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GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS TO THE PUBLIC.

Notification.

The following revised RULES of the GOVERNMENT SAVINGS' BANK at Bombay, are published for general information:—

RULES.

Control.

1. A Committee, to be nominated by Government, will exercise general supervision and control over the proceedings of the Bank.

2. The Deputy Auditor and Accountant General, Sub-Treasurer, and Civil Paymaster, will be ex-officio Members of the Committee.

3. The Sub-Treasurer will be ex-officio Secretary to the Bank, and will have immediate charge of its Establishment, and be held responsible for the duties of the Bank being conducted in accordance with these Rules, the further orders which Government may from time to time issue, and the instructions of the Committee.

4. The Bank will be open daily (Sundays and general Holidays excepted) for the transaction of business, from 10 o'clock A. M. till $\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 P. M., except on Saturdays, when it will be closed at 1 o'clock P. M.
- Hours of business.
5. With the exception of European Soldiers on the effective strength of the Army, for whom other provision has been made, all classes, including Native Soldiers, Non-Effective Staff, Pensioners, Invalids, and the Wives and Children of Soldiers, may deposit their savings in the Bank, provided the amount of the deposit be not less than one Rupee or in excess of Rupees 1,500; or consist of fractions of a Rupee, except when a Draft on a Government Treasury is tendered.
- Depositors.
- Amount that may be deposited.
6. Persons residing in the Mofussil may effect the deposit and withdrawal of their savings either through the Civil Hoozoor or Divisional Paymaster's Treasuries.
- Mofussil Deposits.
7. Each Depositor will be furnished by the Bank with a "Pass Book," which Book must be produced whenever a sum is deposited or withdrawn. Every sum paid or received will be entered by the Bank in that Book. The Secretary or Actuary of the Bank will affix his signature opposite to each deposit, and the Depositor will affix his to each withdrawal.
- Mode of Deposit.
8. The name, rank, profession, business, occupation, or calling and residence of the Depositors will be entered by the Bank in the Pass Books, and the signature or mark of the Depositor must be written on the same page.
- Name, calling, and residence of Depositor to be entered, and his signature taken in the Pass Book.
9. Should a Pass Book be lost another will be supplied by the Bank on the identity of the applicant as the owner of the missing book being satisfactorily established, and after the lapse of a month a fee of One Rupee will be charged for the new Book.
- Replacement of lost and defaced Pass Books.
10. Should a Pass Book be so defaced or torn as to render the entries therein illegible, it will be retained by the Bank, a new one supplied, and a Rupee charged for the same.
11. Depositors will be permitted to deposit or withdraw at any time any sums or portions of sums deposited by them, subject to the restriction contained in Rule No. 8* of the Office Rules of the Government Savings' Bank. In case the Depositor should desire to withdraw the whole amount at his credit with interest, the Pass Book must be left at the Bank three entire days. Depositors will not, moreover, be allowed to reopen an account with the Bank until after the lapse of three months.
- Number of Deposits and Withdrawals.
12. As a general rule, the Bank will refund money only to Depositors in person, but when the Depositor is a female, or prevented from attending at the Bank by unavoidable causes, the Secretary will exercise his discretion in making payments on behalf of such persons to those duly authorized by them to receive the money by an Order written as follows:—
- Personal attendance of Depositors.
- Invalids and females exempted from attendance.
- Bombay, 186
- To The SECRETARY to the GOVERNMENT SAVINGS' BANK,

