"FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

SUMMARIES OF CONSTRUCTIONS OF INCOME TAX ACTS XXXII. AND XXXIX. OF 1860.

No. 43.

Military Service,

Persons in, when exempt from and when liable to Income Tax.

Act No. XXXII. of 1860, Section CXXVII.

NOTE.—The question was put in the case of a Medical Officer in the Stud Department, who was in the receipt of more than the Regimental pay and allowances of an Assistant Surgeon. The Stud Department was declared not to be a Military Establishment in any sense which would exempt the pay and allowances of the Assistant Surgeons attached to it from the operation of the Income Tax Acts.

Under Section CXXVII. Act XXXII. of 1860, persons moving in the regular Regimental Service or in any regular Military Service are exempt from the Income Tax, if their pay and allowances are less than the pay and allowances of a Captain of Infantry. But if any such person is placed in an exceptional post not strictly within the regular line of Military Service, in which he receives pay beyond that of his proper Military rank, he is liable to the payment of Income Tax.—(Financial Department Order, No. 1228, dated 2nd February 1861.)

No. 94 of 1861.—The following Notification, by the Government of India, dated 8th February 1861, is republished:—

"Letter from the Officiating Under Secretary to the Government of India, in the Foreign Department, to the Secretary to the Government of the Punjab and its Dependencies, No. 5618, dated the 21st November 1860.

With reference to your docket, dated 5th instant, No. 910, I am directed to state, for the information of the Lieutenant Governor, that the President in Council has no doubt that the Court of a Cantonment Joint Magistrate, exercising Civil jurisdiction under Act III. of 1859, is a Civil Court within the meaning of Act XXXVI. of 1860, and that all petitions and other documents filed in such a Court in cases under Act III. of 1859 are liable to Stamp Duty under Schedule B. of the Stamp Act.

His Honor in Council holds the same opinion in regard to Military Courts constituted under Act XI. of 1841. Though called Military Courts, they are in reality nothing but Civil Courts appointed for the trial of "Actions of Debt and other Personal Actions," against Native Officers, Soldiers, and Camp Followers. They are vested with the powers of Civil Courts in respect to the examination of witnesses, and their decrees are executed by Civil process. His Honour in Council thinks therefore, that, in the absence of any express exemption, all petitions and other documents filed in such Military Courts of Requests are liable to duty under Schedule B. of the Stamp Act.

Letters by Express.—As it is not unfrequently impossible to forward the Express Packets received from England immediately after the arrival of the Mail Steamer at Bombay, the Director General of the Post Office desires to intimate to the Public that he has authorised the Post Master of Bombay to despatch by the Express letters received by the Steamer addressed to persons who may have stated in writing their wish to have their letters so forwarded, and who have engaged to pay the Express Postage of One Rupee for every quarter of an ounce.

If, therefore, any persons desire that their Overland letters should, whenever it is practicable, be forwarded from Bombay by Express, they are requested to address the Post Master of Bombay to that effect, and state that they will pay the Express Postage.

It will be understood that letters not received from England in the Express Bag can only be forwarded by Express from Bombay when the English Express is unavoidably detained, and when its weight will admit of additional letters being despatched.
