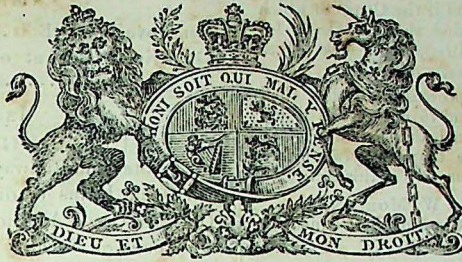

When official notifications from the Government are inserted in the BOMBAY GOVERNMENT GAZETTE, no communication on the same subject will be made in writing to any department concerned; but all public officers are required to take notice of such official notifications in the same manner as if they had been directly communicated to them by letter from the Secretary's office, and as heads of offices alone will be furnished by Government with the BOMBAY GOVERNMENT GAZETTE, they will be expected to communicate to their subordinate officers, all orders which may in any manner concern them.

The Bombay Government Gazettes furnished by Government to public offices are to be lodged with the records, and are not to be removed from the office.

Legislative Council of India.

8th January 1859.

The following Act, passed by the Legislative Council of India, received the assent of the Right Honorable the Governor General on the 30th December 1858 (communicated to the Legislative Council on the 8th January 1859), and is hereby promulgated for general information:—

ACT No. XLI. OF 1858.

An Act to Amend Regulation X. 1829 of the Bengal Code, for the Collection of Stamp Duties.

Whereas, by the General Rule laid down at the end of Schedule A annexed to Regulation X. 1829 of the Bengal Code, it is declared that if any Deed, Instrument, or Document specified in that Schedule shall not be contained in one sheet or piece of paper or other material, it shall suffice that one sheet shall bear the stamp, provided that the seals or signatures of the parties and witnesses be thereupon; and whereas the said Rule has been productive of inconvenience, and there is reason to believe that many Deeds, Instruments, and Documents have been executed since the said Regulation came into effect, in respect of which the said Rule has not been complied with; and it is expedient to repeal the said Rule, and to provide for the reception in evidence of such Deeds as aforesaid; It is declared and enacted as follows:—

Part of Schedule A Regulation X. 1829 repealed.

I. The above Rule is hereby repealed.

II. Every Deed, Instrument, or Document specified

Stamp on Deeds contained in more than one sheet of paper.

in the said Schedule, which is or shall be contained in more than one sheet or piece of paper or other material, shall be deemed to be sufficiently stamped if any one or more of such sheets or pieces of paper or other material shall bear the requisite stamp or stamps equal in value to the requisite stamp, whether the signatures or seals of the parties and witnesses shall or shall not be upon such sheet or sheets. The above provision shall apply to Deeds, Instruments, and Documents executed before this Act, as well as to Deeds, Instruments, and Documents which shall hereafter be executed. Provided, as regards Deeds, Instruments, and Documents which shall be executed after the 1st day of January 1859, that every sheet or piece of paper or other material which shall contain any part of such Deed, Instrument, or Document shall be stamped with a Government Stamp of the value of at least One Anna.

proviso as regards Deeds, &c. to be hereafter executed.

III. In any case in which a Deed, Instrument, or Document has been rejected

Review of judgment in certain cases in which Deeds, &c. have been rejected as not stamped,

by any Court upon the ground that the same was not stamped within the meaning of the abovementioned Rule, any

party injured by the decision may obtain a review of judgment, if the application be made within six months from the passing of this Act, and if the Court to which the application is made be satisfied that the Deed, Instrument, or Document, if admitted, would have led to a different decision upon the merits of the case.

IV. Nothing in the last preceding Section shall extend to any case in which a final decision was given more than six years before the passing of this Act.

THE "CAIRNSMORE" ROCK.

The position of this Rock, upon which the British Ship *Cairnsmore*, of Liverpool, John Bragg, Master, bound from Hongkong to Shanghai, was totally wrecked, on the 26th of June last (see *North China Herald*, July 3rd), is given as follows, by Lieut. Ward, R. N., in charge of H. M.'s Yacht *Emperor*, from observations taken whilst the Wreck was upon it:—

"The *Cairnsmore* Rock lies in Latitude 30° 42' 10" North, and Longitude 122° 34' 40" East, very nearly in mid-channel between the Parker Islands and the Saddle Group. The following are the Bearings of the most conspicuous objects seen from the Rock:—

South-east point of Senhouse Island. South.