- Please pay to Rupees and place the same to my debit.
- Witness to signature (or mark as the case may be).
13. No money will be received by the Bank on account of Trusts but deposits may be made in the names of two or more persons.
- Deposits in the names of two or more persons.
14. Deposits can only be withdrawn by those at whose credit they stand in the Books of the Bank. Even deposits by a Father on behalf of his Child, a minor, can only be withdrawn by the latter, except under special circumstances, and by order of the Committee.
- Withdrawal of Deposits on behalf of Minors and others not allowed.
15. - When a deposit is made on account of a Minor, the age of the Child must be communicated, that it may be recorded by the Bank.
- Age of minors to be stated.
16. On the death of a Depositor, the Balance at credit will be paid to the Executor or Assign; but should there be no will forthcoming, then in accordance with Act XXVI. of 1855. Should, however, the Depositor have been in the Army or Navy, the Balance will be paid in conformity with the Rules of the Service to which he may have belonged.
- Withdrawal of money belonging to deceased depositors.
17. Compound Interest per annum at such rate as may be authorized by Government (it is at present $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.) will be allowed on deposits. No Interest will, however, be allowed for broken periods of a month, nor be calculated on fractions of a rupee, but deposits during the first four working days of a month will be dealt with as having been made in the preceding month in regard to the Interest due thereon.
- Rate of Interest allowed on Deposits.
18. The Accounts will be closed annually on the 30th of April, and the Balance of Interest at that date will be paid to depositors, or carried to account.
- Accounts closed annually.

* S.—It having been observed that many persons deposit money about the beginning of the month, seemingly a practice which, pursued as a system, seems scarcely to come within the legitimate use or proposed ends of a savings' bank, the Secretary is therefore empowered to close the account of any Depositor who may use the Bank as an agency by very frequently withdrawing portions of his deposits."

19. When the sum at the credit of a Depositor has continued for a month in excess of Rupees 1,500 it will be transferred to, or invested in, one of the Loans of the Government of India, in the name of the depositor. Deposits aggregating Rupees 500 and upwards may also be thus disposed of at the desire of depositors.

20. If a Government Promissory Loan Note, obtained on behalf of a Depositor, be unclaimed three months from the date of purchase or investment, it will be deposited in the General Treasury.

21. A Register will be kept by the Bank of the Accounts transferred to Government Loans, showing the names of the Proprietors, the numbers, dates, and amounts of the Notes, and the manner in which each Note was disposed of.

22. Interest will not be drawn by the Secretary to the Bank, or by the Sub-Treasurer, on the Promissory Notes obtained on behalf of Depositors, except in those cases in which the Notes may be in the custody of the former officer on behalf of minors.

23. In addition to the General Audit which all Public Accounts undergo in the Office of the Deputy Auditor and Accountant General, and that which the Committee may deem it necessary personally to undertake, a particular Audit of the Accounts of the Bank, after the close of each year, will be effected by two persons to be appointed by Government.

24. An Annual General Statement of the transactions of the Bank, showing also the Balance at the close of the year, will be submitted for the information of Government, and for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

25. Officers in charge of Civil Hoozoor and Divisional Paymaster's Treasuries are authorized to supply Pass Books, and to receive and refund Deposits on behalf of the Government Savings' Bank under the foregoing Rules; but every New Book must be sent to the Bank (after the provisions in the 8th Rule have been carried out), that it may be Registered and Indexed before being made over to the Depositor.

26. Officers in charge of Civil Treasuries will communicate to the Bank, according to prescribed forms, the amounts deposited in, and withdrawn from, their Treasuries monthly, forward a "non-negotiable Public Service Transfer Receipt" for the former, and be furnished with a similar receipt for the latter, retaining the Withdrawals in the meantime under the head of "Advances."

27. When a Depositor is about to change his place of abode, he must take his Pass Book to the Bank or to the Treasury in which his savings may have been deposited, that the requisite authority for the refund thereof elsewhere may be written immediately below the lowest entry of receipt or withdrawal in his Pass Book as follows:—

"Payable at Poona (or elsewhere, as the case may be).

Government Savings' Bank,
Bombay, 1st June 1861."

lines being drawn across the Pass Book just above and below the sentence. The accession and removal of Depositors are to be noted in the Lists of Withdrawals or Deposits.

28. As soon after the close of the Official year as possible, Officers in charge of Civil Treasuries will collect and forward to the Bank the Pass Books belonging to the Depositors resident in their Districts, that the entries therein may be checked with those in the Books of the Bank, and the Interest due in each case credited.

29. Divisional Paymasters will forward Lists of the Deposits in, and Withdrawals from, their Treasuries to the nearest Civil Treasury for incorporation in, and transmission with, the Collector's Lists as supplements thereto; and also with a view to the amounts thereof being adjusted in connection with Divisional Paymaster's monthly Receipts for advances from the Civil Department.

