PROCEEDINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT, BOMBAY.

The following Report of the Select Committee of the Council of the Governor of Bombay, for the purpose of making Laws and Regulations, is published for general information:—

Report of the Select Committee appointed to consider and report upon a "Bill for bringing under the Regulations and Acts of the Presidency of Bombay, the Province of Sattara, certain Villages and lapsed States in the Collectorate of Sholapoor and in the Southern Maratha Country, certain Lands ceded to the Government of Bombay for Railway purposes, and the District of North Canara, with the exception of the Talooka Cundapoor, and for excluding the Village of Moochundee, Purgunnah Jutt, from the operation of the Regulations and Acts of the Presidency of Bombay."

1. The Select Committee have no objections to the principle of the Bill as laid before the Council.
2. They would recommend that when referring to Sattara as under the late Rajah, it should be called in general terms "a Territory," and not be referred to as "a Province;" and when reference is made to that Territory since it came into the possession of the British Government, they would suggest it should simply be called the "Collectorate of Sattara."
3. The Committee would recommend the insertion of the following two Clauses as Section III., with a view to render the exemption of certain claims from the cognizance of the Civil Courts and the exemption enjoyed by the privileged classes from the jurisdiction of the Civil Courts uniform throughout the Deccan and Southern Maratha Country.

The Civil Courts within the Territories and Villages mentioned in the above Sections and Schedules to have no Jurisdiction on the following subjects:—

cognizable by the Civil Courts within the Territories and Villages made subject to the Regulations and Acts by the above Sections.

Damages for abuse of power under the late Government.

"Section III. Clause I.—It is hereby enacted that, in conformity with existing law in the Deccan, Khandeish, and Southern Maratha Country, claims on the following subjects shall not be

1st.—All claims for damages against persons in authority under the late Government for abuse of power during that period.

Claims against Government on account of Inams.

2nd.—All claims against Government on account of Inams.

Jagheers, Wurshasuns, Pensions, Nemnooks, and other advantages not hereditary.

3rd.—All claims against Government on account of Jagheers, Wurshasuns, Pensions, Nemnooks, and other advantages not hereditary.

Disputes regarding Revenue or alleged exactions.

4th.—All disputes regarding public Rent or Revenue payable to Government, and all complaints of exaction by Mamlutdars, or District or Village Officers.

Claims regarding Village debts, boundaries, &c.

5th.—All claims on account of Village debts, all Village boundary disputes, and disputes regarding the use of Wells and Watercourses.

Use of Wells and Watercourses.

Clause 2.—It is also further enacted that the privileges and exemptions provided in Sections III., IV., and V. Regulation XXIX. A.D. 1827, and Section V. of Regulation VII. A.D. 1830, and Regulations I. and XVI. A.D. 1831, as amended by Section VI. Act XIII. of 1842, are equally applicable in the districts now brought under the Regulations and Acts to the persons of rank therein referred to as they are in the Deccan, Khandeish, and Southern Maratha Country."

4. With these and certain unimportant verbal alterations, as shown in the annexed amended copy of the Bill, the Committee would recommend that the same be passed in the following amended form.

5. The Committee find that the whole Turuf Indapoor and the whole Turuf Sholapoor were brought under the Regulations by Regulation XXIX. A.D. 1827; but as the Villages Turwaleh, Lonee Boodroog, and Luchan appear always to have been considered in Foreign Territory, they recommend that those Villages be retained in Schedule B.; and for the same reason they would retain the Villages of Kooreegovunkope, Hoonseekuttee, Megoor, and Kara-moodde, although the whole of the Pergunnas Nowlgoond and Budamee were brought under the Regulations by Regulation VII. A.D. 1830.

BILL AS AMENDED BY THE SELECT COMMITTEE.

A Bill for bringing under the Regulations and Acts of the Presidency of Bombay the Territory of Sattara, certain Villages and lapsed States in the Collectorate of Sholapoor and in the Southern Maratha Country, certain lands ceded to the Government of Bombay for Railway purposes, and the District of North Canara, with the exception of the Talooka Cundapoor, and for excluding the Village of Mochundee, Purgunnah Jutt, from the operation of the Regulations and Acts of the Presidency of Bombay.

