The contract will only extend to Ahmednugur, but in the event of any of the mounted Corps or Public Cattle moving, the contractor must supply one month's grain for use on the march, if required, as well as for any Troops temporarily stationed at the above Stations.

Biddings for the contract will be in the Company's Rupees. No person will be permitted to bid who has not previously deposited in this Office Rupees two hundred and nineteen (219), which sum will be forfeited in the event of delay, evasion, or refusal on the part of any bidder to execute the necessary deed of contract when required to do so, in the event of his offer being accepted. Bonded security to the further amount of Company's Rupees eight hundred and seventy-six (876), in addition to the above-mentioned deposit, will also be required previous to the execution of the contract, and the whole will be held as a guarantee for its due fulfilment. Any parties whose offers are accepted will be required to produce their sureties for the approval of the Civil or Bazar Authorities, as necessary, within fifteen (15) days from the date of the acceptance of their offers, or the contract will be resold.
