ISSUED BY THE INCOME TAX COMMISSIONERS FOR THE TOWN AND ISLAND OF BOMBAY UNDER ACT XXXII. OF 1860, SECTION XXVIII.

INCOME TAX

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST JULY 1863.

Notice is hereby given that every person within the Town and Island of Bombay, who, by the Act XXXII. of 1860, for imposing Duties on Profits, arising from Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices, is liable to the said Duties, and to return his or her Profits or Income, is hereby required to fill in a Return of his or her Profits and Income in the prescribed Form (B), and to transmit such Return duly signed with the Declaration prescribed by the Act, to the Assessors of the Town and Island of Bombay aforesaid, at their respective offices, within 15 days from the date of the delivery of the Special Notice, under the penalties contained in the said Act.

Persons requiring Forms of Returns can procure them at the Office of the Assessors. Forms of such Returns will also be left at the usual place of Residence or Business of every person known or considered to be liable to the Duties imposed by the said Act. But any person liable to the Duties who may not receive such Forms, must apply for the same at the Office of any of the Assessors.

No. 271 of 1863.—The following General Order by His Excellency the Governor General of India dated Simla, 2nd May 1863, No. 50A, is republished:—

"It is announced, for general information, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India has intimated, in his Despatch No. 119, of the 30th March last, that the Secretary of State for War and His Royal

Highness the Field Marshal Commanding-in-Chief have concurred in his suggestion that, when an Officer of Her Majesty's Indian Forces of the rank of Colonel is selected for the Command of a Division in India, a Local Commission as Major-General should be conferred upon him in the same manner as such a Commission is granted to an Officer of Her Majesty's British Forces, under similar circumstances, during the time that he may hold a Divisional Command.

In every future case, therefore, of a Colonel of the Indian Army being selected for the Command of a Division on a full vacancy, the name of the Officer selected will be reported to the Secretary of State in view to the necessary steps being taken for the submission of his name for a step of local rank, the Governments in this country meanwhile, when thought necessary, conferring upon the Officer so selected the temporary rank of Brigadier-General.

"MY LORD,—The Secretary of State for War having stated that it is the practice at the War Office to provide passages home from the Colonies for the wives and families of soldiers left destitute by the conviction by Court Martial of the soldiers, I have to request that in future this practice may be adopted in India."

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.



Caution against sending Valuables by Post.—Robberies of Mails in various parts of the interior have lately become unfortunately of frequent occurrence, and there seems reason to infer that the highwaymen have been actuated either by information received from accomplices connected with bankers and firms, or by a suspicion that the Mails contain Gold, Banknotes, or other valuables.

Such depredations not only interfere with the safe and speedy transport of the important portion of the Mails, viz. that containing letters, but they entail upon owners of property heavy losses, as well as seriously cripple the efficient working of the Post Office Department.

Government orders on the subject of sending valuables by post are plain and explicit; they are now re-promulgated, and the public are hereby cautioned against the practice, in the hope that they will see the advisability of not sending by the Government post, gold or other valuables, as, by so doing, the public Mails are exposed to peril and robbery, and their own property to risk, since the Post Office under the Postal Act* is freed from responsibility for valuables enclosed in Parcels.

* POSTAL ACT.—Section 49.

“The Government shall not be responsible for any loss or damage which may occur in respect of any thing entrusted to the Post Office for conveyance; and no person employed by the Government in the Post Office Department shall be responsible for any such loss or damage, unless that person shall cause such loss or damage negligently, maliciously, or fraudulently.”

Postal Regulations.

“In order to protect as far as possible the Mail from the chance of robbery, Officers in charge of Post Offices shall not knowingly receive Coin, Bullion, Precious Stones, Jewels, for despatch either by Letter or Banghy Post.

If a Post Master be informed or otherwise becomes acquainted with the fact that any letter or parcel contains valuables, he should refuse to receive it.”

Her Majesty's Post Master General having intimated that a Postal Convention has been concluded with Prussia, Bremen, and Hamburg, the public are hereby informed that the following Rates of Postage (British and Foreign combined) will be collected upon Letters forwarded through the United Kingdom to Germany and to certain countries, the correspondence of which passes through Germany. The Postage on these Letters may be paid in advance, or it may be paid on delivery at the option of the Senders. All Unpaid Letters will be liable to an increased charge on delivery:—

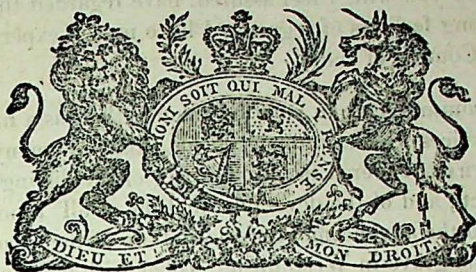

The generous and noble character of the late Sir JAMES OUTRAM, his devotion to duty, and his brilliant services, both Civil and Military, won for him the admiration and esteem both of the Government and of the people of India. The Governor General feels assured that, while deploring the loss which the Nation has sustained in his death, the Members of both Services, and the Indian community generally, will appreciate the high tribute which has been paid to his memory by the Government of the Queen.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE RIGHT HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA IN COUNCIL.

MY LORD,—Your Lordship will have learnt from the public Papers that death has deprived the Government of India of one of the most distinguished of its servants in the person

of Sir JAMES OUTRAM; and you will, I feel assured, have regarded the demise of this gallant Officer with the same strong feelings of regret as I have myself experienced in common with all my colleagues in the Council of India.

2. I have now to communicate to your Excellency that, as a mark of our high appreciation of the eminent services which, on many fields, and in many political and military capacities, Sir JAMES OUTRAM rendered to his country; of the distinguished purity and disinterestedness of his conduct; and of the devotion which he at all times evinced, both to the service of the State and to the advancement of the welfare of the people of India, we have seen his remains laid in the grave in Westminster Abbey with befitting solemnity and respect, and defrayed the expense of the Funeral from public Funds.

3. From the honors thus bestowed by the Government and the reverence paid by all classes of the community to an Officer who, by his own unaided exertions, raised himself to the highest posts under your Government, the Members of the Public Services in India will learn that duty done in that country is not watched less earnestly, or appreciated less cordially, in England, for the distance at which it is performed.
