The following Declarations between Great Britain and Bavaria are republished for general information:—

Extract from the "London Gazette" of Tuesday, the 9th December 1862.

DECLARATIONS exchanged between the GOVERNMENTS of GREAT BRITAIN and of BAVARIA, relative to the duties payable on the withdrawal of the property of subjects of the one country from the territories of the other:—

British Declaration.

The undersigned, Her Britannic Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of His Majesty the King of Bavaria, being duly authorised by his Government, hereby declares that the subjects of His Majesty the King of Bavaria are at liberty to withdraw their property from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and from the British colonies and possessions, without being called upon to pay any duty as aliens on the withdrawal of it, and without paying any other duty than such as the subjects of Her Britannic Majesty are equally liable to pay.

In witness whereof the undersigned has signed the present Declaration, which is to be substituted for the Declaration of the 30th April 1836, and has affixed thereto the seal of his arms.

Bavarian Declaration.

His Majesty the King of Bavaria, Count Palatine of the Rhine, Duke of Bavaria, of Franconia, and in Suabia, &c., having learnt that, according to the laws in force in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and in the British colonies and possessions, no duty whatever is collected on the exportation and transfer of inheritances and other property belonging to Bavarian subjects, the undersigned Minister of State for the Department of the Royal House and for Foreign Affairs, declares by these presents, in the name of His Majesty's Government, that no deduction shall henceforth be made under the title of *droit d'aubaine ou de détraction*, upon inheritances and other property in Bavaria belonging to subjects of Her Britannic Majesty, whether in the United Kingdom or in the British colonies and possessions; and that the abolition of such duties in favour of those subjects shall have its full and entire effect, not only in all future cases, so long as the laws shall not be changed in this respect in the United Kingdom and in the British colonies and possessions, but also in all those cases in which, up to the date of the signature of the present Act, the duties thus abolished shall not have been actually and definitely collected.

In witness whereof this Declaration, destined to be substituted for the Declaration of the 10th of April 1836, and to be exchanged against a similar Declaration on the part of the Government of Her Britannic Majesty, securing perfect reciprocity to Bavarian subjects, has been delivered by the undersigned Minister of State, and sealed with the seal of his Arms.

The following Convention between Great Britain and Belgium is republished for general information:—

CONVENTION BETWEEN HER MAJESTY AND THE KING OF THE BELGIANS, RELATIVE TO JOINT STOCK COMPANIES.

SIGNED AT LONDON, NOVEMBER 13, 1862.

[Ratifications exchanged at London, December 8, 1862.]

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Majesty the King of the Belgians, having judged it expedient to come to an understanding in order to define, within their respective dominions and possessions, the position of commercial, industrial, and financial Companies and Associations constituted and authorised in conformity with the laws in force in either of the two countries, have resolved to conclude a Convention for that purpose, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honourable John, Earl Russell, Viscount Amberley of Amberley and Ardsalla, a Peer of the United Kingdom, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and the Right Honourable Thomas Milner Gibson, a Member of Her Bri-

Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges, ayant jugé utile de s'entendre, pour régulariser dans leurs Etats et Possessions respectifs, la situation des Compagnies et Associations commerciales, industrielles, et financières, constituées et autorisées suivant les lois particulières à chacun des deux pays, ont résolu de conclure une Convention dans ce but, et ont muni à cet effet de leurs pleins pouvoirs, savoir:—

And His Majesty the King of the Belgians, the Sieur Sylvain Van de Weyer, His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to Her Britannic Majesty, Grand Cross of the Order of Leopold, decorated with the Iron Cross, Grand Cross of the Order of Charles III. of Spain, of the Order of the Ernestine Branch of Saxony, of the Tower and Sword, of St. Maurice and St. Lazarus, Commander of the Legion of Honour, &c.;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties declare that they mutually grant to all Companies and other Associations, commercial, industrial, or financial, constituted and authorised in conformity with the laws in force in either of the two countries, the power of exercising all their rights, and of appearing before the Tribunals, whether for the purpose of bringing an action, or for defending the same, throughout the dominions and possessions of the other Power, subject to the sole condition of conforming to the laws of such dominions and possessions.

