LAW CLASS.

The Perry Professor of Jurisprudence will commence an Introductory Course of Lectures at the Elphinstone Institution on Monday the 2nd proximo, at 5 P. M. These Lectures will be continued at the same hour every Monday and Thursday throughout the Term.

2. Third and Fourth Year Students will attend this Course of Lectures on the Principles of Jurisprudence as part of the general College Course.

3. Ex Students, who at the time of leaving the Institution were entitled to attend the Third or Fourth Year Class, either as Stipendiary or Free Scholars, will be allowed to attend without payment during the ensuing Term, commencing on the 2nd July and ending on the 30th November 1855.

4. Others, who may be desirous of attending, are admissible, if possessing sufficient knowledge of English, on paying in advance the sum of Rupees fifteen (15).

SYNOPSIS.

General Jurisprudence.—A general survey will be taken of Law as a Science, in reference chiefly to the views propounded in Reddie's Inquiries, Austin's Province of Jurisprudence, and Whewell's

Elements of Morality in the Cor Polity, in about forty Lectures, which will vary as nearly as possible in the following order:—1 Introductory and Historical; 2 on Classification; 3 on Universal Personal Rights, as of life, liberty, reputation, &c.; 6 on Rights of Property in external things; 7 on Rights in personam, or to the services or obligations of other persons; 6 on Family Rights; 7 on Succession; and 4 on Political Rights.

Special Courses proposed to be delivered in future Terms, for the benefit of such Students as may be desirous, after having passed through the above Course, to continue the study of Law as a distinct branch:—

1. Commercial Jurisprudence, as exhibiting the purest form of private substantive Law, National as well as International.
2. The Law of Evidence.
3. Principles of Criminal Law; and the Penal Code.
4. The mixed Titles of private substantive Law; with more special references to the Hindu and Mahomedan Laws of Succession.
5. Principles of Civil Procedure.

BOMBAY TO WIT.—By virtue of a Precept to me directed, I hereby proclaim and give notice, that the Session of Oyer and Terminer,

and GENERAL GAOL DELIVERY, will be holden before the Supreme Court of Judicature at Bombay, at the Court House, on Thursday the 5th day of July next, at 11 o'clock in the forenoon, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, and other Felonies, Perjuries, Trespasses, and other Crimes and Misdemeanors, had, done, or committed within the Town and Island of Bombay, and the Limits thereof, and the Factories subordinate thereto; and also to inquire, hear, and determine, in like manner, all Treasons, Murders, Felonies, Forgeries, Perjuries, Crimes, Extortions, Misdemeanors, Trespasses, Wrongs, Oppressions, had, done, or committed by any of Her Majesty's British Subjects in any of the Territories which now are subject to, or dependent upon the said Government of Bombay, or within any of the Dominions of the Native Princes of India in alliance with the said Government.

And also, that at the same time and place will be holden a Session of Admiralty, for the trial of all Treasons, Murders, Piracies, Robberies, Trespasses, Misdemeanors, and other Crimes and Offences, had, done, perpetrated, or committed on the High Seas.

And I hereby give notice to all persons bound to prosecute and give evidence at the above Sessions, or in any way concerned therein, that they are to attend at the time and place above mentioned, and not to depart without leave of the Court.

And I hereby give notice to all Justices of the Peace, Coroners, Escheators, and also all Chief Constables and Bailiffs of the Town and Island of Bombay and the Limits thereof, that they be then and there in their own persons, with their Rolls, Records, Indictments, and other Remembrances, to do those things which to their offices in that behalf appertain to be done.—Dated this 16th day of June 1855, and in the Eighteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria.

Legislative Council.

9th June 1855.

The following Bill was read a second time in the Legislative Council on the 2nd June 1855, and referred to a Select Committee, who are to report thereon after the 13th of September next:—

A Bill to amend Act No. XXVIII. of 1839.

Whereas it is expedient to modify the said Act so far as it relates to the height of buildings within the walls of the Fort of Bombay—

Preamble.

I. It is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of Bombay in Council, by order in writing, to be signed by one of the Secretaries to Government, to allow the erection of any building, which now is, or may be hereafter erected within the walls of the Fort of Bombay, of a greater height than 50 feet, measured from the surface of the street, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Governor in Council may allow Buildings within the Fort of Bombay to be of a greater height than 50 feet.