30. Should an account be overdrawn in consequence of a Withdrawal not having been duly debited, or through an erroneous entry in a Pass Book, the loss will have to be made good by the Officer at whose Treasury the oversight or mistake occurred.

Closed accounts.

31. When a Depositor requests that his account may be finally closed, his Pass Book is to be sent to the Bank for that purpose.

32. The transfer endorsement advertised in Rule 27 will be dispensed with in regard to Public Establishments liable to be ordered on duty from one District to another. The Deposits and Withdrawals in such cases will be made on the application and responsibility of the Heads of the Offices, the Pass Books being presented at the same time; and the disbursing Officers will specially note in their Lists the entries of such extraneous transactions, and quote the amount and date of the previous receipt or payment as per Pass Book, vide margin.

शिलकी पैका ठेवण्याचे मुंबई येथील सरकारी पेढीच्या खाली लिहिलेल्या सुधारलेल्या कानू सर्व लोकांस जाहीर होण्यासाठी प्रसिद्ध केल्या आहेत. कानू.

कामाचा बंदोबस्त.

१. सरकारांतून नेमलेले कमिटीकडे पेढीचे कामकाजाची देखरेख व बंदोबस्त राहील.

२. डेपुटी आडिटर व आर्कॉटेड जनरल, आणि सबट्रेझरर, आणि सिविल पेमास्तर हे आपले हुद्याचे नात्याने सदहू कमिटीचे मेंबराचें (म्हणजे सभासदाचें) काम करतील.

३. सबट्रेझरर हे आपले हुद्याचे नात्याने पेढीचे सेक्रेटरीचें (म्हणजे चिटणिसाचें) काम करतील; आणि पेढीतील सर्व मनुष्ये त्याचेच ताब्यांत राहातील; आणि या कानू प्रमाणे व सरकार वेळोवेळीं आणखी हुकूम करील त्याप्रमाणे व कमिटीचे हुकुमा प्रमाणे पेढीचें काम चालविण्याची जबाबदारी त्याकडे राहील.

काम करण्याचा वेळ.

४. काम चालविण्यासाठीं प्रातःकाळचे दाहा वरापासून दोन प्रहरां नंतर पावणे चार वरां पर्यंत, आदितवार व सणाचे दिवस खेरीज करून पेढी दररोज उघडी राहील. परंतु शनवारी दोन प्रहरां नंतर एक वाजतां बंद होईल.

५. लश्करची चाकरी करणारे युरोपियन सोलजरां करितां वेगळा ठराव केला आहे ते सोलजर खेरीज करून एतदेशीय शिपाई, व " नान इम्प्लिज्ड स्टॉफ " (म्हणजे पलटणीतील ज्या मनुष्यांस सरकारी इतर कामामुळे परेडीवर जावें लागत नाहीं. उदाहरण, हवलदार मेजर, व क्वार्टर मास्तर हवलदार, व ड्रिल हवलदार इत्यादि) व पेनशनर, व जायां झालेले शिपाई, व शिपायांच्या बायका व मुलें यांसुद्धां सर्व प्रकारचे लोकांस आपला शिलकी पैका पेढीत ठेवण्याचा अधिकार आहे. परंतु पैका ठेवणे तो एका रुपयाहून कमी किंवा १५०० शें रुपयाहून ज्यास्ती असूं नये, किंवा त्या रुपयांत एका रुपयाहून उणें असें नाणे असूं नये. रोख रुपये न देतां सरकारी खजिन्यावरील वरात दिली तर, त्या वरातीचे रकमंत आणि पर्ई असले तरी चिता नाहीं.

६. जिल्ह्यांत राहाणारे मनुष्यांस आपला शिलकी पैका ठेवणे व परत घेणे हें, मुलकी हुजूर खजिन्याचे किंवा डिविजनल पेमास्तराचे खजिन्याचे मारफत करण्याचा अधिकार आहे.

पैका ठेवण्याची रीत.

