It is hereby declared, under the provisions of Act VI. of 1857, that the land on the Island of Bombay and described below is required for a public purpose, and is to be taken at the public expense :—

GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

Under the powers vested in him by Section I. of Bombay Act No. XI. of 1863, entitled “An Act for taking a Census of the Bombay Presidency,” the Honorable the Governor in Council hereby directs that an enumeration be made of the Inhabitants of the Town and Island of Bombay, on Tuesday, the 2nd day of February 1864, under the superintendence and control of the Commissioner of Police.

Enumerators and other subordinate Officers will be appointed, who will leave at each house or place of residence within their respective districts blank returns to be duly filled up and signed by the owner, tenant, or principal occupant of the said house or place of residence, and whose duty it will be to give to those unable to write and fill up the returns for themselves every information and assistance to enable them to do so.

As an accurate Census is essential to the correctness of many useful and important calculations and deductions which form the basis of measures for the improvement of the sanitary condition of the people, and therefore for promoting their health and physical well-being, His Excellency the Governor in Council trusts that the educated and intelligent classes of the Native community will aid and support the Police Commissioner in obtaining the returns duly and correctly filled up, and facilitate his task by explaining to their poorer and ignorant brethren the objects with which the census is taken.

With this view, His Excellency in Council invites the leading residents, in the several localities or districts, into which the Town will be divided for the purposes of enumerations, to place themselves in communication with the Municipal Commissioners and the Police Commissioner for the purpose of carrying out the objects of the Act.

ISSUED BY THE INCOME TAX COMMISSIONERS FOR THE TOWN AND ISLAND OF BOMBAY UNDER ACT XXXII. OF 1860, SECTION XXXVII.

INCOME TAX.

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st JULY 1864.

Notice is hereby given that every person within the Town and Island of Bombay who, by the Act XXXII. of 1860, for imposing Duties on Profits arising from Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices, is liable to the said Duties, and to return his or her Profits or Income, is hereby required to fill in a Return of his or her Profits and Income in the prescribed Form, and to transmit such Return duly signed with the Declaration prescribed by the Act, to the Assessors of the Town and Island of Bombay aforesaid, at their respective Offices, within fifteen days from the date of the delivery of the Special Notice, under the penalties contained in the said Act.

Persons requiring Forms of Returns can procure them at the Office of the Assessors. Forms of such Returns will also be left at the usual place of Residence or Business of every person known or considered to be liable to the duties imposed by the said Act. But any person liable to the Duties who may not receive such Forms must apply for the same at the Office of any of the Assessors.

The following Extract from the Proceedings of the Government of India, in the Financial Department, dated 24th November 1863, No. 5771, is published in continuation of the Notification by the Government of India, No. 5634, dated 16th idem (republished in the *Bombay Government Gazette* of 3rd December 1863, at page 1383):—

Read again Financial Notification, No. 5634, dated 16th November 1863, published in the *Calcutta Gazette*, of 18th November 1863, limiting in the case of Uncovenanted Servants the grant of pensions at maximum rates to those whose service has been really such as to merit the approval of Government.

RESOLUTION.—With reference to the orders of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India, published in the abovementioned Notification, the Governor General in Council requests that the several Local Governments will, in awarding pensions under the Rules, confine the grant of pensions at the maximum rates to those persons whose service has been really such as to merit the approval of the Government, and that a distinction may be clearly made in the Quarterly Statements between the cases in which the maximum rate has been granted, and those in which any lower rate may have been awarded.

2. His Excellency in Council further requests that the Departments of the Government of India, as well as the several Local Administrations, will make their recommendations for the grant of pensions, with due reference to the principle which has been enjoined by the Secretary of State.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE RIGHT HONORABLE THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA IN COUNCIL.

MY LORD,—With the view of obviating delay in the despatch of Invalids and Time-expired Men from India who may have claims to compensation for clothing, it has been proposed by the Bombay Government that such compensation be not paid until the arrival of the men in this country.

2. To carry out this arrangement a Return (in duplicate) must be prepared by each Regiment of the claims of men about to be sent home for discharge from the Corps; and after verification by the Superintendent of Army Clothing such Return must be sent to the Deputy Adjutant General, in order that one copy may be forwarded to this Office and the other be delivered to the Officer about to proceed in charge of the Detachment, to be made over by him on his arrival to the proper Officer* by whom the disbursement is to be made.

* (The Paymaster at Netley, or elsewhere.)

3. The Secretary at War sees no objection to the proposed arrangement, and has stated that instructions will be accordingly given to the Paymaster at Netley, and to the Paymasters of Depot Battalions, to make the payments in question.

4. I therefore request, should you see no reason to differ from the views of the Bombay Government, that you will cause the necessary instructions to be issued for giving effect to the arrangement at the respective Presidencies.

On the 18th September 1863, a Boat's YARD of Dewdarwood, about 30 feet long, was washed ashore at Bunder Thull, Talooka Alibaugh, in the Tannah Zillah. N.B.—This table is an extract from a more extensive yearly Return that is prepared for statistical purposes, and chiefly for the detection of any removable sources of disease, with a view to improving the healthiness of the Island. As the principal object cannot be fully attained unless the true causes of death be recorded, persons at out-stations are requested, in each case of death occurring in their circle, to obtain, in writing, from the Medical Attendant, the name of the fatal disease, that it may be delivered to the Policeman at the funeral place. Medical Practitioners, particularly, are requested to aid the registration. Blank forms of Death Reports, to keep by them in readiness, are given gratuitously on application at the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police.

It is thought that some withhold their assistance through the notion that reports of the single casualties coming now and then under their observation could but little affect the Returns; but it ought rather to be borne in mind, that the accuracy of the Returns depends on the correct reporting of all single cases, for of such only the aggregate is made up.
