2. Bidders are to state the amount in Company's Rupees to be given per meusem for twelve months, commencing from 1st May 1855 to 30th April 1856.

If any alteration takes place before the day fixed for the sale of the contracts, they are to be entered into for the number of Native Troops actually present on that day.
4. No person will be allowed to bid who does not deposit Rupees two hundred (200) for the contract for the Country Liquor and Toddy, and Rs. ten (10) for that of Drugs, which will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion, or refusal to execute the necessary deed of contract, should his offer be accepted; in which case he will be required to complete a sum equal to one month's amount of the contract. This amount will be retained as security for the due fulfilment of the agreement, for which two unexceptionable securities must also be furnished by the contractors.
5. Payments of the amount of each contract must be made in advance on the 20th of each month.
6. The Liquor Contractor will be required to defray the expenses of a preventive Police, when it may be found necessary by the Officer Commanding the Station, for preventing the clandestine sale of Spirits to European Troops.
7. Detachments of 500 men and upwards moving or stationed within the Command are to be supplied with Liquor and Drug shops by the contractors, and if the Detachments move from the Division, these shops are to remain until replaced by others from the Division they enter.
8. The amounts to be paid for the contracts shall not be increased or decreased as Troops arrive at or depart from the Station, unless the number of arrival or departure exceed one-fourth of the number of Sepoys specified in the contract, in which case the amount payable shall be increased or decreased as a Committee of Officers may determine.
9. The contractors must remain always with the Bazar Department.
10. No remission will be allowed to the contractors for any scarcity which may occur during the existence of the contracts, and no reason will be assigned for the rejection of any offer.
11. No Liquor or Toddy is to be sold to the townspeople during the Mohurrum or Hooly festivals.
12. In the event of any breach of contracts, or of a contractor being found to have any dealings, direct or inclirect, with any person whom Government may declare unworthy of being dealt with in the management of the contract, the contract may be put an end to, and in such case the money advanced shall be forfeited to Government.
13. One (1) anna per gallon will be levied on Country Liquor in the Sudder Distillery on account of the Municipal Fund Committee, for the benefitoof the roads in the town of Surat, in addition to the regular monthly payments above alluded to.
14. Further particulars will be made known to any person or persons on application at this Office from 10 A. m. till 4 p. m. daily, Sundays excepted.

2．Sealed tenders for the contracts will be re－ ceived at this Office，on Friday the 23rd March 1855，at 12 o＇clock A．M．precisely，distinetly specify－ ing，both in words and figures，a per－centage above or below the prices exhibited in the above lists at which the supply will be made，on the understanding that the articles supplied are to be of unexceptionable quality，and are to be delivered，in the first instance，at the Commissariat Stores at Hydrabad in Scinde，if required，and afterwards to the indenting Department，in good condition，free of all charges beyond the stipulated price；in such numbers or quantities as may from time to time be demanded；and that the same are liable to examination，and rejection by the executive Commissariat Officer，or by the indenting or receiving Officer ；or by a Committee of Officers appointed on the part of Government，in the event of the contractor being dissatisfied with the
decision of the above Officers, or either of them; it being understond that the decision of such Conmittee is to be final, and binding on all parties.
3. It is to be clearly understood, that such of the articles specified in the Schedules as form part of the Rations for European Soldiers, or Hospital Diet, are to be supplied under the rules laid down in G. G. O. No. 613 of the 10 th October 1853, and No. 33 of the 11 th January 1854, copies of which may be seen at this Office.
4. No person will be allowed to submit his tender for any contract unless he previously deposits in this Office, in cash, the sum exhibited opposite the Schedule referring thereto, which will be forleited in the event of delay, evasion, or refusal on his part to execute the necessary deed of contract when required to do so, on his offer being accepted; in which latter case he must be prepared to give unexceptionablebonded security to the further amount shown opposite each Schedule, which, together with the amount previously deposited, will be held as a guarantee for the due fulfilment of his contract.

