The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time on the 16th of June 1849:—

No. — OF 1849.

An Act to amend the Law respecting the Stamped Material in use in the Presidency of Bombay.

WHEREAS it is inconvenient to specify particularly by law the stamped materials to be used in the Presidency of Bombay, It is enacted as follows:—

I. Clause 1st, Section VI., Regulation XVIII. 1827, of the Bombay Code, is repealed.

Ordered, That the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, That the said Draft be re-considered at the first meeting of the Legislative Council of India after the 16th day of September next.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time, on the 23rd of June 1849:—

ACT No. — OF 1849.

An Act for securing the Land Revenue of Calcutta.

Whereas it is expedient that the Land Revenue, accruing due to the East India Company within Calcutta, be ascertained and collected in as summary a manner as in other parts of the Territories under the Government of the East India Company, It is declared and enacted as follows:—

I. All Assessable Lands, not the property of the East India Company, within the Town of Calcutta, of which the rate of Assessment is not known, or which have not heretofore been assessed, shall be assessed at the rate of three annas for each Cottah.

II. Lakhiraj tenures of Land in Calcutta, of which uninterrupted possession has been held, under alleged grants, exempt from Assessment for sixty years, shall be valid: no other Lakhiraj tenures of Land in Calcutta shall be deemed valid, unless the same are or shall be held under an unexpired grant from the British Government.

III. If any owner of Land, or any person holding Land on lease from the East India Company shall, upon the written demand of the Collector, refuse or neglect to pay any sum at which the land is assessed, or for which he is liable under his lease, the Collector may levy the same, by distress and sale of the Goods and Chattels, wherever found, of such owner or lessee, or, after written demand upon the tenant or occupier, and his refusal or neglect to pay the sum lawfully demanded, by distress and sale of any Goods and Chattels upon the Land.

IV. In the case of payment by any tenant or occupier, not holding immediately under the East India Company, or the seizure and sale of his property, he may deduct the amount of the payment or levy from the next payment of rent to his landlord.

V. The claim of the East India Company for Land Revenue or rent has priority over all other claims upon the land or to which property distrained upon the land may be liable.

VI. If the Collector's claim for arrears of rent is disputed, the process of distraint and sale shall not be stayed, unless the amount claimed be lodged with the Collector.

VII. Arrears of rent or revenue due to the East India Company are recoverable, within six years next after the same are due, or next after an acknowledgment of the same in writing has been given by the person by whom the same is payable, or his Agent, and not afterwards.

VII. When a claim to hold land Lakhiraj, or free of Assessment, shall be set up under this Act, the Collector shall inquire into the claim, taking such evidence as the claimant may offer, or the public Records supply, and shall report his proceedings in the case for the consideration of the Commissioner and Sudder Board of Revenue. If the Sudder Board of Revenue are satisfied of the validity of the claim, they shall make an order accordingly, and such order shall be final. If they are not satisfied of the validity of the claim, they shall direct the Collector to assess the land, leaving the claimant to contest the Collector's demand in the Civil Courts as herein provided.

IX. Any person obstructing or molesting the Collector or any of his Subordinate Officers in the execution of their duty, shall, on conviction before a Magistrate of the Town of Calcutta, be liable to a fine not exceeding Five hundred rupees, and in default of payment to imprisonment in the Common Jail for a term not exceeding six months, or until the fine is sooner paid.

X. The Collector may punish any contempt committed in his presence, in open Cutcherry or Office, by fine, not exceeding Two hundred rupees, and in default of payment by imprisonment in the Common Jail for a term not exceeding one month: from every such order of fine or imprisonment, an appeal shall lie to the Commissioner, whose decision shall be final.

XI. The Collector shall act in the execution of this Act under the usual control of the Superior Revenue Authorities.

XII. The Ground Rents payable to the East India Company from Lands in Calcutta are Revenue, within the meaning of the Act of Parliament 21 Geo. III. c. 70, and the Supreme Court of Judicature established by Royal Charter at Fort William in Bengal has not any civil jurisdiction concerning the said Ground Rents, or concerning any thing ordered or done in the Assessment or collection thereof.

XIII. All actions concerning any trespass or injury committed by any Revenue Officer acting under colour of this Act, or concerning any claim in respect of any goods taken by or any monies paid to any Revenue Officer under this Act, or concerning any claim of rent or revenue on the part of the East India Company under this Act, shall be tried and determined in the Civil Courts established by the East India Company in the Twenty-four Pergunnahs; notwithstanding that the cause of action, in respect of which such action is brought, arose, or the defendant therein reside, within the limits of the Town of Calcutta: and every such action shall be brought within six months after the cause of action arose, and not afterwards.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 23rd day of August next.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

NOSSHEAD LIGHTHOUSE.

THE COMMISSIONERS of the NORTHERN LIGHTHOUSES hereby give Notice, that a LIGHTHOUSE has been built upon the Point of NOSSHEAD, in the County of CAITHNESS, the Light of which will be exhibited on the Night of Monday the 18th June 1849, and every Night thereafter, from Sun-set till Sun-rise.

The following is a Specification of the Lighthouse and the appearance of the Light, by Mr. Alau Stevenson, Engineer to the Commissioners:

The Lighthouse is in N. lat. 58° 28' 38" and in W. long. 3° 3' 5". By COMPASS the Lighthouse bears from ACKERGILL TOWER in SINCLAIR'S BAY, E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., distant 2 miles; from DUNCANSBY HEAD, S. S. W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., distant 10 miles; from PENTLAND SKERRIES LIGHTHOUSE, S. W. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., distant 13 miles; from ELZIENESS, N. N. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., distant 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ mile; and from SARCLET HEAD, N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., distant 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ miles.

The NOSSHEAD LIGHT will be known to Mariners as a REVOLVING LIGHT, which gradually attains its BRIGHTEST STATE once every HALF MINUTE, and then as gradually declines, until, to a distant observer, it totally disappears. The Light will be visible towards the North and East, between W. N. W. and S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. From S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. to N. E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. in a South-easterly direction, the Light will be of the NATURAL appearance; but from N. E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. to W. N. W. in a Northerly direction, (or within SINCLAIR'S BAY,) it will be coloured RED. The Lantern is elevated 175 feet above the level of the Sea; and the Light will be seen at the distance of about 15 miles, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere; and, to a near observer, in favourable weather, the Light will not wholly disappear between the intervals of greatest brightness.

The Commissioners hereby further give Notice, that by virtue of a Warrant from the Queen in Council, dated 11th August 1848, the following Toll will be levied in respect of this Light, viz.:—

“ For every Vessel belonging to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (the same not belonging to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, or being navigated wholly in ballast), and for every Foreign Vessel which, by any Act of Parliament, Order in Council, Convention, or Treaty, shall be privileged to enter the Ports of the said United Kingdom, upon paying the same duties of Tonnage as are paid by British Vessels (the same not being Vessels navigated wholly in ballast) which shall pass the said Lighthouse upon Nosshead, or derive benefit thereby, the Toll of one *Farthing* per Ton of the Burden of every such Vessel, for each time of passing the said Lighthouse, or deriving benefit thereby on a Coasting Voyage, and double the said Toll for passing or deriving benefit on an Over-sea Voyage; and double the said respective Tolls for every Foreign Vessel not so privileged.”