ARTICLE II.

It is agreed that the stipulations of the preceding Article shall apply as well to Companies and Associations constituted and authorised previously to the signature of the present Convention, as to those which may subsequently be so constituted and authorised.

ARTICLE III.

The present Convention is concluded without limit as to duration. Either of the High Powers shall, however be at liberty to terminate it by giving to the other a year's previous notice. The two High Powers, moreover, reserve to themselves the power to introduce into the Convention, by common consent, any modifications which experience may show to be desirable.

ARTICLE IV.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London in one month, or sooner if possible.

Done at London, the thirteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.

ARTICLE II.

His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to publish, for general information, the following arrangement concluded under instructions from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, by Her Majesty's Consul and British Agent at Jeddah with the Governor of that place, prohibiting the commerce by British subjects in Wines or Spirits at Jeddah, and defining the conditions on which they will be allowed to be imported.

Jeddah being held to be peculiarly sacred from its situation as the port of the centre of the Mahomedan religion, negotiations have taken place between the British and Ottoman Governments with a view to prohibit the importation to Jeddah of Wines or Spirits, and orders to that effect having arrived from the Sublime Porte, and Her Britannic Majesty's Consul at Jeddah having received instruction from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, the following articles have been agreed upon, and every means shall be taken to ensure their due execution, so that, with the exception of a sufficient quantity for the personal use of the British Christian subjects, the importation of Wines or Spirits at Jeddah shall be prohibited.

In witness whereof the following Articles have been signed by Her Britannic Majesty's Consul at Jeddah, the 29th day of November 1862.

ARTICLE I.

The commerce in Wines or Spirits at Jeddah shall be prohibited.

ARTICLE II.

British Christian subjects shall be permitted to import sufficient Wines or Spirits for their own personal use, the quantity to be settled each month by the local Government and the British Consul; but taverns shall be prohibited, and no Wines or Spirits shall be sold to Mussulmans.

ARTICLE III.

The *status quo* shall continue until the 1st of January 1863, on which date the taverns shall be closed, and these Articles shall come into operation.

As the principal object cannot be fully attained unless the true causes of death be recorded, persons of all stations are requested, in each case of death occurring in their circle, to obtain, in writing, from the Medical Attendant, the name of the fatal disease, that it may be delivered to the Policeman at the funeral place. Medical Practitioners, particularly, are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all *single cases*, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

Notice to Mariners.

Notice is hereby given that a Shoal having only three fathoms on it has been discovered off Rus Jask at the entrance of the Persian Gulf on the Mekran Coast.

The Shoal is one mile long North and South, and three-quarters of a mile East and West; the bottom is rocky, with coral and shells; soundings irregular, from 3 to 4 fathoms; the shoalest part bears by compass W. 13° S. from the old building or tomb on Rus Jask, a cliff about 25 feet above the level of the Sea, and is distant from it about 3½ miles.

To the northward of the Shoal there are 5 and 6 fathoms, on its eastern edge 7 fathoms, and between it and Rus Jask in mid-channel 5 and 6 fathoms. To the southward the soundings deepen rapidly to 50 fathoms at about one mile and a half distant, and to the westward they deepen to 13 fathoms at only half a mile off.

As the soundings to the southward deepen so suddenly, the lead would be of little use to indicate the proximity of the Shoal to a vessel approaching it.

N. B.—There may be still less water on it than three fathoms, as a very minute examination of it has not been made.

2. REGISTERED LETTERS.

Camp Nyneetaz, 21st October 1862.

With the sanction of His Excellency the Governor General in Council, the following orders in the Postal Department are published for general information:—

RULES RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF LETTERS SENT THROUGH THE POST OFFICE.

By the payment of a fee of Four Annas in addition to the ordinary Postage, *both of which must be prepaid in Stamps*, any Letter, Newspaper, Pamphlet, or Book may be registered to any place under the Government of India or in the United Kingdom and Colonies.