5. A contractor must comply immediately with all emergent demands, and meet others of less urgency within the periods stated in the requisitions made upon him; in failure whereof, or if any supply be condemned by a Committee of Officers as aforesaid, the articles, or such others as may be required in lieu thereof, shall be purchased by this Department without delay, at his risk and cost, if it be considered expedient to do so ; and in all such cases thirty $(30)$ per cent. upon the amount of expenses incurred, or a fine of Ropees fifty (50), at the option of the executive Commissariat Oificer, will be levied as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of contract; it being understond that the simple condemnation of any article by a Committee constitutes a breach of contract, whether the rejected articles be replaced by the contractor or by this Department; in every such case, also, it is to be understood that the contract may be cancelled, at the discretion of the Commissary General, and that if the contract be so cancelled, the cash deposit mentioned in para. 4 of this Notice will be forfeited to Government.
6. It isalso to be understood that any negligence, evasion, or refusal on the part of a contractor to make supplies, or obey orders, or any attempt on his part, or that of his agents, to pass off articles of an inferior quality in lieu of those he is bound to supply, or any neglect to deliver them at the time and place ordered, will subject him, in every in-
stance, to be fined to the extent of Rupees twenty five (25), at the option of the executive Commissariat Officer, from whose order an appeal may be made to the Commissary General, whose decision is to be final; but in cases when it may be deemed fit to exact any of the penalties provided for in the preceding Clause, no further penalty shall be leviable under this Clause.
7. It is further to be understood that the contractor, or an accredited agent on his part, approved of by the executive Commissariat Ollicer, is to attend at this Olfice during the usual hours of business, i. c. from 10 A. м. to 5 p. m. daily (Sundays excepted), also at such other time or place as may be indicated by the executive Commissariat Officer, when he may consider it desirable for the public service to require such attendance.
8. Any party whose offer is accepted will be required to produce the sureties for the approval of the Civi! or Cantonment Authorities, as may be necessary, within fifteen days from the date of the acceptance of his offer, or the contract will be resold. No reason will be stated for rejecting any security offered.
9. Bills for articles supplied under this contract must be preferred within one month from the date of the delivery of the articles, in default of which the contractor will forfeit the full value of the supplies for which bills have not bern so preferred, unless it clearly appears, to the atisfaction of the Commissary General, that the aelay was unavoidable.

The following Act, passed by the Legislative Council, received the assent of the Most Noble the Governor General of India on the 17th of February 1855, and is hereby promulgated for general information:-

Act No. V. of 1855.
An Act to assimilate the Process of Execution on all Sides of Her Majesty's Supreme Courts, and to extend and amend the Provisions of Act XXV. of 1841.

Whereas it is expedient to make the process of execution on all sides of Her Preamble. Majesty's Supreme Courts as near as may be the same; and also to extend and amend the provisions for giving effect to the decrees and orders of Her Majesty's Supreme Courts in certain cases, which are contained in Act No. XXV. of 1841: It is enacted as follows :-
I. No process of contempt shall issue to compel Process of contempt not the performance of so much to issue to compel perform- of any judgment, decree, ance of decreo, \&ce. to pay ance or or to exccuto a deay money, or to executo a deod, \&c. sentence, or order, either decretal or interlocutory, made by any of Her Majesty's Supreme Courts, as directs any person to pay any money or costs, or to execute any conveyance or other deed or instrument, or to make any transfer or surrender, or to do any act which a constituted attorney of such person, if ordered by the Court to do the same for his principal, would have the means of performing.
II. Where any person is liable to pay any money

Party in default, after or costs upon a judgment judgment, or order to pay - recovered against him in any money or costs, to be promoney or costs, Co be proceeded against by Ca. Sa. or
Fi. IV. Whenever any person has been directed by any judgment, decree, sentence,

Power to the Court to appoint an Officer to execnte instrument, or to do any act for the person who has been ordered, but has failed to execute or do the samo. or order of any of the said Courts, to execute any conveyance, deed, or instrument, or to make any transfer or surrender, or to do any act which a constituted attorney of such person, if directed by the Court to do the same for his principal, would have the means of performing, and such person has refused or neglected to obey such direction, or has evaded compliance therewith, either by absenting himself in order to avoid service of the judgment, decree, sentence, or order, wherein such direction is contained, or by any other means, it shall be lawful for the Court by which such direction has been given, wether the person disobeying or evading compliance with such direction is in custody or not,
upon application made to the said Court for that purpose, and upon proof to its satisfaction of such default or evasion as aforesaid, to order or appoint the Registrar, Master, or other Officer of the said Caurt to execute such conveyance, deed, or instrument, or to make such transfer or surrender, or to do such other act as aforesaid, for and in the name of the person by whom the same ought to have been executed, made, or done; and every conveyance, deed, and instrument which shall have been executed, and every transfer and surrender which shall have been made, and every other act which shall have been done by an Officer of Conrt under the authority of this Act, shall in all respects have the same force and validity as it would have if it had been duly executed, made, or done by the persons for and in whose name it slanll have been so executed, made. or done.

