" REPORT.

On careful consideration of the statements made before us we are of opinion that the collision by which the Pattamar 'Gunesh Persad' received injury was accidental. No blame appears to us to attach to the Master or Officers of the 'Tilly.'

The Master of the 'Tilly' appears to have adopted every proper precaution, to have acted according to the Admiralty instructions, and to have used every exertion to save the Crew and Passengers of the Pattamar after the collision, as well as to save the Pattamar.

The preponderance of the evidence elicited is to the effect that had the Pattamar continued her course, instead of porting her helm, the collision would not have taken place.

"With reference to your letter No. 2378, dated 11th instant, and to previous correspondence relative to the proper interpretation to be given of the term 'Piece Goods,' as used in Schedule A of Act XI. of 1862, I am directed to state that the President in Council, fully concurring in the view now taken by the Lieutenant Governor of Bengal, is pleased to determine that all goods manufactured in the piece, whether imported in the piece or cut, shall be henceforward admitted at the lower rate of duty, viz. 5 per cent. ad volorem, and that the excess of duty levied under the contrary ruling of September last shall be at once refunded."

It is requested that all applications for refund may be made before the 15th October next, accompanied by the Custom House receipts of payment. After that date no applications for refund on the above account will be admitted.

SIR,—With reference to your letter No. 2581, of the 24th July 1862, I am desired to acquaint you for the information of the Government of Fort St. George, that unlimited service men of the Indian Army who have entered the line continue on the same footing in regard to renewal and bounty (gratuity) on renewal after 17 and 20 years' service as if they remained in the Indian Army, viz:—

2. With regard to kit money no such allowance was made to unlimited service men of the Indian Army, and there appears to the Government of India to be no reason adduced for extending it to them now.

No. 364 of 1863.—The following General Order by His Excellency the Commander in Chief in India, dated Camp Lucknow, 13th January 1863, is republished:—

" Head Quarters, Camp Lucknow, 13th January 1863.

Under instructions from Government, the Commander in Chief is pleased to direct that in supersession of all previous Orders, Soldiers who have volunteered for General Service from Her Majesty's Indian Forces shall in future be discharged, invalided, and pensioned precisely in accordance with the Forms and Regulations in force in the British Service, whether they may have elected for the Indian or British scale of pension, under the provision of G. O. C. C. of the 10th April 1861.

2. For the present, and till further orders, it will, however, be necessary in the case of men who apply for pension under the Indian Rules to furnish, in addition to the documents prescribed in Her Majesty's Regulations, the roll and certificate of character bitherto required under Articles 8 and 9, Section XLIV. of the Bengal Military Regulations. This roll and certificate should be at once forwarded to the Officer in charge of the office of the Adjutant General of the Army at the Presidency, for verification and submission to Government, in order that the proper rate of pension due to the Soldier may be authoritatively fixed without delay.

3. A certificate showing the exact amount of pension to which each Soldier is entitled under the Indian rules will be forwarded by the Government of India for the guidance of the authorities in England, by whom all discharge

papers will be finally dealt with.

4. Applications for discharge by indulgence or otherwise, of men on the Unattached List, are to be forwarded by heads of departments, in the first instance, to the Regiments on whose Rolls the men are borne, with a Memo. of the applicant's conduct. The proceedings of the Regimental Boards assembled at the Head Quarters of the Regiment to verify the man's service, &c. will then be sent to the Officer under whom the applicant may be serving, for signature of the 'declaration' which must be attested by the departmental Officer who will then return the documents to the Regiment for immediate disposal in the usual manner.

5. Officers Commanding the new Regiments are here reminded that, the documents of Soldiers applying for discharge by purchase, and of men desirous of remaining in India, or of residing anywhere out of England on discharge, are in all cases to be sent to the Adjutant General Her Majesty's Forces at Head Quarters for completion.

No. 369 of 1863.—His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to allow Warrant Officers of all Departments the privilege of receiving Malt Liquor from the Public Stores when available, to the extent of one quart per day at the cost price to Government, viz. five annas per quart or five rupees per dozen exclusive of bottles.

