MEMORANDUM of information on the points contained in paragraph 4 of the Government Circular, No. 3314, of 13th November 1856.

1. Tax on houses is levied variously from Annas 2 to Rupees 2-4-0 as sanctioned by Government in their Resolution, No. 1741, of 27th June 1857.

2. The realizations of the tax have been credited during the year to which the account relates, viz. 1862-63, Rupees 548-8-0* remain uncollected, owing to the absence of some of the owners of houses and other unavoidable causes. Measures are being taken to recover them.

3. No revenue from any unauthorized source has been derived during the year 1862-63.

4. The strength and cost of the Municipal Establishment are as follows:—

Remuneration to Coolkurnee and Patell at 5 and 3 Rupees per cent. respectively on the annual realizations of the tax.

One Sweeper at Rs. 2 per month.

One Peon at Rs. 4 per month.

Four Scavengers, 2 at Rs. 3, and 2 at Rs. 2 per each month.

In the Government Resolution, No. 1900, of 7th September 1860, 3 scavengers were sanctioned to be entertained, viz. 2 at 3 Rs. each, and 1 at 4 Rs., but subsequently the services of a scavenger being considered necessary, two individuals were employed within the sum of Rupees 4, viz. at 2 Rs. each.

5. The strength and cost of the Establishment entertained by the Municipality were during each month of the year 1862-63 within the limits of the authority accorded.

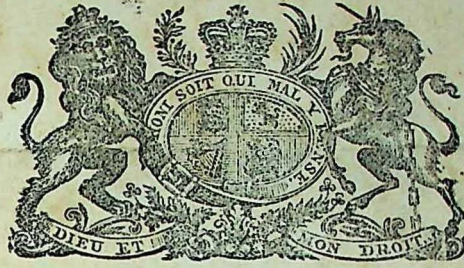

His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to republish for general information the following Proclamation issued by the Government of India under date the 2nd instant :—

"PROCLAMATION.

HOME DEPARTMENT.

Fort William, the 2nd December 1863.

WHEREAS the death of the RIGHT HONORABLE JAMES, EARL OF ELGIN AND KINCARDINE, K.T., G.C.B., and G.M.S.I., has caused a vacancy in the office of Governor-General of India; And whereas it has been provided by the 50th Section of the Act 24 and 25 Victoria, Cap. 67, that "if any vacancy shall happen in the office of Governor-General of India, when no provisional successor shall be in India to supply such vacancy, then, and in every such case, the Governor of the Presidency of Fort St. George, or the Governor of the Presidency of Bombay, who shall have been first appointed to the office of Governor by Her Majesty, shall hold and execute the said office of Governor-General of India and Governor of the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal until a successor shall arrive, or until some person in India shall be duly appointed thereto;" And whereas there is not in India any provisional successor to supply the vacancy in the office of Governor-General of India, It is hereby proclaimed that HIS EXCELLENCY COLONEL SIR WILLIAM THOMAS DENISON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, and Governor of the Presidency of Fort St. George, has this day assumed the office of Governor-General of India and Governor of the Presidency of Fort William in Bengal.

HIS EXCELLENCY COLONEL SIR WILLIAM THOMAS DENISON, K.C.B., has this day taken the Oaths and his Seat in His Excellency's Council under a Salute of 21 Guns from the ramparts of Fort William.