Or in certain cases to dispense with the execution of an instrument, or the signaan instrument, or
ture of a writing. der this Act, that it can safely dispense with the formal exceution of any conreyance, deed, or instrument, which the person directed to execute the same has failed to execute, or with the signature of any writing required for the formal performance of any act required to be done, but omitted to be done by the person directed to do the same, it shall be lawful for the said Court, in lieu of ordering its Officer to execute the said conveyance, deed, or instrument, or to sign the said writing, by its order to declare that such conveyance, deed, instrument, or writing shall be as valid and effectual to all intents and purposes, without the exceution or signature of the person directed to execute or sign the same, as it would have been if he had daly executed or signed the same.
VI. When any person has been directed, by any Tho Court jumpowered to or order of decree, sentence,
Tho Court empowered to or order of any of the said enforco the delivery of any immoveable property, or any specific chattel, or the deposit of any books, papers, or othor articles or things, by
seizure. seizure. Courts, to deliver up possession of any immoveable property, or of any specific chattel or security, or to deliver to any person or persons, or to deposit in Court or elsewhere any books, papers, writings, or other articles or things, and has refused or neglected to obey such direction, or has evaded compliance therewith, either by absenting himself, to avoid service of the said judgment, decree, sentence, or order, or by any other means, it shall be lawful for the Court by which such direction has been given, whether such person is in custody or not, on proof of such default or evasion as aforesaid, to issue a writ or writs to the Sheriff, directing him either to put the party therein named into possession, or to seize and take such chattel, security, books, papers, writings, or other articles or things, and to deal with the same according to the exigency of the writ, which in all cases shall be conformable to the order, to compel the performance whereof the same is issued. ## Act No. VI. of 1855.

An Act to extend the Operation of, and regulate the Mode of Executing Writs of Execution in, Her Majesty's Supreme Courts of Judicature.
Whereas it is desirable to extend the operation of,
Preamblo. and regulate the conduet of writs of execution out of,
Her Majesty's Supreme Courts, in certain cases : It is enacted as follows :-
I. shall have arrived; and the payment to such Sheriff or other officer or to the party entitled under such endorsement or transfer, by the party liable, with or without suit, or the recovery and levying execution against the party so liable, shall discharge him to the extent of such payment or of such recovery and levy in execution, as the case may be, from his liability on any such cheque, bill of exchange, promissory note, hoondee, bond, security, and debt; and such Sheriff or other officer shall pay over to the party suing out such writ, the money so to be recovered, or such part thereof as may be sufficient to discharge the amount by such writ directed to be levied; and if, after satisfaction of the amount so to be levied, together with Sheriff's poundage and all lawful charges and expenses, any surplus shall remain in the hands of such Sheriff or other officer, the same shall be paid to the party against whom such writ shall be so issued, unless the same is duly attached in the hands of such Sheriff or other of-
Proviso as to indemnity for Sheriff. ficer. Provided that no Sheriff or other officer shall be bound to sue any party liable upon any such cheque, bill of exchange, promissory note, hoondee, bond, security, or debt, unless the party suing out such execution shall give security to the Sheriff for indemnifying him from all costs and expenses to be incurred in the prosecution of such action, or to which he may become liable in consequence thereof; the nature and amount of such security to be determined, in case they cannot agree, by the proper officer of the Court in which such action shall be brought, or, if the Court shall so order, by some other person to be appointed by the Court for such purpose; and the expense of preparing and executing such security shall be deducted out of any money to be recovered in such action, and the net proceeds only in this and other cases provided for by this Act shall be considered as received in satisfaction of the debt due to the execution creditor.