७. पैका ठेवणारे प्रत्येक मनुष्यास पेढीतून "पास बूक" मिळेल. तें बूक पैका भरण्याचा असेल किंवा परत घेण्याचा असेल तेव्हां हजर केलें पाहिजे. प्रत्येक रकम जी भरण्यांत येईल किंवा घेण्यांत येईल ती, पेढीवाल्यांनी त्या बुकांत न्याहावी. ठेवलेले प्रत्येक रकमेचे समोर बुकांत पेढीचे सेक्रेटरीने, किंवा आक्युअरीने सही करावी, व परत घेतलेले प्रत्येक रकमेचे समोर पैका ठेवणारांने सही करावी.

पैका ठेवणाराचें नांव व उद्योग व राहण्याचें ठिकाण पासबुकांत लिहून त्याची सही करावी.

८. पैका ठेवणाराचें नांव व दरज्या व धंदा व काम व उद्योग व राहण्याचें ठिकाण पेढीवाल्यांनी पासबुकांत न्याहावें, आणि पैका ठेवणारांने त्याच पृष्ठावर आपली सही किंवा निशाणी केली पाहिजे.

९. पासवूक हरवलें तर हरवल्ले बुकाच्या मालकच नवीन वूक मागणारा आहे अशी खात्री झाली असतां पेढीतून दुसरें वूक मिळेल; आणि एक महिना झाल्यावर नवीन बुका बदल एक रुपया 'फी' घेतील.

हरवल्ले व छिन्न भिन्न झालेले बुका वळून नवीन बुकें मिळणे.

१०. पासबुकांत लिहिलेल्या रकमा वाचतां येत नाहीं इतकें पासवूक छिन्नभिन्न झालें, किंवा फाटलें तर तें वूक पेढींत ठेवून नवीन वूक देतील व त्याबद्दल एक रुपया घेतील.

११. पैका ठेवणारांस, शिलकी पैका ठेवण्याचे सरकारी पेढीचे कचेरीचे कानूनी पैकीं *८ वे अंकाचे कानूनील ठरावा प्रमाणें, पैका ठेवू देतील; किंवा आपण ठेवलेला पैका किंवा त्याच्या काहीं भाग कोणतेही वेळीं परत घेऊं देतील. आपले खातीं पैका असेल तो सर्व व्याजासुद्धां परत घ्यावा अशी इच्छा पैका ठेवणाराची होईल तेव्हां, त्याणे पासवूक पेढींत तीन दिवस पर्यंत ठेवलें पाहिजे. आणि पैका सर्व काढून नेल्यावर तीन महिने झाल्या वाचून त्याच मनुष्याचें पेढींत पुनः खातें घालणार नाहींत.

१२. खुद्द पैका ठेवणारांसच मात्र पेढीवाले पैका परत देतील. परंतु पैका ठेवणारा स्त्री असेल, किंवा लाचार्याचे संबंधमुळें त्याच्याने पेढींत येववत नसेल तर, त्याणे खालीं लिहिल्या प्रमाणें चिठी लिहून देऊन आपले तर्फे पैका घेण्याचा अधिकार ज्या मनुष्यांस दिला असेल त्यांस पैका देणे तो, सेक्रेटारिने आपले नजरेस आल्यास द्यावा.

पैका ठेवणारांनीं जातीनें हजर व्हावें. रोग्यांस व स्त्रियांस हजर होण्याची माफी आहे.

૩. સબજેઝરર પોતાના હુદાના સમયથી પેહેડીના સેક્રેટરીનું (એટલે ચિટ્નીસનું) કામ કરશે, અને પેહેડી માંહેનાં સઘણાં માંણસો તેના તાબામાં રહેશે, અને આ કાનુનો પ્રમાણે તથા સરકાર વખતે વખતે ખીજા હુકમ કરશે તે પ્રમાણે તથા કમિટીના હુકમ પ્રમાણે પેહેડીનું કામ ચલાવવાનો જોખમ તેને માથે રહેશે.

The following Summary of Constructions of Income Tax Acts Nos. XXXII. and XXXIX. of 1860, published by the Government of India, is republished for general information :—

“FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

SUMMARY OF CONSTRUCTION OF INCOME TAX ACTS Nos. XXXII. AND XXXIX. OF 1860.

