General Notice

ISSUED BY THE INCOME TAX COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN AND ISLAND OF BOMBAY UNDER ACT XXXII. OF 1860, SECTION XXXVII.

INCOME TAX

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st JULY 1862.

Notice is hereby given, that every person within the Town and Island of Bombay, who, by the Act XXXII. of 1860, for imposing Duties on Profits arising from Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices, is liable to the said Duties, and to return his or her Profits or Income, is hereby required to fill in a Return of his or her Profits and Income in the prescribed Form (B), and to transmit such Return, duly signed with the Declaration prescribed by the Act, to the Assessors of the Town and Island of Bombay aforesaid, at their respective Offices within 15 days from the date of the delivery of the special Notice, under the Penalties contained in the said Act.

Persons requiring Forms of Returns can procure them at the Office of the Assessors. Forms of such Returns will also be left at the usual place of Residence or Business of every person known or considered to be liable to the Duties imposed by the said Act. But any person liable to the said Duties, who may not receive such Forms, must apply for the same at the Office of any of the Assessors.

As the principal object cannot be fully attained unless the true causes of death be recorded, persons of all stations are requested, in each case of death occurring in their circle, to obtain, in writing, from the Medical Attendants the name of the fatal disease, that it may be delivered to the Policeman at the funeral place. Medical Practitioners particularly, are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

The following Extract from a Report of a recent Survey of the Cocos Islands by Lieutenant JACKSON, I. N., Commander of the Bengal Government S. V. "Krishna," is published for general information:—

"On the morning of the 16th I hove to off Narcondam Island, with the peak bearing north (true) by azimuth, and observed its longitude west of Fort Cornwallis Flagstaff, Penang, $6^{\circ}02'48''$, and its latitude deduced from observation at noon by means of two patent log distances, $13^{\circ}27'00''$ north. The height above the level of the sea being 2,150 feet, and the variation 3° easterly.

From the above observations I find that Narcondam is placed about fourteen miles too far north in the Chart of the Bay of Bengal, published by Messrs. Allen and Company in London, 8th September 1857. This is obviously an oversight, as the latitude here given agrees with that of former observers."