"The Most Noble the Governor General in Council is pleased to authorise the following Commissioned and Non-Commissioned Staff for Wings of European Regiments of Cavalry and Infantry of Her Majesty's and the Honorable Company's Services, when detached from their Head Quarters :-
"On all occasions when detached, whether to another Station or marching, or moving by water separately-
" 1 Aeting Adjutant (who shall act as Quarter Master, and in Her Majesty's Regiments as Pay Master also, when a separate Ofificer is not allowed for those duties).
" 1 Acting Serjeant Major (who shall also act as Provost Serjeant).
"i Acting Quarter Master Serjeant (who will also act as Pay Master's Clerk in Her Majesty's Regiments).
" 1 Acting Hospital Serjeant. And, as a temporary arrangement, pending the revision of the School Establishment,
" 1 Acting Assistant Schoolmaster, when an Assistant cannot be spared from the Regimental School.
"2. When the detached Wing is quartered in a separate Division of the Army, and the period of its absence from its IIead Quarters is likely to exceed three months, or when in the same Division its absence is likely to be prolonged beyond six months, His Excellency the Commander in Chief may authorise-
" 1 Acting Quarter Master, who in H. M.'s Regiments will also perform the duties of Paymaster, and
" 1 Acting Armourer Serjeant, when the detached Wing is in a separate Division and its absence is likely to exceed six months.
"3. The above scale of Non-Commissioned Staff, with the exception of the Armourer Serjeant, is likewise authorised for large Divisions of Artillery, consisting of not less than four European Troops or Companies, whether the Head Quarters of a Brigade or Battalion be present or not.
"4. It is not considered necessary to allow any separate Non-Commissioned Staff for detached Wings of Brigades or Battalions of European Artillery, and provision is already made for the Staff of Divisions of Artillery in cases when the Head Quarters of a Brigade or Battalion are not present.

No. 242 of 1855. -The Right Honorable the Governor in Council is pleased to republish the following General Order by the Honorable the President of the Council of Indin in Council, dated Fort William, 26th February 185.5, No. 278 :-

The Honorable the President of the Conncil of India in Council, with the concurrence of the Most Noble the Governor General of India, is pleased to lay down the. following revised Rules for regulating claims to indemnification for losses, to have effect at the three Presidencies from the 1st proximo. G. G. O. No. 428, of the 16 th November 1819, and all subsequent Rules on the subject, are hereby cancelled.

1. Indemnification is not intended to make good the full amount of loss sustained; but is granted only to such extent as shall enable the claimant to re-equip himself for service according to the scale laid down.
2. In estimating the amount of indemnification to be granted, regard shall be had to the extent of equipment required by the Regulations of the Service, the Orders of the Commander-in Chief, or to such restriction as may have been imposed by his authority, according to the nature of the service on which the claimant was employed when the loss occurred.
3. Indemnification shall invariably be confined to losses which have been altogether unavoidable, and may be granted in the following cases, viz :

## Losses in action with the enemy ;

## By capture ;

By shipwreck, or by inevitable casualties on board ship, occasioned by storms or stress of weather ; or by corresponding accidents in river navigation, when proceeding on duty by water ;
By accidental fire ;
By the destruction of a public store-house; or
By the destruction of articles, or of horses or baggage-cattle, to prevent them falling iuto the hands of the enemy, or to prevent the spreading of an infectious or contagious disorder.
Provided that in all these cases the articles or amimals were placed in the situation in which the loss occurred, under the sanction of proper authority ; that every exertion was used to prevent the loss ; and that any orders for the destruction of articles or of auimals were issued by competent authority, and carried into effect with all possible
promptitude.
4. No claim can be admitted in the following cases, viz :-

Losses from desertion;
From articles having been improperly packed, placed, or left in improper situations;

From the denth of horses or baggage-cattle by fatigue in the ordinary course of service ;
From the breaking down of carriages, being private property;
From the loss of clothing, or necessaries in hospital; or
From any circumstances whatever which may have been prevented by proper care on the part of the Regiment or of the claimant or person in charge.
5. No claim can be admitted from the representatives of Officers or Men slain in action, or dying in consequence of wounds, or otherwise dying before their claims can be investigated and paid.
6. No indemnification shall be granted for losses sustained by Officers when proceeding on, or returning from, leave of absence, except in case of sick leave, or under special circumstances, nor by those in receipt of Boat Allowance.
7. If an Officer or a Soldier shall have neglected to bring forward his claim for a period exceeding one month from the date of his loss, this delay shall be considered a sufficient reason for rejecting the claim, however valid it may be in other respects, unless the claimant can prove that he was unavoidably prevented from making an earlier claim.
8. Whenever baggage or articles of equipment are sent by a vessel in which the Officer to whom they belong is not himself a passenger, it is incumbent upon such Officer to protect himself against loss by effecting an insurance thereupon; and if he has an opportunity of doing so, and neglect to avail himself of it, no compensation will be given by the State for any loss that may happen.
9. Whenever losses occur under circumstances which give an Officer or Soldier a claim to indemnification, whether on service in the field or otherwise, the General, or other Officer commanding the Division, Station, or Detachment, shall assemble, with all convenient despateh, Committees composed of Officers from different Corps, when practicable, for the investigation of claims arising out of those losses, which Committees shall be guided by the principles laid down in this Regulation, and shall require the several proofs to be laid before them in the forms hereinafter prescribed, and the whole of their proceedings, or certified. copies thereof, shall be transmitted to the Commander-in-Chief for his observations and opinion, and by him forwarded to Governṃent for final decision.