Whereas it is expedient for the better administration of Justice in the Territory of Sattara that the Collectorate should be brought under the Regulations and Acts of the Presidency of Bombay; And whereas certain villages which now belong to Government in Sholapoor and the Southern Maratha Country have not yet been made subject to the operation of the general Regulations and Acts affecting the Bombay Presidency; And whereas lands in certain villages have been ceded by His Highness the Guicowar and His Excellency the Nawab of Sucheen to the Government of Bombay for Railway purposes, and it is expedient that such lands should be made subject to the Regulations and Acts of the said Presidency; And whereas the District of North Canara which formed a part of the Presidency of Fort Saint George has, with the exception of the Talooka of Cundapoor, been detached from that Presidency and annexed to the Presidency of Bombay from the sixteenth day of April 1862, and now forms part of the latter, and it is expedient that the District so transferred should be brought under the Regulations and Acts of the Presidency of Bombay; And whereas the village of Mochundee, Purgunnah Jutt, in the Territory of Sattara, was inadvertently included in Act VI. of 1842, by which certain villages in the Southern Maratha Country were brought under the operation of the Regulations and Acts of the Presidency of Bombay: It is hereby enacted as follows:—

I. The villages in the

Sattara rendered subject to the Regulations and Acts of the Bombay Presidency.

Certain villages in the Southern Maratha Country rendered subject to the Regulations and Acts of the Bombay Presidency.

The Civil Courts within the Territories and Villages mentioned in the above Sections and Schedules to have no jurisdiction on the following subjects.

Damages for abuse of power under the late Government.

Claims against Government on account of Inams.

Jagheers, Wurshasuns, Pensions, Nemnooks, and other advantages not hereditary.

Disputes regarding Revenue or alleged exactions.

Claims regarding Village debts, boundaries, &c.

And regarding the use of wells and watercourses.

Collectorate of Sattara, as described in Schedule A. to this Act, shall, from and after the 1st day of January 1863, be subject to the Regulations and Acts which are or shall at any time hereafter be in force within the territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

II. The villages in the Southern Maratha Country described in Schedule B. to this Act shall, from and after the passing of this Act, be subject to the Regulations and Acts which are or shall at any time hereafter be in force within the territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

III. *Clause 1st.* It is hereby enacted that in conformity with existing law in the Deccan, Khandeish, and Southern Maratha Country, claims on the following subjects shall not be cognizable by the Civil Courts within the Territories and Villages made subject to the Regulations and Acts by the above Sections:—

1st. All claims for damages against persons in authority under the late Government for abuse of power during that period.

2nd. All claims against Government on account of Inams.

3rd. All claims against Government on account of Jagheers, Wurshasuns, Pensions, Nemnooks, and other advantages not hereditary.

4th. All disputes regarding public Rent or Revenue payable to Government, and all complaints of exaction by Mamludars, or District or Village officers.

5th. All claims on account of Village debts, all Village boundary disputes, and disputes regarding the use of wells and watercourses.

Clause 2nd. It is also further enacted that the privileges and exemptions provided in Sections III., IV. and V., Regulation XXIX. A.D. 1827, and Section V. of Regulation VII. A.D. 1830, and Regulations I. and XVI. A.D. 1831, as amended by Section VI., Act. XIII. of 1842, are

equally applicable in the districts now brought under the Regulations and Acts to the persons of rank therein referred to, as they are in the Deccan, Khandeish, and Southern Maratha Country.

All such parts of villages and lands mentioned in Schedule C. as have been delivered over for Railway purposes, rendered subject to the Regulations and Acts of the Bombay Presidency.

The District of North Canara rendered subject to the Regulations and Acts of the Bombay Presidency.

Saving of Acts, &c. done in such District before the passing of this Act.

IV. All such parts of villages and lands mentioned in Schedule C. to this Act, as have been delivered over to the Government of Bombay for Railway purposes shall, from and after the passing of this Act, be subject to the Regulations and Acts which are or shall at any time hereafter be in force within the territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

V. The District of North Canara, with the exception of the Talooka of Cundapoor, as transferred from the Presidency of Fort St. George, shall, from and after the sixteenth day of April 1862, be subject to the Regulations and Acts which are or shall at any time hereafter be in force within the Territories subject to the Presidency of Bombay.

VI. Nothing in this Act shall affect any acts done, or proceedings held, or any sentence passed, or order made in the District of North Canara previously to the passing of this Act.

VII. The village of Moochundee, Purgunnah Jutt, in the Territory of Sattara, included in Act VI. of 1842, by which certain villages in the Southern

Maratha Country were brought under the Regulations and Acts of this Act, be excluded from the operation of the Regulations and Acts of the Presidency of Bombay, anything in the said Act VI. of 1842 to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.