No. 172.

Penalties

Prescribed by Section CCIV, Act XXXII. of 1860, not awardable by Collectors or Commissioners.

Act XXXII. of 1860. Section CCIV. and Section CCXXXII.

Section CCXXXII. Act XXXII. of 1860, does not empower Collectors or two or more Commissioners to punish an offence against Section CCIV. of the Act, nor would a sentence passed for such offence by any of the Authorities abovementioned be rendered valid by the penalty being limited to 200 Rupees.

Section CCXXXII. Act XXXII. of 1860, applies only to cases in which the penalty imposed by the Act (i.e., the maximum amount of fine which the Act admits of for the offence) does not exceed Rupees 200, exclusive of the increased duties chargeable under the Act, as, for instance, in cases falling under Sections CCIX., CCX., and CCXI. Whenever the maximum fine, authorized by the Act, exceeds Rupees 200, as in the case of offences against Section CCIV., the case must be tried before a Magistrate.—(*Financial Department Order No. 14132, dated 10th December 1861.*)

To obviate the serious inconveniences and dangers to which the Navigation of the Indus within the Province of Sind is exposed, from the numerous sunken trees and other impediments which, from time to time, obstruct its channels, a service has been organized for the special purpose of River Conservancy, under the superintendence of the Officer Commanding Her Majesty's Indus Flotilla.

2. One or two steamers, as may be necessary, furnished with all requisite appliances, shall be employed in keeping the channels at all times clear, and the Officer or Officers who may, from time to time be placed in charge by the Conservator, shall be Deputy Conservators of the River for the time being.

3. There shall be, under the orders of the Superintendent and Conservator, a Registry of all steam and other vessels, whether belonging to Government, to Companies, or to individuals, plying on the River Indus

and its tidal channels within the Province of Sind; and to meet a portion of the expenditure incurred in keeping clear the channels of the River, an annual fee, payable on the 1st January, shall be levied, according to the following scale, approved by the Government of India:—

For a Vessel not exceeding 4 tons..... Rs. 1 per annum.
 Exceeding 4, and not exceeding 20 tons .. „ 5 per annum.
 Exceeding 20, and not exceeding 80 tons .. „ 7 per annum.
 Exceeding 80 tons, for each ton 2 annas per annum.

4. A Balance Sheet of Receipts and Expenditure shall be published annually, in the month of January, in the *Government Gazette* of the Presidency.

5. The Superintendent, Her Majesty's Indus Flotilla, as Conservator of the River Indus, and Registrar of Vessels plying thereon, is authorised to carry out, from the 1st January 1862, all details connected with the River Conservancy, Registry of Vessels, and levy of Fees now notified.

Medical Practitioners particularly, are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

Alteration in Rates of Postage.—The Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury having revised and altered the rates of Postage on Letters passing between the United Kingdom, Penang, Singapore, and China, and between those places and any of the Australian Colonies or New Zealand, without passing through the United Kingdom, the following rates of Postage are published for general information :—

I. On every Letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the Post *between the United Kingdom and Penang, Singapore, Hongkong, or China*, there shall be charged and taken a uniform British rate of One Shilling.

II. On every Letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to Penang, Singapore, Hongkong, or China, transmitted by the Post *between Penang, Singapore, Hongkong, or China, and any of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies or New Zealand, without passing through the United Kingdom*, there shall be charged and taken a uniform British rate of One Shilling.

2. Also the following additional rates :—

I. On every such Letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of Postage.

II. On every such Letter exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of Postage.

III. On every such Letter exceeding two ounces, and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six rates of Postage.

IV. On every such Letter exceeding three ounces, and not exceeding four ounces in weight, eight rates of Postage.

V. For every ounce in weight above the weight of four ounces, two additional rates of Postage will be charged, and every fraction of an ounce above the weight of four ounces will be charged as an additional ounce; and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this Clause will be estimated and charged at the sum which any such Letter would be charged with if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

3. Letters posted addressed to China *must be prepaid*, and if not, every such Letter shall be *detained and opened*, and shall be either returned or given up to the sender thereof.