- 2. Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers of Departments will continue to enjoy this privilege as hitherto at the Canteen rate, viz. three annas per quart or three rupees per dozen exclusive of bottles.
- 3. Arrack may be issued from Stores to Warrant and Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers of Departments to the extent of one dram each per day 24 degrees under proof at the Canteen rate of one anna per diem.
- 4. Issues may be made weekly or monthly on days to be fixed by Executive Commissariat Officers upon payment Indents from local Departmental Heads. Malt Liquor will be supplied in wood or in bottle according to the extent of the demand. Proof spirit will be issued with such deduction in quantity as will be equivalent to reduction to 24 degrees under proof.
- 5. The Indents will show on the Reverse fold the number of each grade for whom Liquor is drawn, and the quantity already received during the month. Commanding Officers may limit this indulgence on the understanding that when the Stock is only sufficient to meet the wants of Canteens, issues to Warrant and Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers of Departments must be temporarily suspended. There can be no issues at Stations where there are no European Troops.
 - 6. Articles 98 and 99 of Section X. Third Appendix Military Code are cancelled.

Paragraph 2 .- You have informed His Excellency the Commander in Chief that it was never contemplated to appoint Officers of one Presidency to the Army Staff Departments or to Corps of the regular establishment of another Presidency, and that so long as there are Officers of the Bengal Army available for employment, you cannot sanction the appointment of Madras or Bombay Officers to Corps on the regular Bengal Establishment.

3. You have also stated, I observe, that Officers of other Presidencies have always been freely employed in the Punjaub and Hyderabad and other Irregular Forces under the orders of the Government of India, and are of course still eligible for such situations.

4. I approve of the decision you have formed upon the subject.

5. In my Despatch, No. 319, dated 18th August 1861, paragraph 46, I observed, with reference to the subject, that I should not object to the practice of Officers of the Staff Corps in one Presidency being employed in another being extended, on special occasions, but that I concurred in your opinion that ordinarily it would be inconvenient to bring Officers of all the Presidencies promiscuously into the several Staff Departments of the Armies of Bengal, Madras and Bombay.

I consider therefore that so long as there are Officers of the Bengal Army available and qualified for employment, Madras and Bombay Officers should not be appointed to Corps on the regular Bengal Establishment.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

In publishing for general information and guidance, the subjoined Resolution of Government, No. 670, dated the 2nd July 1863, the undersigned takes this opportunity to point out that, the mileage rate referred to in Note b. appended to Rule 24 of the Rules promulgated with Circular from this Department No. 586, dated 9th July 1860, is claimable only when an Uncovenanted Civil Servant, holding a Gazetted appointment, is required to proceed by Dâk under special authority from Government.

RESOLUTION.—The Governor in Council is of opinion that it was never the intention of the Government of India that travelling allowance at the rates laid down in the Resolution No. 5092, dated 10th September 1858, should be passed to Subordinate Servants of Government moved from one situation to another, without any pecuniary gain, and for the convenience of the Public Service only, and that Mr. Lodwick erred in stating that Manulutdars, Carcoons, &c., were entitled to travelling allowance at the rates laid down in that Resolution.

2. To Subordinate Servants, that is, Servants of Government who do not hold Gazetted appointments, it will be sufficient, His Excellency in Council is of opinion, as suggested by Mr. Hart, to allow them a travelling allowance when transferred under the abovementioned circumstances at the daily or monthly rate of Batta of their rank for a period not exceeding that allowed by Section XIII. of the Uncovenanted Absentee Rules for joining an appointment.

2nd.—There must be no enclosure except Newspapers or other Printed Papers.

3rd.—There must be no other writing or marks upon the Newspapers or Printed Papers than the name and address of the person to whom they are sent, nor anything upon the cover but such name and address, the printed title of the papers, and the printed name and address of the Publisher or the Vendor who sends them.

4th.—No packet must exceed 2 feet in length, width, or depth, or three pounds in weight.

Stamped Note Paper and Envelopes.—It having been ascertained in a number of instances that losses of Letters which had been attributed unjustly to the Post Office were in reality caused by the dishonesty of Peons and Servants of Posters, who made away with them for the sake of the Stamps affixed, it is considered advisable to remind the Public that they can protect themselves, to a great extent, by writing upon Stamped Note Paper or Stamped Envelopes, the Stamps of which it is illegal to sell or use except upon the Envelope and Paper upon which they were originally impressed. Stamped Paper and Envelopes are to be had, of the value of One Anna and Half Anna per cover or sheet, at the following prices, at all Post Offices:—
