SUMMARIES OF CONSTRUCTIONS OF INCOME TAX ACTS XXXII. AND XXXIX. OF 1860.

No. 100.

Foreign Merchant

Purchasing goods in India through an Agent there, and selling the goods out of India, he being himself non-resident, not liable to Income Tax.

Act XXXII. of 1860, Section LXXVIII. and XCVIII. Rule 1.

A question having been raised as to the liability to Income Tax, under Acts XXXII. and XXXIX. of 1860, of a Merchant residing in America, who purchased goods at Aden through his Agent residing there, and sold them in America, it was held that, in the case put, the Merchant was not subject to the Indian Income Tax Acts.*

* NOTE.—It was ruled in England by the Court of Appeal in the case of the Attorney General *versus* Sully, 5 Harlston and Norman 711, that where an American Firm had a Partner in England who bought goods in England, with funds remitted from America and consigned the goods to America for sale, the profits of the American Partner were not liable to English Income Tax.—(*Financial Department Order*, No. 4762, dated 18th April 1861.)

Non-Commissioned Officers for Clerkships at Out-Stations.

1—(1860.)

With reference to the Circular Memorandum, dated Horse Guards, 6th July 1857, relative to the appointment of retired or pensioned Non-Commissioned Officers to Clerkships in the Out-station branches of the War Department, His Royal Highness the General Commanding in Chief hereby notifies that he has received a communication to the effect that the Secretary of State for War has decided for the future to appoint men of the Class above-mentioned only to Clerkships in the manufacturing departments and purveying branch,—admission to the military store branch being reserved for such candidates as may be found eligible under the general regulations prescribing the qualifications of Clerks at Out-stations of the War Office.

All retired or pensioned Non-Commissioned Officers, from every arm of the Service, whose names may be favourably brought to the notice of the Secretary of State by His Royal Highness, will, upon vacancies occurring, be eligible for employment as Clerks in the purveying or manufacturing departments, provided they produce the certificates and pass the examination required by the annexed memorandum.

Candidates for these situations will continue to send their applications to the Military Secretary with the necessary certificates.

Established and Temporary Non-Commissioned Officer Clerks in the Purveying and Manufacturing Departments.

Candidates for the situation of "Established Non-Commissioned Officer Clerks" in the Purveying and Manufacturing Departments, must possess the following qualifications:—

- *1. They must be under 42 years of age.
2. They must be of good character.
3. They must be in good health.

They will, consequently, be required to produce satisfactory evidence on these points, and will not be noted for appointments without the production of a good character from their late Commanding Officers, transmitted through the Military Secretary to the Secretary of State for War, with the recommendation of His Royal Highness the General Commanding in Chief.

N.B.—This table is an extract from a more extensive yearly Return that is prepared for statistical purposes, and chiefly for the detection of any removable sources of disease, with a view to improving the healthiness of the Island. As the principal object cannot be fully attained unless the true causes of death be recorded, persons of all stations are requested, in each case of death occurring in their circle, to obtain, in writing, from the Medical Attendants the name of the fatal disease, that it may be delivered to the Policeman at the funeral place. Medical Practitioners particularly, are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all *single* cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

For Letters exceeding the weight given above, in the case of those addressed to Sardinia, &c. 2 Annas and 4 Pies are to be added for every additional quarter of an ounce, in addition to 5 Annas and 4 Pies for every additional ounce or fraction of an ounce. In the case of Letters addressed to the States of Italy not under Sardinian Postal rules, *i. e.* Sicily, Naples, Rome, and the Papal States, 1 Anna and 4 Pies are to be added for every additional quarter of an ounce, and 1 Rupee 8 Annas for every additional ounce or fraction of an ounce.

Newspapers addressed to Sardinia, Tuscany, Parma, Modena, and the Romagna, cannot be prepaid in India to their destination. The India Inland rate of Postage of one Anna for each Paper, not weighing more than six tolas, must be therefore prepaid on all Newspapers not posted in Calcutta, Madras, or Bombay.