## Personal Losses of Officers.

10. The whole equipment of Officers, Commissioned, Warrant, and Native, shall be valued at the rates following:-

11. The baggage and camp equipage of all Regimental Staff Officers are to be valued as those of Subalterns, and of Superintending Surgeons as those of Captains.
12. An Officer claiming indemnification is to certify, upon honor, the extent of his losses, whether it be the entire of his baggage, or camp equipage and carriage, or a portion only; and if the latter, he must state, according to the best of his judgment and belief, what fractional parts of the whole he has lost, whether one-fourth, one-half, three-fourths, or any other fraction. (Vide Form A.)
13. Indemnification for losses of purely military equipments is inadmissible to Officers holding non-military appointments.
14. Clains of Officers of Artillery and Engineers for the loss of professional instruments, limited to those required by the nature of the service on which the Officer may be employed, will be admitted according to the particular circumstances of each case, and at the rates fixed from time to time by the Ordnance Department.

## Loss of Mess Property and Band Instruments.

15. Indemnification will, under no circumstances, be allowed for Wines and. Stores lost by a Regimental Mess; but a donation, to such amount as may be determined in each case as it arises, may be allowed in aid of the subscriptions of the OFicers of a Regiment, for the purpose of re-equipping themselves with the furniture and utensils necessary for a Regimental Mess. Indemnification is admissible for the loss of Band Instruments, but in no iustance will more than two-thirds of the original cost be allowed. (Vide Form B.)

## Loss or Honses.

16. Indemnification for the loss of horses in action, or destroyed in consequence of being infectiously diseased, is admissible only to Officers in receipt of Horse Allowance, cither personally, or as an item of their Staff Allowance, and is not to exceed the following rates.
17. To Officers of Horse Artillery, Horse Field Batteries, and Cavalry, for the loss of a charger selected from the ranks or remounts of their respective Corps, indemnification eg̣ual to the price they would receive on returning such chargers to the ranks, viz. the residue of the original price atier a deduction of 10 per cent. per ammum for the period that mny have elapsed from the date of selection.
18. To all mounted Officers for the loss of a charger not sclected from the ranks, a compensation equal to the residuc of the price paid for the horse after a deduction of 10 per cent. per annum, provided the residue does not exceed the sum of Company's Rupees eight hundred ( 800 ), wiich is the maximum allowed in any case.
19. Officers in receipt of Horse Allowance are to register, in the Station or Regimental records, the prices they may pay for their chargers, and when a horse may have come into the possession of an Oficer otherwise than for a money-payment, a vnlue is to be assigned by a Committee to be assembled by the Commanding Oiacer of the Station, which value is to be recorded as the price of the horse.
20. Indemnification for horses of Officers destroyed on account of having farcy or glanders will only be admitted when it is shown that the destuction of the animal was necessary to prevent infection to other horses in the same stable or in close proximity thereto, whose loss would be liable to be defrayed by the public. (Vide Form C.)
21. The allowance to the Native ranks of the Irregular Cavalry for the loss of horses killed or lost in action, dying of fatigue, destroyed or disabled on extraordinary duties, or on field service, is granted according to the actual cost of ench horse, not exceeding Rapees one hundred and twenty -five (125). (Vide Form D.)
22. Indemnification is admissible for the loss in action of a horse, the property of a Commissioned or Non-Commissioned Officer, when the rider, or bargeer, happens to be killed.
23. The allowance for the loss of grass-cutters' ponies belonging to regular mounted Corps, is fixed at Rupees twelve (12) each.

## Loss of Money

24. No claim shall be admitted on account of the loss of money, being the private property of individuals : but in special cases, where public money, which has regularly been received by individuals, and has unavoidably remained in their hands, shall be lost on service, application for indemnification may be made according to Form E, such application being supported by the several certificates and documents there specified.