A small rugged rock close to the South-east point of Raffles Island, and in a line with the point. } S. 59° W.

The Northernmost Rock of the Group off Chesney Island (very conspicuous) } N. 59° W.

On approaching this dangerous Rock, the lead can give no warning whatever, as the Rock is very small, apparently not more than 30 or 40 feet in diameter, and rises very abruptly.

It will be prudent, in future, for vessels navigating this channel, to keep on the Saddle Island side. When, going North, the Bit rock opens South of South Saddle Island, they will be to the Northward of the *Cairnsmore* Rock, and, when going South, the same Rock opens to the Northward of the South Saddle, they will be to the Southward of it."

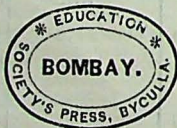

Ionian Islands.—Letters for the IONIAN ISLANDS must be prepaid to Alexandria, whence they will be forwarded *via* Trieste. Postage Four Annas on a letter not exceeding half an ounce.

Jerusalem and Baghdad.—Letters posted in India for JERUSALEM and BAGHDAD for despatch *via* Alexandria, and thence by French Packets to Jaffa, must, in addition to the regular steam-postage of Eight Annas per half ounce, prepay Four Annas, being equal to the postage (the prepayment of which is compulsory) due to the French Government. Newspapers for the same places must each prepay Nine Pies in money, when not exceeding two ounces in weight.

Compulsory Prepayment of Letters to the United Kingdom.—From the 1st of September next the present system of *optional* Prepayment of Letters sent from India to the United Kingdom will be abolished, and from that date the Prepayment of Postage on Letters posted in any part of India for the United Kingdom, whether marked *viâ* Southampton or *viâ* Marseilles, will be *compulsory*. The Rates of Postage are as under:—

THE following Notification, issued by the Government of India under date the 26th ultimo, is republished for general information :—

NOTIFICATION.

FORT WILLIAM, FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

The 26th January 1859.

REFERRING to the Notifications Nos. 27 and 31, issued from this Department on the 20th and 27th of July 1857, and to the Notification, No. 63, issued from this Department on the 19th November 1858, under which Promissory Notes of the Four per Cent., Three-and-a-half per Cent., and Four-and-a-half per Cent. Loans, and Transfer Loan Securities, were severally allowed to be received in part subscription to the open Five per Cent. Loan, it is hereby notified that the receipt of the said Promissory Notes and Transfer Loan Securities in part subscription to the said Five per Cent. Loan will be closed after the 30th April next.

It is further notified that the Sub-Treasurers at Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay, have been authorised to receive money for the purchase of Treasury Bills, payable to order, and bearing Interest at the rate of 3 pies, or one-fourth of an anna, a day, for every one hundred Rupees.

On money being paid into those Treasuries, the said Sub-Treasurers will issue Loan Certificates in the usual manner, which Certificates will be exchanged at the Offices of the Accountants General at the several Presidencies for Treasury Bills, as soon as possible.

The Bills will be paid off at par, at the General Treasuries of the Presidencies from which they may be issued, at the option of the holders, after the expiration of one year from the date of issue. They will also, after the expiration of one year from the date of issue be receivable at par, with allowance for any Interest due upon them, in payment of Government

The following Notification, issued by the Government of India under date the 26th ultimo, is republished for general information :—

Revenue into any Treasury of the Presidencies from which they may have been issued, or in subscriptions to the present Five per Cent. Loan, or, at the option of the holders, to any Loan that may then be generally open, as well as in liquidation of all Government demands at the General Treasuries of the several Presidencies, and in payments on account of Salt, Opium, and Customs.

Bills issued by the Accountant General in Calcutta will be receivable as above in payment of Government Revenue, into the Treasuries of Bengal, the N. W. Provinces, Oude, and the Punjab.

The Interest on the Bills will be payable half-yearly at the General Treasuries of the several Presidencies only.

The Bills will also be liable to be paid off at the option of Government, at the General Treasuries of the Presidencies from which they may be issued, at any time after the expiration of one year from the date of issue, provided that notice of such intention be given in the *Calcutta Gazette* at least three months before the date of proposed payment. After such notice is given, Interest on the Bills will cease to run from the day on which they shall have been notified for payment.

The Bills will be issued in sums of Rupees 1,000, Rupees 5,000, and Rupees 10,000.
