Legislative Council.

19th May 1855.

The following Bill was read a second time in the Legislative Council on the 19th May 1855, and referred to a Select Committee, who are to report thereon after the 23rd of August next :—

A Bill for amending Act No. VI. of 1844.

Whereas it is prescribed, by Regulation II. of 1803 of the Madras Code, that the Collectors of the public revenue, derived from duties

Preamble.

on commodities by Sea or Land, as well as from other sources, shall be under the immediate control of the Board of Revenue, and shall obey all orders communicated to them by the authority of that Board, and it is expedient to amend Act No. VI. of 1844 in so far as it may be construed to exempt any orders or proceedings of Officers employed in the collection of Customs from the revision and control of the said Board of Revenue, and in so far as it makes the proceedings of Collectors of Customs depend upon the orders of Government in certain cases; It is enacted as follows :—

I. The Board of Revenue is empowered to revise the proceedings of all Officers employed in the collection of Sea Customs and Land Frontier Customs, under Act No. VI. of 1844, and to annul or modify the orders of such Officers.

Board, instead of Governor in Council, to pass orders in certain cases.

VI. of 1844, the proceedings of the Collectors of Customs are dependent on the orders of Government.

III. In case of imported goods being charged by a Collector of Customs, under the first Rule annexed to Schedule A of Act No. VI. of 1844, with a rate of duty above what they are liable to on the declaration of the importer, as to the place of manufacture or production, an appeal shall lie to the Board of Revenue, instead of the Governor in Council.

In continuation of Government General Order No. 616, of the 9th June 1854, the Honorable the President in Council is pleased, under the authority of a Military letter* from the Honorable the Court of Directors, to publish the following additional Rules on the subject of the Honorary Rewards granted to Soldiers by the Good Conduct Regulations:—

The Annuities for "Meritorious Service" are to be distributed in sums of £5, £10, £15, or £20, according to the merits of the case.

On the occurrence of vacancies, the Serjeants holding any of the inferior rates of Annuity have no claim to be advanced to a higher rate.

In all cases where punishments awarded by Courts Martial are wholly remitted by competent authority, Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers are to be considered in all respects as if no trial had occurred, and are eligible for the Honorary Rewards sanctioned by the Good Conduct Regulations.

Warrant and Non-Commissioned Officers, on promotion to a Commission, are entitled to retain the Medal for "Meritorious Service" or for "Good Conduct" which may have been awarded to them, although the Annuity or Gratuity lapses by such promotion.

The Medals for "Meritorious Service" or for "Good Conduct," on the death of a Soldier, are to be made over to his next of kin, unless such Medals are specially left by will to some other person.

3rd.—The Packet must not exceed two feet in length, breadth, or width.

4th.—The name and address of the sender, and any words not in the nature of a Letter, may be written or printed upon the envelope or cover of the Packet, in addition to the name and address of the person to whom it may be forwarded.

5th.—The Books, &c. may be in any binding, mounting, or covering, whether such binding, &c. be loose or attached. In the case of Prints or Maps, Rollers may accompany them, and Markers, whether of paper or otherwise, may be sent with Books or other printed papers.

The Director General of the Post Office in India has been informed by the Secretary to the Post Office in England that, owing to non-compliance with the Regulations required to be observed in the form of addressing Letters sent to Great Britain by Soldiers serving in India, many such Letters have been charged with full Postage, instead of being delivered for the reduced rate authorised by law.

2. The Regulations referred to require that every Letter posted by a Soldier serving in India, if addressed to any place out of India, should be endorsed "*Soldier's Letter*," and should be certified as such by the signature of the Commanding Officer.

The attention of Officers in Command of European Troops in India is drawn to the Regulation stated above, and it is requested that they will make it known to the Men under their command, and explain to them that Letters which are not marked as Soldiers' Letters, and which do not bear the signature of the Commanding Officer on the address, are charged with full Steam Postage, instead of being delivered for One Penny per half ounce.