Losses of Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers.
25. Claims on aceount of uecessaries lost on service, or under the circumstances detailed in Article 3 of this Begulation, by Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers of European Corps, or of Native Regiments of the Line, Local and Irregular Corps, and Regiments of Irreigular Cavalry, are to contain a specification of the articles lost, and of their actual value at the time of loss, and the Captains or Officers commandiag Troops and Companies, and Commanding Otficers of Regiments are to be responsible that no such claim shnll include any charge on account of articles not sanctioned as Regimental necessaries by the existing Regulations, and that any restriction in the equipment of the Troops, which may have been imposed by the orders of the Officer in command, had been obeyed and taken into account in limiting the amount claimed.
26. Every claim for indemnifiention for such losses shall be accompanied by a statement of the prices paid by the men for their necessaries, according to the Regimental Orders then in force; and the Committee by which, under the provision of Article 9 of this Regulation, the claim may be examined, shall submit a recommendation as to the amount of indemnification to be granted, for the final decision of Government.
27. Those articles of clothing and equipment only which the Soldier is required to provide and to keep up at his own expense, are to be considered Regimental necessaries.
28. When articles of clothing in wear, provided by Government for the use of Soldiers, are lost, they will be replaced under the provision of the Clothing Regulation ; but articles which have served the full period will, on no account, be replaced, neither con indemnification be allowed for them.
29. Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers who have been taken and detnined as prisoners of war more than four months, shall not be allowed to receive indemuification for necessaries lost when they were taken prisoners; all claims therefore made by men who have been prisoners of war shall contain a statement of the precise period during which they were absent from the Regiment in consequence of being captured.

## FORT WILLIAM, FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT,

 The 12th March 1855.The Government of India, having undertaken Public Works to a large extent during the past and present years, has resolved to open a Loan, to be called "The Public Works' Loan of $1854-55$," to the extent of Two Crores and Seventy-five Lacs of Company's Rupees.

This sum will be allotted to the different Presidencies and Lieutenant-Governorships in the following proportions :-

Subscriptions will be received from the date of this Notification by the Sub-Treasurers at Fort William, Fort St. George, and Bombay, and by the Collector of Agra.

Subscriptions will likewise, hereafter, be received at such other Treasuries as may, from time to time, be notified by the Secretaries to Government in the Financial Department, at the several Presidencies and Lieutenant-Governorships.

But it will be understood, that if the whole sum allotted to any particular Presidency or Lieutenant-Governorship shall not be subscribed within two (2) months from the date of this Notification, it shall be optional with the Government of India to direct that the balance shall be received at any other Presidency or Lieutenant-Governorship.

Subscriptions must be tendered in sums of even hundreds, of not less than 500 Company's Rupees, subject to the provisions hereinafter specified.

Interest will be paid on the subscriptions received half-yearly, at the rate of Five Company's Rupees per centum per annum; and the Government of India guarantees that no part of this Loan shall be paid off before the 31st March 1870, nor without a previous notice of three months, to be issued at any time after the 30th of December 1869.

Authorised public demands (including Audited Bills for arrears of salary and Bills of Exchange) payable from the Public Treasuries in which subscriptions may be allowed to be received, will be taken as Cash at par, on the understanding, however, that Bills of Exchange will be subject to a deduction at the rate of five per centum per annum for the period they have to ran.

The several Public Officers authorised to receive subscriptions into this Loan will grant acknowledgments, in the following form, for all sums received by them respectively :-

B., his Executors or Administrators, until the expiration of three months after such notice of payment as aforesaid, when the amount of Interest due will be payable with the Principal, and (such notice being considered equivalent to a tender of payment at the period appointed for the discharge of the Note) all further Interest shall cease.

The several officers authorised to receive subscriptions will, on application from the holders of acknowledgments, transmit them (free of every expense whatever) to the Accountant General at Fort William, to be exchanged for Promissory Notes, bearing Interest from the 31st March (or the 30th September, as the case may be) next ensuing after the date of subscription. The Interest accruing on the broken period of the half-year that may intervene between the date of subscription and the 31st March (or the 30th September, as the case may be) next ensuing, will be paid up at the time of granting the acknowledgment.

Proprietors of Notes or Acknowledgments, who may desire to have the Interest payable at any other Public Treasury than at the General Treasury of Calcutta, shall be entitled to re-
