which speedily put down a partial *emeute* among a portion of the Native Troops at Ahmedabad, and restored a confidence among all ranks and classes which Sir Henry Somerset had anticipated from Major General Roberts' high reputation established by a long career of honourable and important Political and Military duty.

"The siege and capture by storm of the important city of Kotah again caused the Commander in Chief to reflect with satisfaction upon the selection which had been made in Major General Roberts' appointment to the Command of the Field Division in Rajpootana. The subsequent pursuit of the Rebel Army and their defeats at Sanganeer and Kotaree, only attained by extraordinary exertions during the great heat and an almost unexampled burst of the monsoon, enhanced the value of the Major General's services; and he now closes them, after Forty years of duty so valuable and important that the Commander in Chief solicits from the Right Honorable the Governor in Council a special recognition of the claims of Major General Roberts to be brought under the notice of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India."

In these expressions His Lordship in Council cordially concurs, and has the pleasure to add that His Excellency's recommendation has been anticipated.

- Major General Roberts is allowed to return to Europe on furlough, according to the Regulations.

Post Office at Coorla.—Notice is hereby given, that a Post Office has been experimentally opened at Coorla, which is situated near the Line of Railway between Bombay and Tanna, being distant about ten miles from the former place, and eleven from the latter.

Mulligaum Post Office.—Notice is hereby given, that the Post Office at Mulligaum, under the Post Master General of Madras, has been transferred to Mhaker, and placed under the Post Master General of Bombay; the Distinguishing No. is 174. It is 61 miles North-east from Jaulnah, and 72 miles South-west from Kurrinjah, on the Main Line between Poona and Nagpore.

Separate Packets should be made for it, and sent to either of the above Post Offices, according to the direction from which they are forwarded.

Caution to Newspaper Senders.—The Public are warned against the practice of Enclosing Two or more Newspapers under One Cover. All such Packets containing more than One Newspaper are charged with Letter Rates of Postage, in accordance with Section IX. Act XVII. of 1854.

Zanzibar, Johanna, and Mozambique.—LETTERS and NEWSPAPERS addressed to ZANZIBAR, JOHANNA, and MOZAMBIQUE, will be forwarded *via* ADEN, except in the months of December, January, and February, when they will be sent direct as opportunities may offer.

Ahmedabad Camp.—From and after the 1st June 1859 all LETTERS, &c., for the RESIDENTS in AHMEDABAD, should be addressed to the CANTONMENT POST OFFICE; Letters, &c., not so addressed will be sent to the City Post Office.

Forward Postage.—The exemption allowed to Officers with the Army from the Charge of Forward Postage on Re-directed Letters is to continue until further orders.

Registered Letters.—The Registration Fee on Letters Posted and Registered at District Post Offices must be paid, One Anna in Cash, and the other Three Annas in Stamps.

Late Letters.—In future, late Letters and Newspapers, posted for despatch by the Overland and China Mails, will be treated as Ordinary late Letters and Newspapers, and subjected to a fee of Eight Annas each, which must be prepaid in Stamps.

Post Office Officials are warned against Franking, as on the Public Service, Applications for Promotion. *Vide* Circular No. 20, dated 17th February 1859.

Replies to Petitions.—The Director General of the Post Office in India has authorised the receipt at all District Post Offices of bearing letters "Replies to Petitions," and franked by any Public Officer.

Letters, &c. *via* France.—Letters or Printed Papers intended for any place in France, or to be sent direct through France to any part of Foreign Europe, should in future be marked "*via* France," and must prepay Inland Postage to Bombay. Steam Postage cannot be Prepaid on such Letters in India.

Mail Plundered.—It is hereby notified for information, that 3 Parcels, as per margin, despatched from Godra Post Office on the 18th March, at 4-30 P. M., *en route* to Baroda, were **PLUNDERED** by Naikras, or Bheels, between Godra and Ghurchoondee, at a small village called Kurwadee.

Hours of Posting.—**BANGHY PARCELS** will, from and after the 1st February 1859, be received every day, Sundays excepted, for despatch, from 10 A. M. till 5 P. M., and **LETTERS** and **NEWSPAPERS** every day till 6 P. M., after which hours respectively Late Letters, Newspapers, or Parcels will be received till 7 P. M., on payment of an extra postage (or fee) of 8 Annas on each cover. The full Postage, and likewise the Fee, must be Prepaid in Stamps. **REGISTERED LETTERS** can be posted as heretofore, but the Prepayment of Postage is no longer optional. The Postage, as well as the Registration Fee of 4 Annas, must be Prepaid in Stamps.

Malta and Gibraltar.—Letters for **MALTA** and **GIBRALTAR** may be prepaid or not, at the option of the sender.

Cairo and Constantinople.—Letters for these places cannot be Registered, and must be **PREPAID**.

Ionian Islands.—Letters for the **IONIAN ISLANDS** must be Prepaid to Alexandria, whence they will be forwarded *via* Trieste. Postage Eight Annas on a Letter not exceeding half an ounce.

Banghy Parcels for Scinde and the Punjaub.—Notice is hereby given, that all Banghy Parcels for Scinde and the Punjaub, intended to be sent by Sea *via* Kurrachee, must be so marked, that is "Per Steamer," or else they will be subject to be sent by land, and to be charged with Banghy rates of Postage.

Holders of Window Delivery Tickets.—The Holders of Window Delivery Tickets are reminded that their Overland Letters, if not sent for before the Second Delivery, will be sent out by that Delivery instead of being kept in the Post Office for an indefinite period.

Newspapers.—Newspapers **RE-DIRECTED** are chargeable with **FORWARD POSTAGE**.

Securing Letters with Sealing Wax.—The Public are urgently recommended to close all Letters, containing Remittances, Cheques, Bank Notes, or valuable Documents, with *Sealing Wax*. Bank Notes ought always to be divided, one half being sent after the receipt of the other half has been acknowledged.

Letters closed with gum, or the ordinary wafer, can be opened without any difficulty, or the slightest chance of detection.
