ISSUED BY THE INCOME TAX COMMISSIONERS FOR THE TOWN AND ISLAND OF BOMBAY UNDER ACT XXXII. OF 1860, SECTION XXXVII.

INCOME TAX.

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST JULY 1864.

Notice is hereby given that every person within the Town and Island of Bombay who, by the Act XXXII. of 1860, for imposing Duties on Profits arising from Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices, is liable to the said Duties, and to return his or her Profits or Income, is hereby required to fill in

a Return of his or her Profits and Income in the prescribed Form, and to transmit such Return duly signed with the Declaration prescribed by the Act, to the Assessors of the Town and Island of Bombay aforesaid, at their respective Offices, within fifteen days from the date of the delivery of the Special Notice, under the penalties contained in the said Act.

Persons requiring Forms of Returns can procure them at the Office of the Assessors. Forms of such Returns will also be left at the usual place of Residence or Business of every person known or considered to be liable to the duties imposed by the said Act. But any person liable to the Duties who may not receive such Forms must apply for the same at the Office of any of the Assessors.

The following letter from the Secretary to the Government of India, No. 3843, of the 16th June 1863, to the Secretary to the Government of Bengal, is published for general information :—

“With reference to your letter No. 2378, dated 11th instant, and to previous correspondence relative to the proper interpretation to be given of the term ‘Piece Goods,’ as used in Schedule A of Act XI. of 1862, I am directed to state that the President in Council, fully concurring in the view now taken by the Lieutenant Governor of Bengal, is pleased to determine that all goods manufactured in the piece, whether imported in the piece or cut, shall be henceforward admitted at the lower rate of duty, viz. 5 per cent. *ad valorem*, and that the excess of duty levied under the contrary ruling of September last shall be at once refunded.”

It is requested that all applications for refund may be made before the 15th October next, accompanied by the Custom House receipts of payment. After that date no applications for refund on the above account will be admitted.

No. 386 of 1863.—The following Resolution, by the Government of India in the Financial Department, dated 6th June 1863, No. 2392, is published:—

RESOLUTION.—On further consideration, the Honorable the President in Council is of opinion that the procedure regarding Indents for Europe Stores is still encumbered by unnecessary routine.

Practically, it is not advisable that the Financial Department should be charged with any such executive duty as the collection of Indents and their transmission to England. The error on this point was corrected by the orders of 22nd November 1862 and 25th April 1863, but by the latter order the Financial Department is still responsible for scrutinising the details of the Indents for Europe Stores, though these are now to be sent to England direct on the responsibility of the Local Governments, or of the Administrative Secretariats of the Supreme Government.

With a view to that scrutiny, the order of 25th April 1863 directed that a copy of each Indent for Europe Stores be forwarded from every Department in every part of India, through the channels already prescribed, to the Financial Department, for information merely, and to enable it to object to any item, or to suggest its supply from the surplus stock of some other Department.

But as the Financial Department has not the Returns of Stock in the several Departments throughout India, nor any establishment for scrutinising them were the Returns to be obtained, it does not possess the means of discharging the above-mentioned duty.

The Administrative Departments of the Supreme Government and the Local Governments are responsible for seeing, before they indent on England for any supplies for a Department, whether the articles applied for exceed the established proportion, and whether they cannot be provided from the surplus stock of some other Department under their control, and in the event of any unusually heavy accumulation of stock, doubtless the obvious course of informing other Governments and Departments of the excess, with a view to their taking off a portion of the surplus, would not be neglected by the Government concerned.

The whole responsibility, therefore, both for the Stores to be indented for from England, and for the judicious disposal of any unusual surplus, belongs properly to the Governments and Departments concerned, and the Financial Department should confine itself to such check as can be exercised through the Annual Budget Estimates, as is the case in England, and as is the case also with a great deal of Commissariat, Ordnance, and other expenditure.

Accordingly, the order which directed the transmission to the Financial Department of a copy of every Indent for Europe Stores is hereby rescinded.

No. 387 of 1863.—The price of Chargers selected from the Remounts is fixed at Rupees 600.

No. 388 of 1863.—The following General Order by His Excellency the Governor General of India, dated 26th June 1863, No. 90A, is republished:—

“No. 90A of 1863.—His Excellency the Governor General finds it necessary to call attention to Article 5, Section XLVIII. of the Military Regulations, by which Military Officers ‘are strictly prohibited from taking any part in the management of Banks in India, or from being connected with Banks or any other trading Companies, except as simple Shareholders, the only exception to this Rule being in favour of ex-Officio Directors or Secretaries of the Government Banks.’

The late Court of Directors intimated in their Despatch, in the Financial Department, No. 42, dated the 11th October 1854, that this prohibition was not intended to apply to *Invalid Officers*, but no other class of Officers is exempted from the operation of the foregoing Rule.

Medical Practitioners, particularly, are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.

In publishing for general information and guidance, the subjoined Resolution of Government No. 670, dated the 2nd July 1863, the undersigned takes this opportunity to point out that, the mileage rate referred to in Note *b*. appended to Rule 24 of the Rules promulgated with Circular from this Department No. 586, dated 9th July 1860, is claimable only when an Uncovenanted Civil Servant, holding a Gazetted appointment, is required to proceed by Dâk under special authority from Government.

RESOLUTION.—The Governor in Council is of opinion that it was never the intention of the Government of India that travelling allowance at the rates laid down in the Resolution No. 5092, dated 10th September 1858, should be passed to Subordinate Servants of Government moved from one situation to another, without any pecuniary gain, and for the convenience of the Public Service only, and that Mr. Lodwick erred in stating that Mamlutdars, Carcoons, &c., were entitled to travelling allowance at the rates laid down in that Resolution.

2. To Subordinate Servants, that is, Servants of Government who do not hold Gazetted appointments, it will be sufficient, His Excellency in Council is of opinion, as suggested by Mr. Hart, to allow them a travelling allowance when transferred under the abovementioned circumstances at the daily or monthly rate of Batta of their rank for a period not exceeding that allowed by Section XIII. of the Uncovenanted Absentee Rules for joining an appointment.

Eight pie Stamps can be obtained at the Post Office and other Stamp Vendors.

The quarter ounce weight that heretofore obtained for correspondence to the United Kingdom through France has been dispensed with.

The alteration consists of the abolition of the present rate of French postage (3d. per quarter ounce), and the substitution of a rate of 4d. per half ounce, the English postage (6d. per half ounce) remaining as at present.

Stamped Note Paper and Envelopes.—It having been ascertained in a number of instances that losses of Letters which had been attributed unjustly to the Post Office were in reality caused by the dishonesty of Peons and Servants of Posters, who made away with them for the sake of the Stamps affixed, it is considered advisable to remind the Public that they can protect themselves, to a great extent, by writing upon Stamped Note Paper or Stamped Envelopes, the Stamps of which it is illegal to sell or use except upon the Envelope and Paper upon which they were originally impressed. Stamped Paper and Envelopes are to be had, of the value of One Anna and Half Anna per cover or sheet, at the following prices, at all Post Offices:—

Post Line between Goa and Sadashewghur.—A Post Line has been opened between Goa and Sadashewghur, 58 miles apart. The former, which is at present the nearest Telegraph Station to the latter, is available in both directions for Telegrams, which can also be sent by "Express," if desirable, at Express rates of Postage—4 annas per mile.

Telegrams meant to be forwarded by the daily Post should not be later than 10 A.M. in reaching Goa.
