#### INTERPRETATION ON REGULATION VII. of 1831.

The Sudder Dewanee Adawlut having had under consideration the practice of the Mofusil Courts, as respects Appeals, it is declared that the Provisions of Act III. of 1843 limit an Appeal from the Decree of a Principal Sudder Ameen, Sudder Ameen, or Moonsif, to One Appeal to the Zilla Court; or, at a detached station, to the Senior Assistant Judge.

All Second Appeals within the Zilla are abolished by Act III. of 1843.

From the Decree on Appeal in the Zilla a Special Appeal lies to the Sudder Dewanes Adawlut.

The following Draft of a proposed Act was read in Council for the first time, on the 23rd of June 1849:—

ACT No. - or 1849.

An Act for securing the Land Revenue of Calcutta.

Whereas it is expedient that the Land Revenue, accruing due to the East India Company within Calcutta, be ascertained and collected in as summary a manner as in other parts of the Territories under the Government of the East India Company, It is declared and enacted as follows:—

- 1. All Assessable Lands, not the property of the East India Company, within the Town of Calcutta, of which the rate of Assessment is not known, or which have not heretofore been assessed, shall be assessed at the rate of three annas for each Cottah.
- II. Lakhiraj tenures of Land in Calcutta, of which uninterrupted possession has been held, under alleged grants, exempt from Assessment for sixty years, shall be valid: no other Lakhiraj tenures of Land in Calcutta shall be deemed valid, unless the same are or shall be held under an unexpired grant from the British Government.
- III. If any owner of Land, or any person holding Land on lease from the East India Company shall, upon the written demand of the Collector, refuse or neglect to pay any sum at which the land is assessed, or for which he is liable under his lease, the Collector may levy the same, by distress and sale of the Goods and Chattels, wherever found, of such owner or lessee, or, after written demand upon the tenant or occupier, and his refusal or neglect to pay the sum lawfully demanded, by distress and sale of any Goods and Chattels upon the Land.
- 1V. In the case of payment by any tenant or occupier, not holding immediately under the East India Company, or the seizure and sale of his property, he may deduct the amount of the payment or levy from the next payment of cent to his landlord.

- V. The claim of the East India Company for Land Revenue or rent has priority over all other claims upon the land or to which property distrained upon the land may be liable.
- VI. If the Collector's claim for arrears of rent is disputed, the process of distraint and sale shall not be stayed, unless the amount claimed be lodged with the Collector.
- VII. Arrears of rent or revenue due to the East India Company are recoverable, within six years next after the same are due, or next after an acknowledgment of the same in writing has been given by the person by whom the same is payable, or his Agent, and not afterwards:
- VII. When a claim to hold land Lakhiraj, or free of Assessment, shall be set up under this Act, the Collector shall inquire into the claim, taking such evidence as the claimant may offer, or the public Records supply, and shall report his proceedings in the case for the consideration of the Commissioner and Sudder Board of Revenue are satisfied of the validity of the claim, they shall make an order accordingly, and such order shall be final. If they are not satisfied of the validity of the claim, they shall direct the Collector to assess the land, leaving the claimant to contest the Collector's demand in the Civil Courts as herein provided.
- IX. Any person obstructing or molesting the Collector or any of his Subordinate Officers in the execution of their duty, shall, on conviction before a Magistrate of the Town of Calcutta, be liable to a fine not exceeding Five hundred rupees, and in default of payment to imprisonment in the Common Jail for a term not exceeding six months, or until the fine is sooner paid.
- X. The Collector may punish any contempt committed in his presence, in open Cutcherry or Office, by fine, not exceeding Two hundred rupees, and in default of payment by imprisonment in the Common Jail for a term not exceeding one month: from every such order of fine or imprisonment, an appeal shall lie to the Commissioner, whose decision shall be final.
- XI. The Collector shall act in the execution of this Act under the usual control of the Superior Revenue Authorities.
- XII. The Ground Rents payable to the East India Company from Lands in Calcutta are Revenue, within the meaning of the Act of Parliament 21 Geo. III. c. 70, and the Supreme Court of Judicature established by Royal Charter at Fort William in Bengal has not any civil jurisdiction concerning the said Ground Rents, or concerning any thing ordered or done in the Assessment or collection thereof.
- XIII. All actions concerning any trespass or injury committed by any Revenue Officer acting under colour of this Act, or concerning any claim in respect of any goods taken by or any monies paid to any Revenue Officer under this Act, or concerning any claim of rent or revenue on the part of the East India Company under this Act, shall be tried and determined in the Civil Courts established by the East India Company in the Twenty-four Pergunnahs; notwithstanding that the cause of action, in respect of which such action is brought, arose, or the defendant therein reside, within the limits of the Town of Calcutta: and every such action shall be-brought within six months after the cause of action arose, and not afterwards.

Ordered, that the Draft now read be published for general information.

Ordered, that the said Draft be re-considered at the first Meeting of the Legislative Council of India, after the 23rd day of August next.

The person or persons whose offer may be accepted, will be required to sign and seal a Contract, stipulating to the above effect, and that he or they will comply immediately with all emergent demands for the articles included in the above-mentioned list, and will meet other demands of less urgency within the periods stated in the requisition made upon him or them, in failure whereof, or if the supply be condemned by a Committee of Ollicers, as aforesaid, the articles of Provisions, &c., or such other as may be required in lieu thereof, shall be purchased by this Department without reservation, at his or their risk and loss; and in all such cases an advance of Rupees (30) thirty per cent, upon the amount of expenses incurred; or a line of Rupees (50) fifty, at the option of the Executive Officer, as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of Contract, as often as the same may occur; also the Contract may in all such cases be put an end to on the part of the East India Company.

No person will be allowed to bid for the Contract unless he previously deposits in this office the sum of Rupees (1,182) eleven hundred and eighty-two, in cash, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion, or refusal to execute the necessary Deed of Contract, should his offer be accepted, in which latter case he must be prepared to give unexceptionable bonded security to the extent of Rupees (4,730) four thousand seven hundred and thirty, to be held by Government for the due fulfilment of his Contract.

It is to be distinctly understood, that bills for the quantities of articles included in the above-mentioned list supplied, shall be preferred within or before the expiration of one month from the date of the delivery of the articles; in default of which, the Contractor shall be liable to torfeit the full value or amount of the supplies for which bills have not been so preferred, unless it shall clearly appear that the delay was unavoidable.

The amount of retrenchments made by the Military Board on the Contractor's bills will be recovered from the first bills preferred for payment by the Contractor; but in the event of such retrenchments, or any portion thereof, being remitted, the amount, or so much of the amount as shall be so remitted, will then be refunded to them.