Is hereby given, that persons desirous of entering into a contract for the SUPPLY of HAMMOCKS, &c. as may be required by the Commissariat Department at the Presidency, for the term of two years from the date of the acceptance of the offer, may, on application at this Office from 11 A. 2. Verbal offers for the contract will be received at this Office on Friday the 29th instant, at 1 o'clock precisely, when bidders will be required to bid a per-centage above or below the prices exhibited in the above list at which the supply will be made, on the understanding that the articles supplied are to be of unexceptionable quality, and according to musters which may be seen in this Office, or of the sort usually supplied, and are to be delivered, in the first instance at the Commissariat Stores at the Presidency, if required, and afterwards to the indenting Departments, in good condition, free of all charges beyond the stipulated price, in such quantities as may from time to time be demanded, and that the same are liable to examination and rejection by the executive Commissariat Officer, or by the indenting or receiving Officer; or by a Committee of Officers appointed on the part of Government, in the event of the contractor being dissatisfied with the decision of the above Officers, or either of them; it being understood that the decision of such Committee is to be final, and binding on all parties.

3. No person will be allowed to bid for the contract unless he previously deposits in this office in cash, the sum of Rupees nine hundred and thirty-nine (939), which sum will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion, or refusal on his part to execute the necessary deed of contract when required to do so, on his offer being accepted, in which latter case he must be prepared to give unexceptionable bonded security to the further amount of Rupees three thousand seven hundred and fifty-eight (3,758), which, together with the amount previously deposited, will be held as a guarantee for the due fulfilment of his contract.

4. A contractor must comply immediately with

all emergent demands, and meet others of less urgency within the periods stated in the requisitions made upon him; in failure whereof, or if any supply be condemned by a Committee of Officers as aforesaid, the articles, or such others as may be required in lieu thereof, shall be purchased by this Department, without delay, at his risk and cost, if it be considered expedient to do so; and in all such cases thirty (30) per cent. upon the amount of expenses incurred, or a fine of any sum not exceeding Rupees fifty (50), at the option of the executive Commissariat Officer, will be levied as liquidated damages for each and every such breach of contract, it being understood that the simple condemnation of any article by a Committee constitutes a breach of contract, whether the rejected articles be replaced by the contractor or by this Department; in every such case, also, it is to be understood that the contract may be cancelled at the discretion of the Commissary General, and that if the contract be so cancelled, the cash deposit mentioned in para. 3 of this Notice will be forfeited to Government.

5. It is also to be understood that any delay, negligence, evasion, or refusal on the part of a contractor to make supplies or obey orders, or any attempt on his part, or that of his agents, to pass off articles of an inferior quality in lieu of those he is bound to supply, or any neglect to deliver them at the time and place ordered, will subject him, in every instance, to be fined to the extent of Rupees twenty-five (25), at the option of the executive Commissariat Officer, from whose order an appeal may be made to the Commissary General, whose decision is to be final; but in cases when it may be deemed fit to exact any of the penalties provided for in the preceding clause, no further penalty shall be leviable under this clause.

6. It is further to be understood, that the contractor, or an accredited agent on his part, approved of by the executive Commissariat Officer, is to attend at this Office during usual hours of business, i. e. from 10 A. M. to 5 P. M. daily (Sundays excepted), also at such other time or place as may be indicated by the executive Commissariat Officer, when he may consider it desirable for the public service to require such attendance.

7. Any party whose offer is accepted will be required to produce his sureties, for the approval of the Honorable Company's Solicitor, within fifteen days from the date of the acceptance of his offer, or the contract will be resold. No reason will be stated for rejecting any security offered.

8. Bills for articles supplied under this contract must be preferred within one month from the date of the delivery of the articles, in default of which the contractor will forfeit the full value of the supplies for which bills have not been so preferred, unless it clearly appear, to the satisfaction of the Commissary General, that the delay was unavoidable.

9. The amount of retrenchments made by the Military Board on the contractor's bills will be recovered from the first bills preferred for payment; but in the event of such retrenchments, or any portion thereof, being remitted, the amount remitted will be refunded.

10. Any party who, after offering for a contract, fails to furnish the necessary security, as provided for in Clause 7 of this Notice, will be interdicted from bidding on future occasions,

and Effects of the said Insolvents be vested in the Official Assignee of this Honorable Court, under Clause VII. of the said Act, have been duly made.

A Bill to amend Act No. XXVIII. of 1839.

Whereas it is expedient to modify the said Act so far as it relates to the height of buildings within the walls of the Fort of Bombay—

Preamble.

I. It is hereby enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of Bombay in Council, by order in writing, to be signed by one of the Secretaries to Government, to allow the erection of any building, which now is, or may be hereafter erected within the walls of the Fort of Bombay, of a greater height than 50 feet, measured from the surface of the street, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Governor in Council may allow Buildings within the Fort of Bombay to be of a greater height than 50 feet.