4. Letters posted addressed to Penang, Singapore, or Hongkong, *must be prepaid*; if not, every such Letter shall be *forwarded* charged with the amount of the Postage to which it would have been liable if the Postage had been paid when posted, together with a further and additional rate of Postage of One Shilling.

5. Letters posted, having Postage Stamps, the value of which may be less in amount than the regulated rate of Postage to which such Letter would be liable, will likewise be *forwarded* charged with the amount of the difference between the value of the Stamp or Stamps and the Postage to which it would have been liable if the Postage had been paid when posted, together with a further and additional rate of postage of One Shilling.

6. Letters which, under the regulation of this Warrant, shall be forwarded through France shall be chargeable in addition to the British Postage to any French transit rate which may be chargeable thereon.

7. The rates of Postage chargeable on Letters and Packets under the provisions of this Warrant shall be in lieu of any rates of British Postage now chargeable by Law thereon.

Conviction of P. O. Servants.—GOVIND ABAJEE, the late Deputy Postmaster of Bhewndy, having been convicted of sending private letters in Banghy Parcels, and misappropriating Government waxcloth, has been sentenced to a fine of Rupees 5 in the first, and three months' imprisonment with hard labour in the second Sentence, and is not to be re-employed in the Department in any capacity whatever.

BUNSEE LALL, Deputy Postmaster Soorujgurh, having been convicted of stealing a Parcel, has been sentenced to three years' imprisonment with hard labour, and is never to be re-employed in any branch of the Postal Department.

K. CATHERVALOO, the late Deputy Postmaster of Raipore, having been convicted of submitting a Contingent Bill for Rs. 201 a second time, though the amount had been previously audited and disbursed, and having drawn a sum of Rs. 30 from the Treasury without due authority, and kept it in deposit for one year and upwards, has been sentenced to six months' imprisonment without labour, and to pay a fine of Rs. 200, and in default of payment a further imprisonment of six months.

He is consequently debarred from employment in the Postal Service.

HURPERSHAD, Distributing Clerk in the Allahabad Post Office, has been convicted of secreting Letters, and sentenced by the Sessions Judge to 4 years' imprisonment. The Clerk has been dismissed from the Service, and is not to be re-employed in the Department in any capacity whatever.

SHAIK BOODEEN, a Dak Runner on the Line between Coompta and Sirey, having occasioned detention to the Mail by being absent from his post, has been sentenced by the Magistrate of North Canara to one month's imprisonment with hard labour.

VENAYEK NARAYEN, Acting Overseer on the Line between Dannoor and Kulladghee, having embezzled the sum of Rs. 2-9-6 entrusted to him, has been dismissed the Service, and he is not to be re-employed in the Postal Department under any capacity whatever.

New Post Offices.—The Post Office hitherto known as the Madapollem Post Office, No. 78, in the Northern Division, will, for the future, be designated the Nursapore Post Office; its distinguishing Number remaining unaltered.

All Letters, &c. which have hitherto been despatched in Packets addressed to the Madapollem Post Office, must, in future, be enclosed in Packets addressed to the Nursapore Post Office.

Is hereby given that the Banghy Mail despatched from Aurungabad to Jaulnah on the 4th December 1861 was plundered on the evening of that day at a distance of one mile from Budnapore.

The Mail was originally despatched from Bombay on the 2nd December 1861.

Re-directed Postage.—"Inasmuch as the Post Office is certainly not bound to arrest any person's Letters in transit, and inasmuch as it is only for the convenience of the Public that the Post Office in India consents to grant such accommodation—a thing wholly unknown in England,—I do not believe that any person to whom the case is properly explained, can be so unreasonable as to question the justice of the charge. If any person should be unreasonable enough to do so, the Post Office is, in my opinion, perfectly justified in refusing to stop in transit any covers for such a person, in which case, they will be forwarded to their original address, and so become liable to Forward Postage on being returned."

Books.—Government having ruled that Books for Educational purposes should not be sent under the Frank of Officers of the Educational Department, Postmasters and Deputy Postmasters are directed to be careful not to permit them in future to pass as Service Covers.