2. Information regarding the Foreign Countries to which Letters can be registered, and the conditions thereof, will be found in the "Steam Postage Schedule for the Post Offices in India."

3. Letters intended to be registered must be brought to the Post Office at least half an hour before the time fixed for closing the Mail; if brought after that time, they will be stamped "Too Late," and retained for the following Mail.

4. A Postmaster or other official, on being applied to register a Letter, will grant a receipt, and retain a copy on the counterpart of the Cheque Book for the purpose; the dated Office Stamp should be affixed to the receipt, and also to the copy.

5. So soon as a letter is registered, the Postage Labels thereon should be defaced, and the Special Stamp "*Registered*," should be affixed; the address and weight should then be entered in the *yellow cover*, after which, the Letter and the cover should be folded up together, and placed under lock and key, until the time for closing the Mail.

6. On opening a Mail Packet, the Postmaster should carefully examine the Registered Letters, and compare the weight of each with the entries thereof in the Chulan and yellow cover; the Office Dated Stamp should then be affixed to them, and also to the yellow cover, after which they should be disposed of as prescribed in the rules for opening and distributing the Mail.

7. In disposing of a Registered Letter, care must be taken to ensure *proof* of transfer by each official through whose hands it passes from the time of receipt to that of delivery; an acknowledgment must therefore be taken by initials, or otherwise, from each person into whose hands it may be given for *custody, despatch, or delivery*.

8. On delivery of a Registered Letter, the Postman should obtain the signature of the addressee on the yellow cover; the "original" receipt will be retained in the Delivery Office, and the "duplicate" returned to the Office of Despatch *by the first Mail*.

9. The "duplicate" receipt, on being returned, should be pasted to the counterpart in the Cheque Book; when not received back within the proper time, it should be called for, and a note of the requisition made on the duplicate receipt in the Cheque Book.

10. On a Registered Letter having to be *re-directed*, the duplicate portion of the yellow cover should be receipted and returned to the Office of Despatch, with a remark showing the Office to which it has been forwarded.

11. When a Registered Letter cannot be delivered, it should be forwarded without delay, together with the original yellow cover, to the Office of Despatch, in view to be returned to the Sender, and, if he cannot be found, it should be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

12. When a Registered Letter is found to be missing, the Postmaster must *immediately* submit a full and clear report of the circumstance to the Inspecting Postmaster and Postmaster General, and also to the Office of Despatch, in view to a searching inquiry being at once instituted to ascertain *where and how* it disappeared.

13. The Postmaster General will, without delay, bring to the notice of the Director General the loss or theft of a Registered Letter, and on completion of the inquiry instituted thereon, report the result.

14. By Section 49 of the Postal Act, Government does not guarantee, and is not responsible for, the safety of a Registered Letter, but any official through whose neglect it may be lost or made away with, will be called to strict account, and may be required to make good any loss.

15. Registration makes the transmission of a Letter more secure, by rendering it practicable to trace it from one official to another; if, therefore, by neglect of prescribed precautions, it is lost or made away with, the officials of the Post Office will have no ground for complaint if held responsible for the consequences of their neglect.

16. As registration does not involve a receipt for the *contents* of a Letter, and as abstraction thereof may take place *before* as well as *after the cover is posted, and even after delivery*, it is recommended that the addressee who expects valuable enclosures, should, at the time of granting a receipt, open the letter *in the presence of the Postman*.

17. A Letter containing Bank Notes, Postage Stamps, or other valuable articles, should, as a rule, be registered, and should be securely folded, or enclosed in a substantial envelope, and *always sealed with wax*, in order to prevent, as far as possible, its being tampered with.

N. B.—A Letter is not ordinarily of importance to any person excepting the addressee; but if valuable articles are enclosed, the case is otherwise, and temptation is thrown in the way of the numerous persons in the Post Office through whose hands it passes. Hence the precaution of registering such Letters is recommended.
